



More than 5 lakh handicapped to get facilities



Udaipur: Union Minister of Social Justice and Empowerment, Shri Thawarchand Gahlot said that the Indian Government has signed an MoU of two of the prime institutions of Germany and Britain, according to which, state-of-the-art prosthetic limbs will be made a large scale in Kanpur's Elmiko. The works in this direction has already begun. He was speaking at the inauguration of free medical surgery camp for 501 handicapped girls and the closing ceremony of social welfare week. He said that every year 50 thousand handicapped children and youth are provided with scholarship and national fellowship along with an opportunity of education in foreign countries for higher education. 70 crore of country's population is linked by the schemes of his ministry. He informed that last year, more than 4 thousand camos were organized to facilitate handicapped people, where more than 5 lacs handicapped were benefitted from material worth 400 crore. He said that in the direction of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the distribution of more than 1000 equipment for handicapped in Navsari has created a World Record. 'Sugamya Bharat' scheme of the ministry, ramp at all the bus stops, railway platform and airport for the convenience of the handicapped are being made. Referring to Narayan SewaSansthan, he said that if every state of the country had such institutions, the issues of the handicapped will be solved by itself. He informed that in Narayan SewaSansthan, not only the handicapped are getting free medical check-up, but they are also being provided training to become self-dependent. Not only this, their rehabilitation is also being managed. The institution has done an ideal job by helping 1200 handicapped and destitutes make their household. He observed the various social works performed by the institution. Prior to this, founder of the institution, Kailash Manav welcomed Gahlot and briefed him about various free services and assured that the institution will collaborate with the schemes of central government successfully. He expressed his gratitude towards institution's cooperation. President of the institution, Prashant Agrawal informed that the institution has, in the last 2 and a half decades, provided free operation to more than eighty thousand handicapped and made the weddings of 1200 couples happen successfully.

First mini Intra State Flight Lands at Dabok



Udaipur: The first flight, of the Intra State connectivity series, landed at Maharana Pratap Airport, Udaipur, in from Jaipur at 6:45Pm yesterday evening. The 9 seater airplane was filled to capacity on the first trip. Fire fighting trucks welcomes the aircraft with a shower of water. The plane, which has come with 8 passengers, left a few minutes later with 7 people, back to Jaipur. As per the schedule, except for Sundays, this flight will be operated on a daily basis. The flight will start in the morning from Jaipur and land at Jodhpur, from where there will be an immediate return flight. Once in Jaipur, the flight will ferry passengers to Udaipur in the evening and then fly back to Jaipur with return passengers. Thus one aircraft will ply on four consecutive flights between the trio of Jaipur-Jodhpur-Udaipur. The inaugural flight from Jaipur on Tuesday, was a part of the CMs announcement the previous year, to improve connectivity between towns having airports, to assist tourism in the state.

Udaipur- Chittorgarh highway to be made six-lane

Udaipur: Drive along the Udaipur-Chittorgarh highway is set to get smoother and faster with extension of the existing highway to six lane. The foundation stone laying for the proposed six-laning will happen on Oct 15, 2016. The foundation stone for the six lane highway will be laid by Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje along with Nitin Gadkari, Minister of Road Transport and Highways of India. The six laning will start from Debari Junction on NH-76 and will culminate at Chittorgarh. The six lane highway will be 93km long and will be constructed at an estimated cost of Rs 1,109 Crores.

CPI (ML) demands stringent action against perpetrators of "Ration " Scam in Sarada

Udaipur: The communist Party of India (ML) took out a rally in Sarada Panchayat Samiti on 5th of October demonstrating against the scam in distribution of ration to the villagers by the ration dealers who did not provide ration to the villagers and misappropriated it through black marketing. The member of state committee of CPI(ML) comrade Shankar Lal Chaudhary alleged that there is a nexus between the local BJP leaders, administration and the ration dealers. Dr. Chandra Deo Ola, district secretary of the party alleged that the villagers in some twenty Panchayats of Sarada Panchayat Samiti have not been distributed ration and claimed that he has a record of some two hundred ration

cards which show no entry since June last. They demanded stringent action against the ration dealers as well as public officers who were responsible to ensure timely distribution of ration. More than a hundred villagers marched through the streets of Sarada bearing red party flags and banners demanding jail for the culprits of the scam. They raised the slogans " Ration ke dalalon ko Jail Bhejo", "Inquilab Zindabad", "Tehsildar Hosh mein Aao", CPI(ML) Zindabad" Mazdoor -Kisaan Ekta Zindabad" etc. The rally reached Tehsildar office where a meeting and demonstration was held. Comrade Saurabh Naruka conducted the meeting. Comrade Shankar Lal



Chaudhary read out the two memoranda while the district secretary of the party Dr. C.D. Ola addressed the meeting. He alleged that the BJP led state and central governments were

insensitive to the problems of the masses and were serving the interest of the capitalists only. Himmat Seth, Chief Editor of Mahaveer Samata Sandesh demanded a complete ban on

Row over inquiry against Prof. Vijay Shrimali reaches the Governor

Udaipur: The row over inquiry against Prof. Vijay Shrimali has reached the Governor of Rajasthan who happens to be the Chancellor of the university also. Prof. Vijay Shrimali was accused of misconduct by some girl students of M.L. Sukhadia University, Udaipur. They even registered an FIR against him with Bhopalpara police station. The University administration also set up an inquiry committee for investigation into the charges made by the girl students against Prof. Vijay Shrimali. He alleged that the case was registered because he was a prospective candidate for the post of Vice Chancellor and an attempt was made to malign his image. The committee constituted by

the University administration included Prof. Sudha Chaudhary, Professor and head , Department of Philosophy. The order No. F. Gen / M L S U/ 2016/ 1916 dated 30.09.2016 had her name as a member of the inquiry committee. Prof. Vijay Shrimali took an objection to her inclusion and made a public statement in press that he had ideological differences with her and that she was very junior so she cannot be a part of the committee. Seeing his close contact with the ruling BJP , the Vice Chancellor issued another no.F. 20/Gen/MLSU/2016/ 1919 in which her name was dropped. It is ironic that the accused will decide who will inquire into

charges against him. Prof. Sudha Chaudhary took it seriously and wrote to the Vice Chancellor expressing her anger on this action. She said that it amounted to her insult and humiliation. She has sent a copy of the letter to the governor and chairperson, Women's Commission. It is also alarming that the BJP after coming to power has made the Vice Chancellor's posts political posts like the post of Chairman, UIT, Chairman , Rajasthan Sahitya Academy and other boards and committees. This is evident from the appointments made so far including Prof. Parmendra dashora and Prof. Uma Shanker Sharma. The names in Press for the post of Vice Chancellor of

M.L.Sukhadia University also include Prof. Vijay Shrimali, Prof. Anand Paliwal and Prof. Seema Malik. All of these people have close ties with BJP and have been a part of one or the other front organizations of the party. What is the use of advert sizing the post if the basis of selection is only political? In the case of Prof. Vijay Shrimali, Prof. Sudha Chaudhary has a strong point since she has been made a scapegoat without any fault of her. The Commissioner who has an additional charge of the Vice Chancellor of M.L. Sukhadia University needs to act independently and judiciously if he has to prove that he is not under any pressure.

Beware: Action to be taken as per Juvenile Justice Act in Rajasthan

Jaipur: The Juvenile Justice Act is applicable on any person who offers or sells tobacco products to any minor. The provisions of this Act are now being strictly implemented in Rajasthan, with offenders facing imprisonment up to seven years and fine up to Rs 1 lakh. The Rajasthan Police, DGP, has issued a circular the Commissioner of Police of Jaipur, Jodhpur and Superintendents of Police of all districts of the state to implement the provisions of the Act. Voice of Tobacco Victims (VoTV) state patron had met the DGP in month of September in this regard. Issuing the directives, DGP Mr.Manoj Bhatt has instructed that one police officer in each police station should be designated as a child welfare officer under section 107(1). The Act had been amended to include these provisions on January 15, 2016. Bhatt has made special mention of section 77 of the amended Act. Under this section, if any person, other than a qualified

medical practitioner, gives tobacco products or intoxicating beverage or any other narcotic or alcoholic products, he or she will be liable for imprisonment up to seven years and fine up to Rs 1 lakh. Bhatt has pointed in the circular that tobacco products have been included in it. Besides those selling tobacco products to minors, those promoting use of tobacco products by minors in any manner will also be liable to face criminal proceedings. Particular attention should be paid against such offenders within 100 yards of any educational institutions. Action should be taken against such offenders and the matter included in the Monthly Crime Review (MCR) reporting of The Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA). He said that Nodal officers appointed in district headquarters & sub divisional headquarters . Dr.Pawan Singhal, Associate Professor at SMS Hospital & State Patron of Voice of Tobacco Victims (VoTV), said the earlier Act & COTPA, was

not being effective in checking tobacco use among minors as offenders selling tobacco products to minors were fined only Rs 200. He said 27.5 crore people in India use tobacco and a major portion of them start tobacco consumption from a young age. According to a survey by Global Adult Health, addiction to tobacco use in India starts at 17 years of age. Global Youth Health survey has revealed that 20% of children in India use tobacco. As many as 5500 children and teenagers consume tobacco every day. On an average, everyday 350 children start tobacco use in the state. 32% people in the state have tobacco addiction. The new amendment and circular will save our future generations from the deadly addiction to tobacco products. It has already been established that every third person who dies of cancer, cardiac arrest or respiratory problems had contracted the illness due to tobacco consumption.
