

National Security is Corporate Security : Brinda Karat

Udaipur: "Today's Union Government is abusing National Investigating Agency to harass people who take up people's rights issues and demand justice for them. In the name of national security the rights of indigenous people are thwarted and the corporate houses are benefited by the government usurping the rights of Adivasis. The actions of NIA have nothing to do with national security, they are taken to safeguard the corporate interests." This was stated by Brinda Karat, Former Member of Parliament and member of the Polit Bureau of Communist Party of India (Marxist). Comrade Brinda Karat came to Udaipur on Thursday on the occasion of United Nations World Indigenous People's Day to participate in a rally organized by Akhil Baharat Kisan Sabha, Adivasi Adhikar Evam Ekta Manch, Centre of Indian Trade Unions along with other mass organizations. In an interview before the rally she said that 9th August is "Quit India Movement" Day which is being observed today as "BJP Government Quit" by the mass organizations organizing the rally and "Jail Bharo" Movement. The demands of the movement include ensur-



ing the right of Adivasis over their land, proper implementation of Forest Rights Act and safeguarding the democratic rights of the people. She said that the state government of Rajasthan is blatantly violating the Forests Rights Act and is using other coercive laws and regulations to usurp the rights of the Adivasis of Rajasthan. She said that The Chief Minister of Rajasthan is taking out "Gaurav Yatra" amidst widespread poverty and suffering of the masses made still worse by state's anti tribal, anti-peasant policies. The involvement of BJP office bearers in mob lynching and the apathy of police is shocking, she said. She alleged that the Union Government is subordinated to corporate power and is bent upon destroying the constitutional values. She emphatically stressed the need of a radical movement against BJP government. She said that all political forces should align together to defeat BJP in coming elections.

various other aspects of this art. They also learnt three popular group mimes (my old creations) namely 'Pani Pani' for youth and 'Dust Bin' as well as 'Plantation Week V/S Plantation Week' and presented with tremendous enthusiasm at the Studio theatre (Prayog Shala) and impressed audiences.

These hilarious, action packed, entertaining and thematic mimes delivered messages to society. Conservation of water is the question of hour. Children also understood the value of cleanliness and raised voice for clean city. While providing water to thirsty plant from their water bottles, they showed their deep concern towards environment protection.

The local organizers expressed their interest to sustain such workshops in future which can be called a good start for creating awareness for Mime. The interest of parents and children themselves ensures bright future of Mime in Ahemdabad.

On the International Indigenous People's Day Brinda Karat courts arrest with hundreds of tribals in Udaipur



Udaipur: On 9th August, 2018 Hundreds of Adivasis marched from Mohta Park braving the incessant rains and reached the office of the divisional commissioner to raise their demands of land rights, Forest Rights, proper health care services and education facilities in the tribal regions. They were observing the indigenous people's day following the call of Akhil Bhartiya Kisan Sabha, Adivasi Adhikar Manch, Adivasi - Kisan Sangharsh Samiti, Adivasi Jan Adhikar Ekta Manch, Centre of Indian Trade Unions (CITU) and other fraternal organizations. The rally was led by Brinda Karat, former Member of Parliament and member of the Polit Bureau of Communist Party of India (Marxist), Rajesh Singhvi, president CITU, Comrade Prabhu Lal Bhagora, District President of Akhil Bhartiya Kisan Sabha, Comrade Shanker Lal Pargi, Secretary, Hakar Chand Kharadi, Adivasi Kisan Sangharsh Samiti and Dr. Sanjay Madhav. The rally was preceded by a public meeting at Mohta Park which was addressed by all the above and a few more party leaders. Addressing the meeting Comrade Brinda Karat said that the union government as well as the state government of Rajasthan is anti-tribal, anti-Dalit and anti farmer. They are usurping the land and other resources of the tribals and the poor farmers. In Udaipur itself Adivasi's huts were recently demolished and people arrested despite the assurance of the divisional commissioner himself. In other places Adivasis are being displaced in order to provide the land to some influential people for plantation. She said that the Chief Minister of Rajasthan is taking out "Gaurav Yatra" while the peasants and tribal people

are being harassed and displaced. She alleged that it is an election gimmick. Even the declaration of a holiday on International Indigenous People's Day in some districts is an election gimmick and a step to ensure crowd in CM's meetings, she said. Rajesh Singhvi said that a memorandum addressed to the Prime Minister bearing signatures of five thousand tribals was submitted to the commissioner. The demands included implementation of Swaminathan Committee's report, raising MSP of all the crops, Condoning of all types of loans of the tribal people, giving land ownership documents (Patta) to all the people settled in forest lands and other places. The rally began from Mohta Park and culminated at Divisional Commissioner's office where hundreds of tribals and peasants courted arrest in the leadership of Brinda Karat and Rajesh Singhvi.

14th Inter School Desh bhakti Competition begun
