

Inaugurated the new tourist destination of Phloons ki ghati

Udaipur: On August 3, Home Minister Gulabchand Kataria inaugurated the "" in the Chirawa Ghata a Phloons ki ghati near Udaipur

This new tourist spot has been developed at a distance of 3400 meters, passing through the Chirwa Ghat on 80 hectares of land in the forest area of Amberi, 9 km away from Udaipur city.

Speaking on the occasion, the Home Minister, Shri Kataria said that this new site development is going to provide tourists with a new natural environment and new employment opportunities for regional citizens will also be available.

He said that the identity of natural place Udaipur is their protection and culture and beauty is in our priorities. He told the Forest Department that he would create a work plan to implement innovations for the development of such sites, financial requirements would be completed in every possible way.

He said that entry fee for the purpose of connecting the general public with such natural places would be practical and also for the general category one day free admission would be decided.



Mr. Kataria told the forest department to make the center a center of interest for activities like horse safaris, carving figures on rocks, nature study centers, floriculture of various species and their protection. Shiva statue to be found at the site. Shri Kataria said that the responsibility of establishing a 25 feet Shiva statue at Phloons ki ghati will be taken by the Marble Association. He expressed his gratitude to President Vijay Godha for the submission of this holy work.

Chief conservator of forest Indrapal Singh Matharu detailed the development of the forest site and explained that where the "deserted valley of flower" projector could be transformed into a deserted road, a better tourist destination, the big forestry area near the city The best place for tourists to visit is available. At the beginning of the program, Deputy Forest Guard (North) OP Sharma said that this forest section has been developed under Kamppa Yojana at a cost of 1.60 crores. Plants planted here have grown 100 percent.

Thrill of the state's first zip line

The new attraction in the valley of flowers will be 'Zip Line', which has been set up 375 meters. This has been established from Cafeteria to Gorella View Point, which will be the thrill of passing through a deep ditch.

Other attractions

Nature has been renovated with Hill Cycle Ride, Cafeteria, Nature View Point at the Four Points, Inter Practice Center in the Middle, and the Old Door as Heritage Conservation.

As a part of PPP model (Public Private Partnership) in cardiac care, subsidised angioplasties are being conducted at Sector 10, Civil Hospital in Gurgaon, Haryana. The subsidised angioplasty procedures are for general public and BPL individuals.

Understanding the anxiety, agony of a cardiac illness victim this initiative will be executed under the aegis of renowned cardiologist Dr. Prathap Kumar, who is the Chairman, Managing Director and Chief Interventional Cardiologist at Meditrina Group of Hospitals, Kollam, Kerala and his team Dr. Ajay Dua, Dr. Sujith. Meditrina is currently serving people with seven centers, in India and abroad, and still expanding. A heterogeneous mix of talent, Dr. Prathap Kumar is also a teacher, a successful healthcare entrepreneur, and a passionate doctor who has devoted his life to the welfare of cardiac patients from underprivileged sections of the society and has made this his life pursuit. He uses his skills and expertise to relieve the pain of the heart attack victims with the success rate of 99.95%. Dr. Prathap Kumar strived to render angioplasty at the least rate, sometimes as low as Rs.30000/- through special programmes.

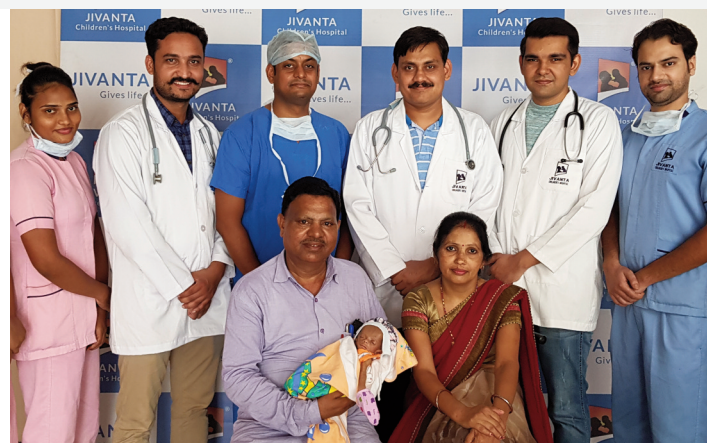
Commenting on this initiative which is being run in collaboration with the Haryana Govt., Dr. Prathap said "I along with my team have performed more than 180 angioplasties and 600 Cath lab procedures during the last four months in Faridabad. More than 30% of the patients have benefited from this initiative belong to the underprivileged sections of the society and have received the treatment at subsidised rates.

Rest of the patients, who had to undergo angioplasty treatment with a single stent, got the treatment for below Rs. 50,000/-, which is even less than the charges at Government medical colleges. I am honored to be a part of such an initiative and looking forward to the Gurgaon chapter." This initiative has been taken by The Government of Haryana especially the Health Ministry which has been instrumental in subsidizing this treatment for the underprivileged BPL and SC/ST Patient. JUST 520 GRAMS BECOMES TINIEST IN SOUTH ASIA TO SURVIVE MAJOR ABDOMINAL SURGERY

Udaipur: A tale of courage & fight by extreme low birth weight baby (weighing only 520 grams), 12 days old who underwent a critical abdominal surgery at Jivanta Children's

Hospital, Udaipur. Her name is Jhanvi and she is the smallest baby ever operated and survived not just in India but in the whole South Asia.



INSIGHT :

The baby girl, Jhanvi, was born to proud parents Umesh and Madanlalya, hailing from Nijampur Magrouni, Dist-Shivpuri, Madhya Pradesh. It's the greatest gift from God to see their four months old survive the odds and come home from the Neonatal ICU at Jivanta Children's Hospital, Udaipur. Conceived after 29 years of marriage by IVF technique. Her pregnancy was carried upto 26 weeks when her blood pressure was uncontrollable and the ultrasonography revealed severe growth restriction and reversal of blood flow to fetus. Because the blood flow to the baby was decreasing, she was taken up for emergency caesarean section.

Jhanvi was born premature just at 26 weeks of pregnancy (Normal pregnancy duration 40 weeks) on Feb 13, 2018. At birth, she was just about the size of your palm. This baby was very precious and the only hope for the family. The baby was handled and looked after in the Jivanta Children's Hospital- Neonatal ICU with precise care under Chief Neonatologist Dr. Sunil Janged, Dr. Nikhilesh Nain, Dr. Kapil Shirmali and trained nursing team. She was struggling to breathe, so was immediately put on ventilator and given medicines to expand her tiny, immature lungs.

WHY SURGERY:

Dr. Sunil Janged told "There was progressive distention of her abdomen along with greenish aspirates and we were not able to start feeds. We tried all sorts of medical therapy, on day 12 of life baby deteriorated so badly, developed tense abdominal distention, skin of abdomen was turning bluish, heart beats and blood pressure started dropping. Investigations showed grossly dilated intestines with infection. Her body system was shutting down. We knew that baby won't give us much time, so operation was the only resort left to us. Major surgery on such a tiny baby with such poor condition was very much difficult and challenging scenario for our team. But this baby was the only hope for the family. Pediatric surgeon Dr. Praveen Jhanwar, anaesthetic Dr. Suresh and OT staff carried out emergency abdominal surgery under general anaesthesia which lasted for 1 ½ hours. Dr. Praveen said -" She was smaller than my hand when we operated on her. The intestines were

grossly distended and started turning black. Majority of intestine was filled with thick meconium [stool].

The meconium was so thick and organised [Meconium ileus] causing intestinal obstruction. We could not remove it out by milking the intestines.

So we had to cut the intestine and remove it. Her organs were so delicate and fragile that as soon as we started operating, even with our small instruments, everything started to bleed and fall apart. Intestinal wall was not able to take the sutures. Dead tissue was removed, abdomen was thoroughly washed and wall closed with lot of difficulty. "Dr. Sunil Janged further said that she would have been dead without the surgery. Its very tedious job to operate such small baby weighing only 520 grams as babies born this small have extremely poor function of all body organs like heart, lungs, brain,

and kidney. It's like walking on a two edge sword.

POST OPERATIVE HEALTH BULLETIN OF BABY:

Dr. Sunil Janged informed that post-operative course was like rollercoaster. During this period, baby had a tube passed through his nose to drain off the contents of intestines. Baby kept nil by mouth for 10 days. We had to start the baby on total parenteral nutrition, which basically means giving all the essential nutrients such as amino acids, lipids, carbohydrates, minerals, multivitamins and trace elements directly into blood circulation. There have been lot of hurdles, infections, blood transfusions along the way. Regular screening of heart & brain were performed to rule out any bleeding in brain. Gradually started with few drops of milk through tube and slowly feeds increased. This small baby required respiratory support for a period of about 54 days. She was able to digest milk after 1 month and started drinking from spoon only after about 3 ½ months of birth.

In all, she was in the NICU for almost 117 days and today her weight was close to 2110 grams. By far the progress and clinical course in the NICU was very satisfactory. Her brain is structurally normal and eyes are also developing normal. Expressing her joy, Jhanvi's mother, Umesh exclaimed, "We had completely lost hope until we met the doctors at Jivanta Hospital. But we had full faith on the team as previously Jivanta Hospital had saved baby weighing just 400 grams. After going through so many odds, she finally is coming home. I am extremely thankful to the team of experts at Jivanta Hospital who took immense care of her.

Expert comments-

Senior Professor & Head Neonatology, Pune Dr. Pradeep Suryawanshi has examined published literature and spoken to pediatric surgical colleagues and says he believes she is the smallest baby to survive major abdominal surgery in India and the whole of South Asia. In the whole world only 4-5 babies weighing less than 500 gms and who underwent major abdominal surgery have been survived till date. He said even with all care it entails a very high mortality ranging from 60-80%. As this baby was weighing only 520 grams, chances of survival were less than 10% in this case.
