All Set for two day BRICS conference in Udaipur

Udaipur: Union Minister of State for Home Affairs of India has said that the country is committed towards utilizing technology and latest equipment to deal with the disaster management. "We are working to make a special identity of the country in achieving excellence in disaster management. Government is working to implement various efforts in this direction, the minister who was speaking to media on the eve of two-day BRICS conference slated to take place today and tomorrow.

Talking to media men in the Udaipur Vilas hotel of Udaipur, Mr. Minister said that ever since Narendra Modi assumed the power, efforts to improve the disaster management are being done. "Special attention is being given to flood management across the country. Special efforts have been made to empower various departments related to disaster management and we are getting good results as well," said the minister.

He assured that India is fully capable of dealing with disasters and sincere efforts are being made to empower this capacity at global level. He

shared that the earthquake technique of china and fire extinguishing techniques of Russia will come in exchange which will be of immense helping dealing with casualties.

The meeting of BRICS (Brazil, Russia, India, China & South Africa) Ministers for Disaster Management will be held on August 22-23, 2016. The two-day meeting will focus on two distinct but inter-related themes: a) Flood Risk Management; and b) Forecasting of Extreme Weather Events in the context of Changing Climate. It is a follow up of the 1st meeting of the BRICS Ministers for Disaster Management convened by the Russian Federation in St. Petersburg on April 19-20, 2016.

Recognizing the common challenge posed by natural and man-made disasters, BRICS countries have identified Disaster Management as an important area of collaboration. The Ufa Declaration signed by BRICS Nations at the 7th BRICS Summit on July 9, 2015 identified the need to promote cooperation in preventing and developing responses to emergency sit-



uations. The Declaration also acknowledged the fruitful discussions on natural disasters within the context of BRICS cooperation in Science, Technology and Innovation. It also reiterated BRICS commitment to mitigate the negative impact of climate change. All the five BRICS countries have signed the Paris Agreement on Climate Change. They are also parties to the adoption of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) in March, 2015 and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in September 2015. A number of SDGs have specific targets related to Disaster Risk

Management (DRM).

The country delegations to the Udaipur Meeting will be led by the Ministers of Disaster Management from the respective BRICS countries and other senior officials/ technical experts from Disaster Management Ministries/ Departments. The objectives of this meeting are:

- To share experiences on flood risk management particularly with regards to flood risk assessment, flood forecasting, early warning and emergency response;
- To share experiences on current systems in each country for forecasting extreme weather events -- heat and cold



waves, and episodes of extreme rainfall- particularly in the context of a changing climate; and

iii. To identify opportunities for collaboration between institutions of respective BRICS countries in the area of flood risk management and extreme weather related events.

During the Ministerial Meeting in Udaipur three technical sessions with key thrust areas will be held as mentioned below:

- Challenges for Disaster Risk Management
- Mainstreaming DRR in key development sectors
- Capacity building at local level

Udaipur: Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology has been observing Parthenium Awareness Week from 16th to 22nd August, 2016 in the campus. In connection with the 11th Parthenium Awareness Week of ICAR-Directorate of Weed Research, Jabalpur, the campaign was taken up by Directorate of Research of the university and Department of Agronomy of Rajasthan College of Agriculture, Udaipur. This seven days programme was inaugurated by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of MPUAT, Prof. U.S. Sharma on 16th August 2016 at the college campus. On this occasion Prof. Sharma addressed to the students, faculty and staff members of the university. He said that this problematic weed invaded in our country during 1955 from the USA under US PL 480 programme and in the period of about sixty years it covered more than 35 million hectare area of our country. Its short life cycle and ability to multiply throughout the year even in adverse climatic conditions further aggravate the condition of its spread. Its adverse and hazardous effects

on human, animal and crops are well observed in the society, so consistent efforts for control and eradication is required throughout the year. On this occasion Dr. G.S. Ameta, Director Research, MPUAT said that we can control this effectively by adopting the integrated Cultural, Chemical and Biological Methods. Further, Prof. Ameta said that our University has conducted this programme since last 05 years and now after establishment of new centre of AICRP on Weed Management in 2015 we have effectively taken up the programme to eradicate the parthenium from the campus and I hope that our consistent team efforts will develop the campus parthenium free in the years to come. On this occasion Dr. Anila Doshi, Dean, RCA, Udaipur, Dr. S.K. Udaipur: German car-maker Volkswagen launched compact sedan, the Ameo, in Udaipur recently. The Ameo, made-for-India compact sedan, was launched in India on June 5. The car is Manufactured at the company's Pune plant, the Ameo has been priced starting at Rs. 53 lakh (ex-showroom Udaipur). The compact sedan, the most affordable offering of Volkswagen. "We are very happy to bring this Made in India and Made for India sedan to our customers now, as we initiate the deliveries," said Michael Mayer, Director, Volkswagen Cars India. Unveiled in February at the Auto Expo 2016, the Ameo, which is currently on sale in India, comes powered by a 1.2-litre three-cylinder MPI petrol engine that develops 74bhp of power and 110Nm of peak torque. Udaipur dealer authorized Rahul Shah of Rajesh Motors Sales said that the engine comes mated to 5-speed man-

ual gear box. Volkswagen is also testing the diesel-powered model of the compact sedan on the Indian roads that is likely to be rolled out during the festive season this year. In the diesel engine version, the Ameo will get upgraded 1.5-litre TDI diesel engine, which is expected to be re-tuned to churn out 108bhp of power. Offered in Trendline, Comfortline and Highline variants, the Ameo offers safety features such as dual front airbags and ABS as standard. It competes against the likes of Maruti Suzuki Swift DZire, Honda Amaze, Ford Figo Aspire, Tata Zest and Hyundai Xcent in the country.

The compact sedan hosts a string of best-in-class features, such as cruise control, infotainment system with CD/MP3/USB/AUX-in/SD card and Bluetooth connectivity, reverse-parking camera, reverse-parking sensors and touch-screen MirrorLink system.
