New Delhi: Union Minister for Drinking Water and Sanitation Uma Bharati has said that people on the bank of Ganga need to take proactive charge of maintaining and raising sanitation standards so that the cleanliness of the river can be ensured. She was speaking at Ganga Gram Swachhata Sammelan at Kannauj, in Uttar Pradesh today. About eight thousands swachhagrahis, Ganga volunteers, youth organization members, students and people from all walks of life, majority of them women, attended the sammelan.

Ganga Gram is a concept to transform banks on the village of River Ganga into ideal villages with emphasis on ODF, Solid and Liquid Waste Management, Water Conservation, Ground Water Recharge, modern crematorium, tree plantation, organic and medicinal plant agriculture being the main components.

The Minister appreciated the efforts made by the district team, Panchayat representatives towards making Kannauj district Open Defecation Free (ODF). She mentioned that India has shown to the world how commitment of the government and spirit of the people could propel national sanitation coverage from a lowly 39 percent to over 96 percent. She urged people to participate in SLWM activities, not to litter around and pollute water sources, take care of their waste management, and promote organic farming.

She highlighted the importance of public participation in the success of SBM program across the country. She congratulated the exemplary efforts made by districts and state administration in achieving almost total Sanitation coverage in Uttar Pradesh.

People's representatives, government officials from Centre and State were also present. Later Uma Bharati had a boat ride in Ganga waters along with local communities and planted trees on the bank. She appealed to people to keep Ganga and Ganga bank villages clean with the same emotion with which they take care of their daughters and mothers.

Gulab Chand Kataria from Udaipur and Kiran Maheshwari from Rajsamand in BJP List

Udaipur: Responsibility of Elections for the Rajasthan Legislative Assembly elections have been entrusted once again under the command of incumbent Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje Scindia. 5 names from Udaipur district have been repeated among the 7 released for the division, whereas those from Rajsamand are a repeat from the previous elections. The candidate from Vallabh Nagar is yet to be announced.

from 12 November being the day when the nominations for the assembly elections is starting, BJP Central Election Committee under the Presidentship of Amit Shah released their list of candidates for the Rajasthan elections to be held next month, late evening on 11 November. Gulabchand Kataria and Kiran Maheshwari have been nominated to contest from the Udaipur and Rajsamand seats respectively.

Interestingly, with the current atmosphere of polarisation prevalent in the country, the ruling party has NOT FIELDed any Muslim candidate. However, there are 25 new names in the list of 131 released by the BJP, after their meeting held yesterday evening at New



Delhi, which was attended by the PM Narendra Modi, FM Arun Jaitley, MEA Sushma Swaraj and all other members of the CEC-BJP. 12 of these new nominees are women. 27% of the nominees in this first list issued by the BJP are from the reserved categories, i.e. SC-ST. It is apparent that most of the names in the list are those recommended by Vasundhara Raje Scindia and the influence of the RSS is also visible.

In spite of the BJP leadership always speaking against the apparent dynastic phenomenon in the Congress, it was noted that 11 names in the first list issued by BJP are apparently under dynastic influence. Kin of current leaders of the BJP have been given tickets to take benefit of the current hierarchy.
Kailash Meghwal son of MLA Sunder Lal Meghwal and Hemant son of MLA Nand Lal Meena are some of the examples.
The release of the first list of

candidates by the BJP at 11 pm on 11 November will surely make the Congress and other competing parties to go revisiting their nominations, as the BJP has stuck by their existing team, in spite of the prevalent antigovernment atmosphere prevalent in the state. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has decided to go largely with established leaders in its first list of 131 candidates for the Rajasthan polls. The party has nominated 85 sitting MLAs and dropped 25. The 21 other tickets have gone to leaders who have contested elections before.

Supporters greet BJP MLA Narpat Singh Rajvi, who was the party ticket again for the assembly elections, in Jaipur on Monday. BJP held 120 of the 131 seats. It has not changed candidates on winning seats.

A senior state BJP leader said tickets were given on the basis of win ability and the party decided to go with known candidates in some tight contests where it had few options.

"On several seats especially in the Bikaner and Shekhawati belts there were no strong options and so the party went with current candidates," said a BJP leader from

Hanumangarh. A second party leader said on condition of anonymity that during a meeting in Delhi to decide candidates, chief minister Vasundhara Raje told the central leadership that a large scale change of candidates would give the message that the government had failed to perform at a time when the BJP is fighting the election on a development plank.

It was also felt that on many high-risk seats there were no strong alternative candidates and changing a candidate might not ensure a win, so the party decided to go ahead with incumbents, said a third BJP leader familiar with the developments. "The high command seems to have played safe and gone with Raje. They didn't want any trouble ahead of the elections. Their focus is on the 2019 general elections," said the leader.

The BJP has suffered losses in a string of recent bypolls in the state and is fighting to retain power. The first list saw the axe fall on six cabinet and three ministers of state, including PWD minister Yunus Khan, health minister Kalicharan Saraf and industry minister Rajpal Singh Shekhawat. Political analyst Narayan

Bareth said it seemed Raje prevailed over the central leadership. "There was a perception that she would be sidelined. But the list has bust that view." "However the BJP will have to bear the brunt of anti-incumbency against Raje and the state government," he said. "Raje's future depends on the Rajasthan result. The credit or discredit now lies with her. And if the BJP loses, then she will be in a difficult position," said Bareth.

The list that was declared late on Sunday has 12 women, 32 youth, 17 SC and 19 ST candidates.

There are 17 Rajput and 26 Jat candidates who have got tickets as the party tries to win over the two major communities.

State BJP in-charge Avinash Rai Khanna refuted speculation that the list had Raje's stamp on it, saying it was the party's list. "Workers have been given representation. The tickets have been given keeping in mind the of the party and the winability of the candidate," he said.

"We have changed 25 candidates. The second list is yet to be declared. There will be more changes," said BJP spokesperson Mukesh Pareek.

INSPIRE 2018; awards to the winners of the #InnovateToINSPIRE challenge

New Delhi: "Energy efficiency saves the environment and makes businesses more competitive. While India needs to grow but we need to grow responsibly and the Government has taken several measures in this regard," said Shri R K Singh, Union Minister of State (IC) for Power and New & Renewable Energy. The Minister was speaking at the inaugural of the International Symposium to Promote Innovation & Research in Energy Efficiency (INSPIRE 2018) here today. This is the second edition of INSPIRE and is being organised by Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL) and World Bank. The three-day symposium will focus on enhancing grid management, e-Mobility,

financial instruments and technologies for energy efficiency in India. The Minister further said, "Innovations in the field of energy efficiency are critical to meet our GHG (green house gases) emission targets and the Government has taken several initiatives in this regard". He also gave away awards to four pathbreaking innovations in clean energy and energy efficiency as part of #InnovateToINSPIRE, a first-of-its-kind energy innovation challenge.

The #InnovateToINSPIRE challenge was organized by EESL and World resources Institute (WRI) between 21 August, 2018 and 12 October, 2018 in the run-up to INSPIRE 2018. The challenge invited

participants to submit sustainable and scalable solutions to seven specific challenges spanning grid management, e-Mobility, energy efficient technologies and financial instruments. From 94 entries, four winners were selected by an eminent jury comprised of Indian and international experts in the field of energy. The winning entries received an award of Rs. 5 lakhs, each, along with mentoring and guidance from EESL to help them bring their solutions to market.

To support investments in new, innovative and scalable business models, EESL and Asian Development Bank (ADB) signed an agreement for a Global Environment Facility (GEF) grant of USD 13 million

to establish an Energy Efficiency Revolving Fund (EERF). EERF aims to expand and sustain investments in the energy efficiency market in India, build market diversification, and scale up existing technologies.

Speaking on the occasion, Shri Ajay Bhalla, Secretary, Power said that India's energy efficiency efforts were being lauded world over. He also said that innovation challenge was a very good idea to promote energy efficiency. Shri Rajeev Sharma, Chairman, EESL said, "Innovation is the most important enabler for resolving environmental problems while reducing costs." During INSPIRE 2018, EESL and GAIL, a wholly owned

subsidiary of GAIL (India) Limited signed a MoU to develop natural gas based cogeneration and trigeneration projects in Commercial & Industrial Sectors in India. This MoU is set to benefit industries such as Hotels, Hospitals, Airports, Commercial Malls, Commercial/Government Buildings, Integrated Residential Complexes, Educational Institutions, Data Center, among others, with the advantages of Combined Heat & Power technology. INSPIRE 2018 has been organised in collaboration with the Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE), The Energy & Resources Institute (TERI), Asian Development Bank (ADB), the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP),

and the Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI). The event is bringing together policy-makers, influencers, innovators, thought leaders, researchers, leading energy-efficient companies, government agencies, business leaders and other stakeholders to deliberate on key energy policies, market transformation strategies, and sustainable business models that will help leverage the full potential of energy efficiency and bring its multiple co-benefits to the fore. The event was attended by senior officials from the Ministry of Power, EESL, Dr. Junaid K. Ahmad, Country Director, The World Bank (WB); Mr. Kenichi Yokoyama, Country Director, Asian Development Bank (ADB).

As soon as the MLA candidate was declared, Kataria used to use unrealistic words like 'I will put acid in the root of Congress and win 28 seats in the division ...' to the workers, for whom the public will not forgive them. Congress to field both generals in Raj poll war

New Delhi: In a strategic move to signal preparedness the Congress decided to field both its generals — former Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot and state chief Sachin Pilot — in the Rajasthan poll war on December 7. Appearing together in the capital to welcome into Congress fold Harish Chandra Meena, the sitting BJP Lok Sabha member from Dausa, both Gehlot and Pilot said they will be contesting the upcoming Rajasthan assembly elections

"I will fight elections and so will Mr. Sachin Pilot," Gehlot, Congress General Secretary organisation, announced enthusiastically. Pilot, seated close to Gehlot, first sufficed to smile at his senior's remarks but later decided to corroborate him.

"On the directions of Congress President Rahul Gandhi and on the request of Shri Ashok Gehlot I will be contesting the upcoming assembly elections," said the 41 year old Rajasthan Congress President. Known to be daggers drawn in state politics, Gehlot and Pilot wore a semblance of cordiality today denying any kind of rift. But asked which seat Pilot would contest, Gehlot said seats would be declared later but shortly.

"For today it should be enough of news for you that both of us will be contesting," said Gehlot, known for his political shrewdness. Notwithstanding happy vibes between the two politicians, Congress insiders today said the move to field both was sure to intensify the race for chief minister ship of the state should Congress win on December 11, as is widely anticipated.



It's learnt that the decision to field both Gehlot and Pilot took a while with Pilot throwing his hat in the ring in the very end should he miss out on the race for state CM-ship in case the Congress wins Rajasthan. Gehlot when asked about the CM face of the party today said the Congress had conventionally never named a CM candidate before elections in Rajasthan. "We like to respect that history," he said keeping his own and other options open. Earlier once he had said in response to a question on Congress' CM face, "Do you ever know in advance kaun banega crorepati?" As far as Pilot goes, he would ensure a safe seat for himself lest he ends up like his senior CP Joshi, another Rajasthan Congress stalwart, who had lost the assembly election by one vote in 2008. Joshi was then Rajasthan Congress Chief and Ashok Gehlot went on to become state CM. Sachin Pilot would not want that history to repeat itself.
