

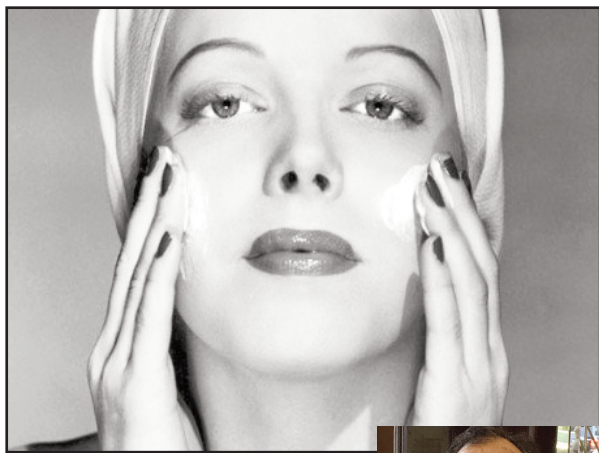

ZINC, the Anti-Ageing Miracle Mineral



Present in the top layers of the skin, Zinc assists antioxidants by preventing new free radicals from damaging the skin, and essentially prevents wrinkle formation at the molecular level. It strengthens the cell membranes and brings new youthful cells to the surface. The regulation of cell turnover depends on Zinc.

Due to Zinc's anti-ageing properties, it is incorporated into supplements and used as an additive in anti-ageing cosmetic products. Responsible for specific aspects of cellular metabolism functions, protein synthesis, cell division and cellular repair, Zinc's benefits and effectiveness for ageing skin cannot be overstated.

While we cannot control the process of ageing but we can certainly slow down the process by ensuring the intake of those nutrients that our body needs for reducing damage and supporting tissue repair.

Anti-ageing skin supplements can be divided into five categories - Vitamins, Minerals, Omega-3s, Phytonutrients and Probiotics.

According to studies, one of the major minerals that acts as an antioxidant and is essential for collagen formation is Zinc. It promotes efficient healing of skin infections, is important for tissue strength & repair and helps normalize sebum production.

As one ages, the turnover time of the skin cells becomes a lot slower. Zinc is in fact present in the skin and gives the primary protection in case of damage or inflammation in the skin. It also brings new youthful cells to the surface. The regulation of cell turnover depends on Zinc.

Zinc also strengthens the cell membranes and may help protect from unwanted cellular invasions from toxins or harmful cells. Zinc stays on the top layers of the skin and helps prevent UVB sun damage. It assists antioxidants by preventing new free radicals from damaging the skin. This means Zinc is essentially preventing wrinkle formation at the molecular level.

Zinc deficiency is a known trigger of ageing and chronic illnesses. It can develop with age and lead to a weakened immune system, increased inflammation and can also lead to heart disease, cancer and diabetes.

According to studies by National Center for Biotechnology Information, remarkable parallels have been drawn in the immunological changes during ageing and Zinc deficiency. These include a reduction in the activity of the thymus and thymic hormones, a shift of the T helper cell balance toward T helper type 2 cells, decreased response to vaccination, and impaired functions of innate immune cells. Most of these studies do not classify the majority of elderly as Zinc deficient, but even marginal Zinc deprivation can affect immune function. Consequently, oral Zinc supplementation demonstrates the potential to improve immunity and efficiently downregulates chronic inflammatory responses in the elderly.

A study by Tufts University found that improving Zinc levels in elderly adults did appear to boost T-cell numbers and immune response activity.

Zinc also discourages bacterial, viral, and fungal growth in the body. The importance of these functions of Zinc, in relation to encouraging healthier skin, is that Zinc can help prevent pimples, acne and infections. These are often nasty reminders that what we are doing isn't working for our skin, usually a combination of the wrong skin care products, poor nutrition, hormonal changes or various types of systemic inflammation.

Consuming foods rich in Zinc is beneficial for proper nutrition and prevention of ageing skin. Animal food sources are the primary source of Zinc. Whole-grain breads, cereals and beans contain trace levels of Zinc, but the presence of phytates in these foods bind Zinc and inhibit its absorption, which is why vegetarians may have a harder time getting enough Zinc in their daily nutrition regimes. Meats such as oysters, Angus beef, crab legs, lobster and roast chicken provide an abundant source of Zinc. Other sources of Zinc include legumes, nuts, oats, spinach, avocado, mushrooms, peas, garlic, pomegranate, dark chocolate etc.

Ideally, the food we consume provides us with all the nutrients. However, many of our diets lack the much needed fruits & vegetables due to poor produce or improper intake. Since we are unable to consume these key sources of vitamins, minerals and antioxidants on a regular basis, intake of nutrient supplements can help fill these gaps in the diet.

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A Two-Day Conference On Corneal Transplant Surgery Held

Udaipur: Advance Lamellar Keratoplasty has brought a new revolution in the world of eye surgery. This surgery has given the entire medical world the ability to offer a new thought that the lost eyesight can be regained without complete cornea transplantation. This revolutionary medical intervention was performed in a two-day National Conference on Corneal Transplant Surgery in joint consultation with Alakh Nayan Eye Hospital Pratap Nagar and Udaipur Ophthalmology Society in Udaipur on 17th March Saturday and 18th March Sunday.

Dr. L. S. Jhala, Medical Director, Alakh Nayan Eye Institute said during the conference that there was a training session with live surgeries at Alakh Nayan Eye Hospital & Institute's Pratap Nagar Centre held on Saturday, in which the five famous surgeons of the

country performed live surgeries of eight-year-old child in a Live Surgery Workshop. The child got his vision again and a ray of happiness filled his heart.

In the Live Surgery session, eminent faculty performed various corneal surgeries in front of the doctors of various hospitals of Udaipur, including renowned eye surgeon from across the country. He said that until now the complete cornea was transplanted to restore the lost eyesight, but now the only required layer of the cornea is implanted, instead of completely transferring the cornea. There are many benefits of this. One that the Cornea is saved and other that it can be used for more than two people. This medical practice is being practiced in the US and UK. It is being successfully used in selected metropolitan cities and after Jaipur in Rajasthan this facility is available only at

Alakh Nayan Eye Institute. Dr. Nitish Khatoria, Cornea Specialist of Alakh Nayan Eye Hospital, told that one million people need a corneal operation. We have to increase the awareness of eye donation. There were question-answer sessions on this occasion. Dr. K. K., Siddharthan (Coimbatore) Dr. Vikas Mittal (Ambala), Dr. Jatin Asher of Mumbai, Dr. Ashish Nagpal of Ahmedabad, Dr. Nitesh Khatoria shared their views among participants. New advanced methods and technologies were discussed. With the increase in use of computers and mobiles, there is an increase in a disease called Dry Eyes or Computer Vision Syndrome. Therefore, regular mobile and computer users must take a break at regular intervals while working and should give rest to eyes. With prolonged usage it damages the Cornea. This idea was



expressed on Sunday by expert doctors on concluding day of two-day National Conference on Corneal Transplant Surgery in joint consultation with Alakh Nayan Eye Hospital and Udaipur

Ophthalmology Society on Sunday. Experts from across the country discussed changes in ophthalmic medicine, latest methods of treatment, new equipment and medical practices.

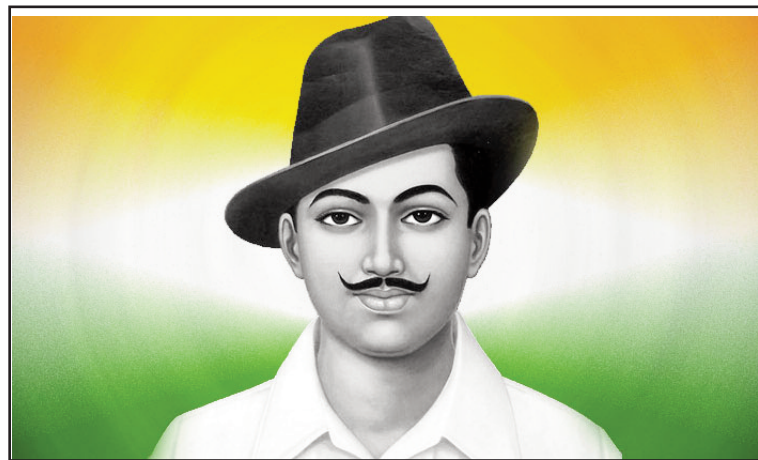

Felling Lenin, Eulogizing Bhagat Singh: Weapons of Mass Confusion

Come 23rd March and we see all hues of political organizations singing eulogies in the name of Bhagat Singh. Even those who are have taken pride in felling the statue of Lenin in Tripura will be seen washing the statues of Bhagat Singh with cow milk. This is how they try to sanitize the ideas of Bhagat Singh and make them adaptable to their cow-worshipping crowds. Every year they come in small groups and smear the statues with all kind of patriotic paste and raise slogans in the name of mother India "Bharat Mata Ki Jai". This would be all right had they shown a little respect to the ideas of Bhagat Singh too. Felling the statue of Vladimir Ilich Lenin and eulogizing Bhagat Singh cannot go on simultaneously. In fact, this is a weapon of mass confusion used by the Hindutva brigade in order to misguide the idealistic youth of the country in the name of hyped nationalism.

There are several instances in the accounts of the life of Sardar Bhagat Singh written by his biographers which prove his interest in the Soviet Revolution and the leadership of Lenin. The formation of Hindustan Socialist Republican Association was itself a clear evidence that freedom for Bhagat Singh was a complete transformation of the Indian nation into a country free from class exploitation where the tiller of the land and the producer of goods in the industry get the full reward of their labour. On June 6, 1929, the statement of Bhagat Singh and Dutta also referred to the two Bills. Their explanation of the term "Revolution" would be pertinent in this respect. Revolution is not necessarily connected with a bloody struggle. It has no place for personal



grievances. Nor is it a game of bombs and pistols.

By the term Revolution we mean dismissing the prevalent social system which is established on evident impropriety. Though the producers and workers are the most important component of society they are...deprived of the products of their labour and even of their fundamental rights. The farmer who produces corn for everybody has to starve with his family; the weaver who makes garments for all does not get enough clothing for himself. So until and unless this exploitation is prevented, the entire civilisation would crumble down. The cry of the day is absolute transformation and those who realise it bear the responsibility to reorganise society on the basis of socialism...By Revolution we understand the establishment of such a social system.... dictatorship of the proletariat and Communist internationalism which would save humanity from Capitalism and Imperial Wars.

If the British Government pay no heed to our warning and continue with the old measures of repression, a mighty struggle would start which would sweep away all obstacles and ultimately establish the dictatorship of the proletariat for the fulfilment of the

Revolutionary ideology.... Every-one has a birth right to independence.

Ajoy Ghosh, a colleague of Bhagat Singh who later became the General Secretary of the Communist Party of India, wrote that Bhagat Singh spent most of his time in prison studying socialist literature and during this time came very close to the communist ideology. Gopal Tagore, another biographer of Bhagat Singh, relates that a few days before his death when asked what was his last wish, he replied that he was studying the life of Lenin and he wanted to finish it before his death.

(Bhagat Singh—The Man and His Ideas, p. 30) When he was in prison he wrote two hundred pages of notes regarding capitalism, socialism, the origin of state, communism, religion, sociology, and also many facts regarding India, the French Revolution, Marxism, governmental structures, family, Communist International etc. (Shahid Bhagat Singh—A Biography, p. 30) The essay Why I am an Atheist shows that Bhagat Singh was very clear in his stand on religion. It is also seen in one of his letters written to his friend Joydeb that he requested him to send books like Civil War in France by Marx, Left Wing Communism and Collapse of

the Second International by Lenin. (Ibid., pp. 29-30) It is further known from Ajoy Ghosh that Bhagat Singh and his colleagues sent a telegram to the Soviet Union on November 7, 1930, greeting the Great Russian Revolution. In January 1930, to commemorate "Lenin Day", they entered the Court Room wearing red scarfs and demanded that their greetings should be intimated to the President of the Third International. (Ibid., pp. 69-70)

The present day rulers and their front organizations have tried to appropriate our national icons and used them selectively to aid their propaganda of Hindutva and achieve their goal of making India a Hindu Rajya. This is what they want to do with Bhagat Singh too. In the wake of their victory not only Lenin's statue was demolished, they demolished the statues of Periyar, Ambedkar and Gandhi too. So, it not just communism which is their target, it is every one who threatens their agenda of imposing the Brahminic varnashram system which is the basis of the formation of RSS which has been led by Maharashtrian Brahmins in the major part of its existence. The appropriation of Bhagat Singh and other icons is a weapon of mass confusion to further the agenda which is driven by narrow nationalism. The people of India should be cautious of this as we remember our martyrs in this month of March.

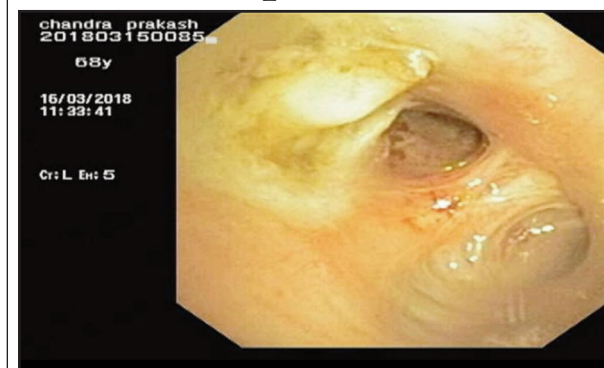
Sojatia CA-FINAL-Mahakumbh in swing
