RBSE humanities result: Girls outperform boys

AJMER: The Rajasthan Board of Secondary Education (RBSE) announced its senior secondary (Class 12) humanities (arts) stream examination results Saturday. With a pass percentage of 91.35, girls outshone the boys (87.04%). State education minister Vasudev Devnani released the result at RBSE office premises in Ajmer.

According to the board, there were 5,86,312 students registered for the Class 12 humanities board examination in which 3,14,832 are boys and 2,71,480 are girls. Earlier the board had declared the result of Class 12 science and commerce on May 15. There will be no merit list for Class 12 humanities as the board has from this year decided on not releasing a list. The board will declare the names of the three top scoring students in each stream probably in the month of October to help them secure the benefit of scholarships and to honour them at the next convocation. "The pass percentage has registered a gradual increase over the last three years indicating that there has been an improvement in the education at government schools," he said.

"Last year, 88.23% students had cleared the exams. The figure has gone up by 3% and overall pass percentage is 91.16." The private schools have registered an increase of 74 per cent.

Abundant agriculture opportunities in Kota

The inaugural day of Global Rajasthan Agritech Meet (GRAM) 2017 witnessed a session on 'Agricultural Abundance of Kota: Strengths and Prospects'. The seminar threw light on how to create wider value chains based on the products of Kota division. Chaired by CEO Sabzawala and Advisor, FICCI, Mr. Praveesh Sharma the seminar also underlined the need to market the products of the region on a national and international level. During the session, Rajasthan Minister for Agriculture, Mr. Prabhu Lal Saini said that Kota Division has abundant opportunities in the areas of soyabean, coriander, citrus and seed spices. Even though there is immense production in the state for these crops, the fields of production, processing and value addition need more investment and innovation. He also stressed on the need for copious research and study in these areas.

Director, India and Asia Subcontinent, US Soybean Export Council, Mr. Ratan K Sharma highlighted the business potential of soy food processing in India. Mr. Sharma said that soy is the world's leading food crop to feed both people and livestock as due to its features like low cost and high quality. Mr. Chakresh Jain of Bunge India gave a presentation on the potential for growth of mustard rapeseed in Rajasthan. He said that the soil-water combination is well suited for the growth of this crop. However, the farmers are shifting to other crops due to more profitability and productivity. There is need for increase in the yield of mustard which is crucial for India's food security and farmers' well being, he added.

Principal Scientist (Horticulture), Central Citrus Research Institute, Nagpur, Dr. AD Huchche said that citrus is third most important crop in India after banana and mango. He suggested several solutions to problems like weed management, insect pest problem, water conservation, management of citrus cankers, causal factors of citrus decline, among others.

Vice Chancellor, Jodhpur Agricultural University, Prof. Balraj Singh highlighted the processes of production, technology and value addition of seed spices. He suggested measures such as using high yielding, disease resistant varieties, low pressure drip irrigation, use of sheds and tunnels for cultivation, during summers, among others. Principal Scientist, ICRISAT, Dr. Rohan Yuvraj Khopade gave a presentation on 'Technologies for Semi Arid Regions'. He emphasized the overall concerns in Indian agriculture. Furthermore, he highlighted the principal problems in semi arid regions relating to agriculture such as water, soil, heat and wind as well as disease and pest problems. He also suggested possible solutions like maintaining soil health, ecosystem biodiversity and integrated management approach, among others.

Were counting the failures ...



Udaipur: On completion of three years of central government, former Haryana Chief Minister Bhupinder Singh Hooda could not tell a single big scandal of Modi government. PCPNDT's Inter-state Workshop concludes

Udaipur: One-day inter-state workshop on effective measures for improving sex ratio in the participation of border states of Rajasthan and Gujarat was concluded at Ananta Hotel in Udaipur on Friday.

In the workshop, it was agreed to organize mutual cooperation and training and awareness programs for effective implementation of PCPNDT Act between Gujarat and Rajasthan. Chairman and Dr. Naveen Jain, Government Secretary, Department of Medical and Health, highlighted the PCPNDT Act detailing the expansion of the Dry Operation carried out outside of Rajasthan and the State. He said that till now 71 DECOY operations have been done. During the year 2016-17, 33 DECOY operations were conducted. These include the states of Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Gujarat, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh. Similarly, since during the last 15 days, 8 DECOY operations are being carried out and the emphasis is on improving the work with speed. He said that the PBI constituted in Rajasthan is authorized not only in Rajasthan but also in other states of the country to perform Dry Operation. He said that in order to make it more effective, Gujarat and Rajasthan will have to take concrete action by mobilizing such brokers and networks which are active in severe crimes such as gender investigation and Bhrun murder. Mr Jain informed that the State Government's informative plan is proving to be effective in reaching out to the pregnant women and taking appropriate action against them. He said that the scheme is intended to provide an amount of 2.50 lakh under which pregnant women are at 1 million, informants gave the award to 50 thousand rupees to the government a million and ally. The state government has provided around Rs. 32 lakhs under this scheme. In the workshop, Mr. Jain highlighted the



Rajshree Yojana and said that the state government is making effective efforts to promote and strengthen girl child birth. Under the Rajshree Yojana, there is a provision of providing 50 thousand rupees in different phases after birth of a girl child.

At the same time, Shri Jain also informed about the various welfare schemes implemented in the field of girl child development in the state and central government. Mr. Jain said that there is a need for public awareness to take effective implementation of the schemes and their benefits to every segment.

He said that for this, the public can be made aware of extensive publicity and necessary information in regular inspection, workshop, meetings and other community programs. He said that PCPNDT act has maintained its own in the state which is ready for cooperation in every phase. In the workshop, the National Health Mission, Gujarat Director, Gaurav Dadia also addressed the workshop and said mutual co-ordination in both the states as important. On this occasion, Udaipur District Collector, Vishnu charan Mallik, has also taken into views.

Two brokers arrested in Udaipur under the PCPNDT Act

Udaipur: While acting under the PCPNDT Act, the State PCPNDT Cell has arrested two brokers who were involved in Bhrun Linga investigation during DECOY proceedings in Udaipur city on Monday. Team have also recovered the numbered rupees used in the proceedings. Mr. Naveen Jain said that informants were receiving information from city of Udaipur for indulging in illegal activities of gender identified of two persons named Vinod Sen and Manish Shrimali. After confirmation of the information, comprehensive action plan was created and contact with Vinod Sen was made through a bogus customer. With the help of a bogus customer PCPNDT team member, Vinod Sen decided to give information about gender of the child in the womb for twenty five thousand rupees. In the case of a girl being pregnant, she said that ten thousand rupees would be given separately, out of which, fifteen thousand rupees were received by Advocate Vinod Sen and on Monday, they were asked to come to the Gulab Bagh gate for sonography. He told that on Monday, DECOY woman and her companion were made bogus customers as planned and sent to the Gulab Bagh Gate Gate where Vinod San and Manish Shrimali told the female members of the team to come behind their scooter.
