## Successful Operation Of Rare Disease In Pims Held

**Udaipur:** In the Pacific Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS), Hospital Umarda, physicians have successfully operated the patient having a very rare disease.

Ashish Agrawal, Vice Chairman, PIMS said that three year old Monika daughter of Prakash Meena was born with a very rare disease- congenital pouch colon. This disease is so rare that it has been kept in the Rare Variant category in the International ARM Classification System. In this disease, the development of large intestine also stops does not happen in the patient as well as not forming the path of the normal stool door anus in the patient.

Agrawal said that the parents of the child, who had been troubled for so many days, brought the baby to Pediatric Surgeon Dr Pravin Zanwar operated and made the way for discharge of stool. Now the child is in regular follow up and is completely healthy.

In this case, Dr. Pravin Zanwar says that such children are kept in follow up for long period as this disease is due to gross embryogenesis. Therefore, such children may also need re-care in future.

## Children theatrical workshop at Bagore ki Havali

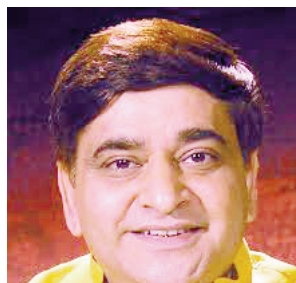

## B.Voc courses@ JRNU



**Udaipur:** After MLSU, Rajasthan Vidyapeeth University has opened admissions for B.Voc courses on Friday under Hospitality and Catering Management. In association with IL and FS (Infrastructure Leasing and Financial Services) Skill Development Corporation and Skill Ink, students will now be able to study and earn simultaneously. For this new course, Institute of Skill Centre has developed infrastructure in in Pratap Nagar Campus of Vidyapeeth University. For practical training, hotel lab with all ultramodern facilities and a workshop lab for catering and engineering is taking shape where media team asked to visit.

It would be a three year course in which students will be able to earn in their 17 month training program. After completing B.Voc course, students will have more opportunities for employment. VC Prof. SS Sarangdevot said that B.Voc is a dual-certification course. The industry simulated workshops of international level will provide mechanical as well as electrical training in the same course. During this period, students will have an opportunity to earn upto 40,000 rupees. B.Voc students will be given certificates from Skills Development and Entrepreneurship Ministry and Tourism and Hospitality Sector Skill. The certificates will be in 4-7 National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) level. NSQF level 7 recognition is equivalent to Degree in any Skill Area. Registrar Prof. Mukta Sharma said that scholarships will be given to economically weak talented students. Vish Bhusan of Skill Ink said that Institute on Roll Placement will also provide assistance to the students.

## Highlights of B.Voc degree courses -

"Voc degree programmes are offered in over 200 colleges across the country.

"This is a 3 year degree course after Higher Secondary or Intermediate/P.U College with multiple entry and exit points.

"Students completing the first year get a Diploma certificate, after second year they get the Advanced Diploma certificate and after completion of three years, the B.Voc. Degree is awarded.

"The course curriculum has 40% general education (theory) and 60% vocational training (practical) components.

"These programs follow semester system and offer credits after completion of the course.

"The students who have enrolled in B.Voc courses appreciate the practical focus and are confident that their chances of getting a suitable job are higher than other graduates.

"These courses are expected to comply with NSQF and are financially aided by the UGC (University Grant Commission).

## Water Conservation Campaign In 500 Villages Of Udaipur

**Udaipur:** "Water Life" awareness program for water conservation in joint participation of National Agriculture and Rural Development Bank (NABARD), Rajasthan Regional Office, Jaipur different districts of the state, Panchayati Raj Institutions, Self-help Organizations and local people has commenced in April. The above program will start from May 16, 2017 in 500 selected backward villages in Udaipur district. The representative of National Agriculture and Rural Development Bank (NABARD) Regional Office, Rajasthan, Vijender Singh informed that Dr. Shailendra Pandya was selected as expert from Udaipur district, who was given two day training in Gujarat based NABARD Regional Office in Gandhinagar. He will organize public awareness programs in collaboration with the local people community and self-help groups of different villages of the district.

In the first phase, the villages will be equipped with different techniques for water conservation and up-gradation of under-ground water in JalSwavalambam campaign.
