HDFC Financial Results for the Year Ended March 31, 2016

The Board of Directors of HDFC Bank Limited approved the Bank's (Indian GAAP) results for the quarter ended March 31, 2016 and the audited results for the full year ended March 31, 2016 at their meeting held in Mumbai on Friday, April 22, 2016.

The Bank's total income for the quarter ended March 31, 2016 was 18,862.6 crores, up from 15,570.1 crores for the quarter ended March 31, 2015. Net revenues (net interest income plus other income) increased by 20.3% to 10,319.2 crores for the quarter ended March 31, 2016 as against 8,576.9 crores for the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

Other income (non-interest revenue) at 2,865.9 crores was 27.8% of the net revenues for the quarter ended March 31, 2016 and grew by 11.8% over 2,563.8 crores in the corresponding quarter ended March 31, 2015.



missions of 2,172.4 crores (1,834.8 crores in the corresponding quarter of the previous year), foreign exchange & derivatives revenue of 282.8 crores (328.7 crores for the corresponding quarter of the previous year), gain on revaluation/sale of investments of 115.5 crores (196.1 crores in the corresponding quarter of the previous year) and miscellaneous income including recoveries of 295.2 crores (204.3 crores for the corresponding quarter of the previous year).

ended March 31, 2016 was 12,296.2 crores, up 20.4%, over the year ended March 31, 2015. The consolidated net profit of the Bank increased by 19.8% to 12,801.3 crores for the year ended March 31, 2016.

Total balance sheet size as of March 31, 2016 was 708,846 crores as against 590,503 crores as of March 31, 2015. Total deposits as of March 31, 2016 were 546,424 crores, an increase of 21.2% over March 31, 2015. CASA deposits saw healthy growth with current account deposits growing by 20.2% over the previous year to reach 88,425 crores and savings account deposits growing by 18.4% over the previous year to reach 147,886 crores.

PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry & PHFI sign a 5 year MOU

New Delhi : With an aim to augment the Government of India's 'Skill India' flagship project and to create a robust and vibrant eco-system for quality skill development in the healthcare sector, PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry (PHDCCI) and Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI) signed a 5 year memorandum of understanding for launching a joint program to organize capacity building initiatives in skilling healthcare professionals especially in the areas of chronic diseases and prevention of Non Communicable Diseases (NCDs).

The MoU signed by Dr. Mahesh Gupta, President, PHD Chamber and Professor K. Srinath Reddy, President, PHFI, will undertake a country-wide initiatives to conduct training workshops for industry, government (Central/ State) and MNCs on important public health issues, with a special focus on Non Communicable Diseases.

In his address Dr. Mahesh Gupta, President, PHD Chamber lauded the

timings of the MoU and said "The Indian healthcare sector today is growing at a brisk pace and this MoU comes at a time when the Skill India Movement is looking at bringing about convergence.

Pointing out the major constraints faced by Healthcare professionals, Dr Mahesh Gupta emphasized that this sector in India is suffering with over-worked professionals as there is a severe shortage of staff. The skill development workshops can be used across India to scale up and get this workforce to be competent in the healthcare space.

According to the most recent figures reported in the World Health Statistics 2011, the density of doctors in India is 6 for a population of 10,000, while that of nurses and midwives is 13 per 10,000 population. India has a doctor-to-population ratio of 0.5:1000 in comparison to 0.3 in Thailand, 0.4 in Sri Lanka, 1.6 in China, 5.4 in the UK, and 5.5 in the United States of America.

Rahat Kazmi the director of acclaimed film IDENTITY CARD has recently completed MANTOSTAAN; a dark satire based on four burning and the most controversial short stories (Khol DO, Thanda Ghosht, Assignment and Aakhrī Salute) of Legendary Urdu writer Saadat Hassan Manto. Of his works around the partition, says Manto - "Hindustan had become free. Pakistan had become independent soon after its inception but man was still slave in both these countries -- slave of prejudice ... slave of religious fanaticism ... slave of barbarity and inhumanity."

Sonal Sehgal is super excited to play the character of Kulwant Kaur from Thanda Ghost, she admits that MANTOSTAAN has been an entirely different experience and is a very powerful film indeed. Say Sonal, "My character is very dark and disturbing, somebody who doesn't leave you long after you leave the set. It's a character you haven't seen on screen before".

Saadat Hassan Manto was heartbroken and



shaken by the trauma the partition brought in its wake, and some of his best pieces revolve around what he saw during those horrific months. The stories of 'Mantostan' are about the single-minded dedication with which men killed men, the remorse felt by some and the tears shed by murderers.

Background : In the riots, which preceded the partition in the Punjab Province, between 200,000 and 2,000,000 people were killed in the retributive genocide between the religions, estimates 14 million Hindus, Sikhs and Muslims were displaced during the partition; it was the largest mass migration in human history.
