## Scramjet Engine Could Make Launches 10 Times Cheaper ISRO Tests Scramjet Rocket Engine



**Sriharikota:** The Indian space agency ISRO on Sunday morning tested a new rocket engine which could bring down launch costs by up to 10-fold. With the successful launch, India joined the league of only two nations which have the technology.

Called a Super Sonic Combustion RAM Jet or SCRAMJET, the engine was tested from Sriharikota, off the

coast of Andhra Pradesh, using a sounding rocket at 6 am. The rocket, also called Advanced Technology Vehicle (ATV), had lift-off weight of 3,000 kg and the new air-breathing engine was tested for a mere 5 seconds.

Usually rockets carry both fuel and oxidiser for the combustion to happen. This new engine takes in oxygen from the atmosphere as its fuel. This reduces the overall weight of the rocket and increases efficiency.

The test was to happen much earlier but ISRO postponed the launch as many ships and aircraft were patrolling the Bay of Bengal looking for missing Indian Air Force AN 32 plane on July 22, 2016.

Only America and Australia have tested such air-breath-

ing engines and India joined a select club with the successful launch.

Eventually, the aim is to place this new rocket alongside the Re-usable Launch Vehicle (RLV) which India successfully tested a few months ago to make rocket launches more affordable. Currently it costs around \$20,000 to send one kg of matter into space.

## A Joint Task Force On Disaster Risk Management - BRICS

**Udaipur:** A joint task force on Disaster Risk Management would be set up by BRICS Countries as the permanent BRICS forum for regular dialogue, exchange, mutual support and collaboration among BRICS Countries.

This decision was taken in 2nd meeting of BRICS Ministers of Disaster Management. The Ministers for Disaster Management of the 5 BRICS Nations met in Udaipur on 23rd August.

The joint task force shall consist of one representative from each BRICS Country and will be chaired by rotation by the representative of the country holding Chairmanship of BRICS during that year.

The Joint Task Force shall meet on the sidelines of the meeting of the BRICS Ministers for disaster management and may also hold additional meetings as necessary, including through video conferencing.

The BRICS Nations have realised the urgent need to enhance awareness among all BRICS sector institutions and stakeholders to be able to address the interlocking issues of Disaster Risk reduction, climate change adaptation and sustainable development to effectively reduce adverse impacts of natural and human-induced disasters.

BRICS countries are ready to take necessary measures to implement Joint Action Plan agreed in the 1st meeting of the BRICS Ministers for disaster management at St. Petersburg in April 2016.

This declaration was signed by all BRICS Countries. Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Shri Kiren Rijju and Home and Rural development and relief Minister of Rajasthan Shri Gulab Chand Katariya were present in the ceremony. Monographs were presented to all Delegates of



BRICS Countries.

Revenue and Disaster management Secretary Rohit Kumar and DM of Udaipur Rohit Gupta were awarded for their work.

Presentations on Challenges for Disaster Risk Management : Heads of BRICS delegates gave presentations on Disaster Risk in changing climate. Discussions were mostly based on emerging disaster risks as a result

of climate change in BRICS Countries and how are the DRM practices evolving in view of emerging disaster risks in changing climate.

First presentation was given by Brazilian delegate followed by Russia, India, China and South Africa.

All BRICS Countries are facing similar problems like floods, drought, typhoons, cyclones, forest fires etc.

Global warming has left

negative impact on human lives in different ways. Forest fires have been increased in Russia. South China had faced ice snow storm in 2008. Temperature has increased in many parts of these Countries.

All Countries agreed to increase the early warning systems. They are ready to share experiences from each other and would learn to cope-up with Natural disasters in a unique way.

Like South Africa all Nations emphasized to educate youth and school children to fight with Natural disasters. Clean community programmes will be held at local levels to aware people about common diseases and less usage of plastic bags. High monitoring systems will be used in future to warn people who live near coastal areas or hills. Climate change is a big challenge for all of us. Each country showed keen interests to reduce vulnerabilities and increase the scientific capabilities.

BRICS Ministers praised the natural beauty of Udaipur and appreciated the hospitality of our city. This technical session was attended by Revenue and Disaster management Secretary Rohit Kumar, Divisional Commissioner Bhawani Singh Detha, DM Rohit Gupta, SP RP Goyal, CEO, Zila parishad Avichal Chaturvedi.

## South Africa may adopt Raj model of drought mitigation

**Udaipur:** Inspired by the significant water conservation works across the state under the 'Mukhayamantri Jal Swavlamban Abhiyan', South Africa may adopt Rajasthan model to combat drought, a phenomena that has hit the country's economy for many years.

Des Van Rooyen, minister of co-operative government and traditional affairs, South Africa said that soon a team of experts from his country would visit Rajasthan to acquire knowledge for the implementation of the model.

The minister who was here to participate in the BRICS meeting on disaster management was impressed to learn

how the desert state is conserving water by raising low cost water harvesting structures across villages and towns under the campaign.

The South African delegates observed a working model of water harvesting structure in rural setup and took details of the campaign which was exhibited through posters and brochures at the meeting venue in four different languages of the BRICS nations.

"We in South Africa are concerned over the declining dam levels across the country and many dams have water below 10 percent. In many provinces people have to buy water cans to cook food and the food production too have been severely affected" Royen said.

The minister was surprised to learn that Rajasthan too faced critical water situation for years due to the depleted ground water level.

Of the 295 blocks, 227 fall in dark zone, however, a record 93535 works of water conservation through harvesting structures have been completed in six months which is a major achievement.

"We have been wasting the rain water for 30 years in South Africa but after we are determined to learn lessons after the model we saw here which will equally prove effective in meeting the acute water problem there" Royen said
