New Delhi: Tagging Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's move of quitting the 'Mahagathbandhan' and joining the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) as anti-democratic, the Congress on Saturday said it was deceitful on his part to do so. Defending Bihar former deputy chief minister Tejashwi Yadav, Congress leader Saniay Nirupam said there are only charges against the former which have not proven yet, and therefore one cannot call him corrupt. "If one is termed as corrupt, if there are any such charges against him, then Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Raman Singh, Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shiypal Singh Chouhan and even Prime Minister have charges of corruption against them. Have they resigned?" Nirupam told

On Friday, Nitish Kumar won the floor test with 131 votes in favour, against 108. The Chief Minister faced vote of confidence in the Bihar Legislative Assembly to prove his majority to form the state government. Nitish-led JD (U)-NDA government had a support of 132 MLAs. According to the communique issued from the Raj Bhawan, Nitish had claimed the support of 131 members, including the BJP, two independents and legislators of BJP allies Hindustani Awam Morcha (HAM)-Secular and Rashtriya Lok Samata party (RLSP).

# A Life like no other



Looking at the glorious chronicles of the life of our beloved Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam, it comes as no surprise that he was bestowed the luck of passing away while doing what he loved to do - teaching. "If people will remember me as a good teacher, that will be the biggest honour for me," he had said in an interview to a national daily on Teacher's Day the year before his death.

Born as Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam, Dr. Kalam has many extraordinary achievements to his credit

After India found its Missile Man in his scientific genius, the poet, writer, and Bharat Ratna awardee went on to head the nation as the 11th President of India from 2005-2007. However, his journey as a teacher went on unabated, as

he continued to touch the lives and ignite the minds of everyone he came to meet. He was lovingly called 'The People's President'. After his presidency ended, Dr. Kalam became a visiting professor at different branches of the Indian Institute of Management and was also an honorary fellow at Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru. Dr. Gandhi said that the small holes of heart can be treated with the help of medicines or devices. But most of the holes of heart in young children require cardiac surgery.

# **Health Alarm: Head Neck Cancer**

New Delhi: India has the dubious distinction of having largest amount of chewing tobacco consumption in the world. It is a cheap and easily available addiction and its growing consumption in the last two decades has contributed to alarming rise in oral cancer.

Every year nearly 10 lakh people in India are diagnosed with oral cancer and half of them die within a year of diagnosis. The main cause of the deaths and disabilities due to oral cancer is known in medical term as Head Neck Squamous Cell Carcinoma (HNSCC). As per GATS -2 (2017) survey, almost 96% of the youth of India agree on the fact that chewable tobacco is the major reason for serious diseases (cancer). The World Head & Neck Cancer Day (WHNCD) is observed on July 27 this year. Government of India has taken landmark decisions such as Gutka ban, flavoured, packaged chewing tobacco. In fact, as per the Supreme Court's order on 23rd September 2016 smokeless tobacco products were banned in India. Implementation in India remains a big challenge. Dr. Harit Chaturvedi, cancer surgeon, Chairman Max Oncology and Voice of Tobacco Victims (VoTV) patron Said that according to GATS - 2, 19.9 crore people (age 15+) use chewing tobacco products. Due to the 85% pictorial pack warnings on chewing tobacco products, 46.7% people have thought about quitting these.

He further added that a large number of people across India fall prey to oral cancer owing to a combination of factors including late detection of the decease, inadequate treatment and unsuitable rehabilitation. People mainly in the age group of 60-70 years used to be prone to oral and throat cancer till as late as 30 years age. Now people as young as 30 to 40 years are being diagnosed for oral cancer."Blaming growing influence of western life style in the young generation, Dr Chaturvedi says even youth in the 20-25 years age group have become vulnerable to oral cancer due to smoking, which many of them mistakenly consider a style statement. The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) in a report in 2008 observed that in 90% of the head and neck cancer cases that were diagnosed consumption of alcohol, Gutka, tobacco and betel nut emerged as the root cause of the cancer which is preventable. The ICMR report also revealed that tobacco consumption was diagnosed as reason of cancer among 50 % male and 25% female victims. Nearly 90% of these victims (male and female) suffered due to oral cancer. The report pointed out that smokeless tobacco products such as chewing tobacco, Khaini, Gutka contain 3000 chemical compounds and 29 of them could be potential cause for oral cancer. India has the largest population of oral cancer patients in the world, making it the oral cancer capital of the world. According to Dr. Harit, head and neck cancer cases are proving an additional burden on not only the national healthcare services but also on the affected communities, families and individuals.

Most of the head and neck cancer cases are treatable and preventable, if detected in early stage. But millions succumb to the disease due to late detection, inadequate treatment and rehabilitation, he adds. Tata Memorial Hospital, Professor and Cancer Surgeon Dr. Pankaj Chaturvedi, who is heading campaign against head and neck cancer globally, stresses the need for multipronged and coordinated efforts by governments, voluntary organizations, health workers, educational institutes and industries to check cases of Neck Squamous Cell Carcinoma (HNSCC). It was with the aim to draw the world's attention to the HNSCC cases that the World Head and Neck Cancer Day (WHNCD) is observed on July 27. Its observance was proposed by International Federation of Head and Neck Ontological Societies (IFHNOS).
