Flights from Jaipur to Jodhpur and Udaipur begin next week

Jaipur: Supreme Aviation has signed an agreement with the Civil Aviation department, as per MOU Supreme Airlines will fly flights within cities of Rajasthan connecting strategic tourist spots with each other.

Aerial connectivity between Jaipur Udaipur and Jodhpur, which has been much sought after for the last so many years, has finally turned into a reality. The three cities will be connected from next week onwards while other cities will be connected in due course.

As per official information, the flights between Jaipur Jodhpur and Udaipur will fly 6 days a week with the average ticket cost being Rs. 3,500. The plane will be a nine seater Cessna Caravan-C 208B. MOU was signed in the presence of Pawan Kumar Goyal. Supreme Air Lines will operate flights six days each week with nine-seater Cessna Caravan-C 208B aircraft. The flight will depart from Jaipur at 10.15 am to reach Jodhpur at 11.30 am. It will depart from Jodhpur at 11.45 am and reach Jaipur at 1 pm.

The aircraft will depart at 4.30 pm from Jaipur to reach Udaipur at 6 pm and return at 6.15 pm from Udaipur to reach Jaipur at 7.45 pm.

Hardik Patel allowed to move in Udaipur

Jaipur: Rajasthan High Court, comprising justice Gopalkrishna Vyas and JR Mulchandani have disposed off the Habeas corpus petition filed by Hardik Patel, who, on the orders of Gujarat High Court is temporarily residing in Udaipur.

In interim relief to Patel, who has been allowed to move about freely within the city limits of Udaipur, provided he gives a 24hr notice to the Police prior to leaving the residence where he is staying

IAF MiG-21 fighter aircraft crashes in Barmer, pilots safe

Jodhpur (Devi Singh Badgurzar): A MiG-21 trainer aircraft of the Indian Air Force crashed in Rajasthan's Barmer district on Saturday, but both the pilots were able to eject safely. The MiG 21 T-69 aircraft, which took off from Uttarlia airbase near Barmer, crashed at Magne ki Dhanni village, about five kilometres from district headquarters, around noon.

Earlier on June 13, a MiG27 aircraft crashed in Jodhpur during a routine training sortie. While the pilot managed to eject safely, three people were injured as it crashed in a residential area.

Defence spokesperson Manish Ozha said there was no loss of life as the aircraft crashed in an open field. Both the pilots ejected safely before the crash, he said, adding that a court of inquiry had been ordered to determine the cause of the crash. Senior officials from the air force and district administration, including Barmer collector Sudheer Sharma and superintendent of police Gagandeep Singla surveyed the area after the accident. Villagers said crop on the agricultural field had been destroyed in the crash.

The Soviet-era fighter planes have a poor safety record. Following a series of crashes due to bad safety conditions, the MiG aircraft were dubbed as 'Flying Coffins'. It is currently only used by India, Sri Lanka and Kazak air forces and the government is mulling over to phase out its ageing fighters.

12 foot long "Ajar" captured

Jaipur: A 12 foot long "Ajar" snake was captured from Rati Talai near Badi Village today.

As informed by Padam Singh Rathore of the Wild and Street Animal Rescue team, the 12 ft snake was sighted in a 40 ft deep well at Lehru Lals farm in Raatti Talai near Badi village. It was said to have fallen into the well.

On getting the information, Padam, with his team, consisting of Praveen Singh, Arvind Singh, Prashant and Naveen, reached the site.

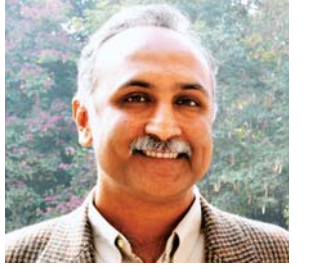
Dr. Vivek Bhandari Takesover As The President of IIHMR University

Raj first state to rope in BEd pupils as interns in schools

Jaipur: Rajasthan has become the first state in the country to rope in BEd students as interns for teaching in government schools. The state has 2.59 lakh teachers and falls short of 60,000 teachers to meet the proper student-teacher ratio. 60 lakh students are enrolled in its 7,229 schools in academic session 2015-16. This move will help the state save Rs 180 crore until they recruit teachers.

State higher education department has cleared the proposal of the education department seeking permission for allowing BEd students compulsory internship profes-

sional practice in government schools for six months. Over 30,000-40,000 BEd students will be available for teaching from October to February .

It has become possible since the duration of BEd course has been increased from a year course to two-year degree course. Till now, the one-year BEd curriculum also had a provision for five months of teaching, which the outgoing students were allowed to do at any private school. In most cases, the interns managed to get experience certificates.

Enumerating the advantages of channelizing these human resources into government schools, education minister Vasudev Devnani, said, "It will not only improve the learning outcomes of our students but will also provide an opportunity to these interns to understand the complexities involved in teaching."

The interns will be placed according to vacancies by the district education officers, including the remotest areas. The rule also has a provision for assessment of interns' performance.

Since the Right to Education Act came into force, the state is required to have a pupil-teacher ratio of 20:1. However, the state has been facing shortage of teachers since years.

The fund crunch along with litigations and dwindling enrolments have been major problems in the delay of hiring teachers.

The enrolments in government schools have seen a sharp fall from 72 lakh in 2011-12 to 60 lakh in 2014-15, which helped the state maintain a decent pupil-teacher ratio. However, in the academic session 2015-16, the enrolments have seen a significant rise which has added to the demand for teachers. (source TOI Jaipur)
