Modi govt sabotaging Winter session of Parliament: Sonia

New Delhi: Congress president Sonia Gandhi on Monday launched an all-out attack on the government, accusing it of sabotaging the Winter session of Parliament on flimsy grounds.

Addressing the meeting of the Congress Working Committee (CWC), she also accused the government of being "ill prepared" to implement the Goods and Services Tax (GST), which she described as a "flawed" tax regime.

The Congress president also hit out at the government over demonetisation, saying the move left millions of people "suffering".

"The Modi government in its arrogance has cast a dark shadow on India's parliamentary democracy by sabotaging the Winter session of Parliament on flimsy grounds," she told the party's highest decision-making body.

The Winter session of Parliament traditionally convenes from the third week of November and lasts till the third week of December. According to sources, the government is considering a truncated Winter session of around 10 days starting from the second week of December.

The Congress president also charged the government with "forcibly" trying to change history of modern India by "erasing contributions" made by former prime ministers Jawaharlal Nehru and Indira Gandhi. **PTI**

Udaipur: The 42nd Agricultural University Vice Chancellor's seminar was organized in the city palace of Udaipur. Supported by Indian Agriculture University Association, the seminar was hosted by Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology and sponsored by Maharana Mewar Charitable Foundation. The two-day seminar saw noted dignitaries and experts on agriculture technology. The main topic of the seminar was globalization of agricultural education and roles and responsibilities of agriculture universities. In the inaugural session, chief guest Shriji Arvind Singh Mewar started his speech with shloka of Saraswati stuti. He said that Maharana Pratap is more known as a warrior but many works of social upliftment

and agricultural development took place in his time. The executive secretary of Indian Agriculture University Association threw light on the organization and its motives. He also spoke about the theme of the seminar. President of the association, the vice chancellor of Assam Agricultural University Professor KM Bajarbarua in his inaugural speech said that the agriculture sector is facing a lot of challenges. He advised that we should maintain our identity at the global level as foreign investors are ready to find their feet here. Addressing the seminar, the deputy director general of Agriculture Research Center, New Delhi Mr. NS Rathore spoke about the role of center and government in the development of agriculture education and

responsibilities of universities. While he agreed that there is a need to ameliorate the agriculture universities for the development but he also accepted that the lack of fund and faculty is the problem. Presiding over the inaugural session, Professor Uma Shankar Sharma, the vice chancellor of Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology said that Indian economy is based on agriculture. And since agriculture itself is facing challenges, universities are also equally affected. He advised for the development of agriculture as per global standards but at the same time he asked to take care of pristine knowledge and culture. Talking about the seminar, organizing secretary and research director Dr. Abhay



Kumar Mehta said that the two-day seminar has been graced by 45 vice chancellors of various agriculture centers, universities, and deemed universities.

The seminar comprised of five sessions which covered development of traditional farming techniques and socio-economic change through old techniques, significance of

livestock, present standard of education and worth of universities for these challenges, and the transformation of agricultural education at the global level.
