Sindhi Bazar Ayurveda hospital now at global map

Udaipur : Avurveda hospital at Sindhi Bazar in Udaipur city, is attracting patients not only from around the division but world wide. This hospital has the distinction of being the State's first and only model Ayurveda Aushadhalaya where more than 21 Lakh patients have been treated in last 7 years. Recently, a delegation of medical experts from France and Germany visited the hospital to get details on the PanchKarma therapy. They interacted with the patients, observed the working, took feedbacks and decided to apply our working model at their respective places" said Vaidya Shobalal Audichya, the hospital incharge generally no public ayurveda hospital, has a panchkarma unit, but persuasion and determination of the staff here made it all possible. Things that are not easy to be sanctioned from government is raised through charity by willing institutions and capable individuals. In this way, from an uninteresting and less visited ordinary hospital built in 1967, the center has transformed itself with looks and competency of any private medical facility. Thousands of patients have been benefitted of the complex Panchakarma treatment which includes Shirodhara, Nasyakarma, Shirobasti, Katibasti, Janubasti, Snehan, Swedan, Steam bath, Vaman, Vivechan, Basti etc. "The center being situated in the heart of the city, often foreigners walk in with petty complaints and walk out rejuvenated after experiencing the wonders of Ayurveda" Audichya said. Unlike most government health centers that runs late from the scheduled timing, this one begins much earlier at 5.15 am precisely for more than 100 people coming for Yoga practice everyday. A Medicine bank for needy-In addition to the free medicines provided by the state govt. the hospital has set up its own medicine bank with the help of donors.

Kachhabali created history

Udaipur : Kachhabali folks, especially the women have created history. With a thumping majority i.e 67.11 percentage of voters having casted their votes to shut down the only licensed liquor shop in the area, this nondescript gram panchayat located in Bhim tehsil of Rajsamand is set to become the first alcohol-free-zone of state, though it may take some days for the official announcement to be made. On Tuesday, in the voting held by the excise department, of the total 2886 voters in 9 wards, 2039 people exercised their franchise rights. 1937 persons casted votes in favour of close down of the shops while only 33 affirmed in negative. Thirty three votes were rejected. "This is an indication of rising awareness and women power. The Nasha Mukti campaign have been going on for quite some time in the area but perhaps they didn't knew how to proceed with the norms. We informed and facilitated them and they followed it" said Archana Singh, Rajsamand collector. A report from the tehsildar now would be submitted to the collector who would forward it to the excise department asking to seal the liquor shop for ever. The women in the village had been making sustained efforts to close down the liquor shops past many years but were unsuccessful due to money and political patronage. However, after a massive campaign, people turned up at the polling booths on Tuesday throughout the day to cast their votes to shun alchohol. Polling was held at three booths and people kept dropping from 8 am to 5 pm to cast votes. Elderly ladies who were unable to walk up themselves were seen in carried by their family members inside the booths.

Implement 85% Pictorial warning on Both side on on tobacco products

Jaipur: The Public Interest Litigation (Writ Petition) no. 8680/15, along with the contempt petition 800/15 titled as Rahul Joshi versus Union of India and Rahul Joshi versus Bhanu Pratap Sharma were listed today before Chief Justice Sunil Mittal.

Counsel for the Union of India submitted that they have brought rules of 2014 into force from today, 85% pictorial health is implemented on both sides of tobacco packets.

Counsel for the Petitioner Mr. G. S Bapna and S.R Joshi contended that vide order dated 3rd July, 2015 the rules of 2014 were already brought into force. Now the question of enforcement of these rules is to be examine by the court. Inspite of clear directions of the court in the order dated 3rd July and also subsequent order dated 28th July passed in con-

tempt petition. The Centre and State Government do not intentionally enforcing the rules, which is wilful disobedience of the directions of the court.

On hearing both sides, the Court expressed displeasure for not enforcing the rules. The Court verbally directed to enforce the rules immediately and put the matter for hearing after 6 weeks.
