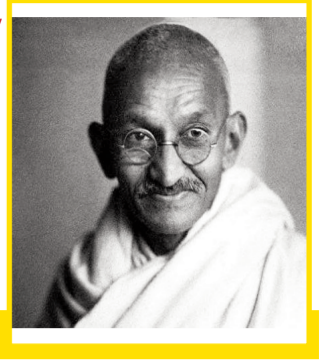

A society is judged by the way it treats and cares for its elderly people and its attitude towards women and senior citizens who give their utmost to the family and Society throughout their life, deserve to be looked after loving and sympathetically during the evening of their life when they might not be able to fend on their own.

It is heartening to see that there are quite a few old and new organisations in the town that have taken the responsibility of caring for the senior citizens of the town.

Started way back in 1996-97 with the aim to establish, promote and foster senior citizen groups and to reach out to the elderly person in the city and neighbouring colonies for their empowerment was started Senior Citizens Council. It arranges talks, group discussions etc. to create awareness about their rights and privileges. It fights for the causes of senior citizens and conducts research on problems like ageing. It helps in utilizing experience knowledge skill and energy of the seniors for the benefit of the society at large. For income generation, self help groups are set up.

Formed in 2012 the Senior Citizens Care Charitable Trust works mainly for elderly people who live alone and need support. Anurag Dube of the trust says that regular area-wise meetings are held when problems related to health and other daily needs are discussed. Talks by specialist doctor on problems like heart and destressing are arranged Engineers, C.As, Bank officers deliver talks, Outings and other entertainment programmes are also organised.

Formed in September 2007 Was Maharana Pratap Varishtha Nagrik Sansthan. It conducts programmes related to health issues. To make the city more peaceful, it holds program to bring the police and public closer. It makes efforts for improving the traffic system in the town. In the Smarika published by it are useful articles on different subjects, It also organises affordable foreign tours for its members.

Rajasthan Pensioner Samaj, district Udaipur is another organisation that serves pensioner of Rajasthan government and is located in collectorate Permissions if provides help in area like setting issues with to state government getting medical diaries etc. There is a physiotherapy centre in its building in Hiran Magri Sector eleven. It has provided jobs to some retired members by opening collection centres for payment of water and electricity bills. Eminent members are also honoured by the society.

The Sindhi Samaj runs an old age home in Savina Narayan Seva Sansthan also provide such facilities Recently Tara Sansthan has also opened an old age home.

Economics Nobel for Indian-American

Indian-American Abhijit Banerjee, his wife Esther Duflo and another economist Michael Kremer jointly won the 2019 Nobel Economics Prize today "for their experimental approach to alleviating global poverty".

Banerjee and French-American Duflo both work at the prestigious Massachusetts Institute of Technology, while Kremer is at Harvard University.

Duflo, 46-year-old former adviser to ex-US president Barack Obama, is the second woman and the youngest ever to win this prize.

The prize includes 9 million-kronor (\$918,000) cash, a gold medal and a diploma. The winners will equally share the prize money.

"The research conducted by this year's Laureates has considerably improved our ability to fight global poverty. In just two decades, their new experiment-based approach has transformed development economics, which is now a flourishing field of research," the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences said.

They have introduced a new approach to obtaining reliable answers about the best ways to fight global poverty, it added.

As a direct result of one of their studies, more than five million Indian children have benefited from effective programmes of remedial tutoring in schools. Another example is the heavy subsidies for preventive healthcare that have been introduced in many countries, it added. Duflo said receiving the prize was "incredibly humbling".

Banerjee, 58, was educated at the University of Calcutta, Jawaharlal Nehru University and Harvard University, where he received his PhD in 1988. He is currently the Ford Foundation International Professor of Economics at the Massachusetts

Institute of Technology.

Duflo, born in 1972, is the Abdul Latif Jameel Professor of Poverty Alleviation and Development Economics in the Department of Economics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and a co-founder and co-director of the Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab (J-PAL).

Banerjee is currently the Ford Foundation International Professor of Economics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology after he had taught at Harvard University and Princeton University

His work focuses on development economics. Together with Esther Duflo, Michael Kremer, John A List and Sendhil Mullainathan, he has proposed field experiments as an important methodology to discover causal relationships in economics. He was elected a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 2004

Was honoured with the Infosys Prize 2009 in the social sciences category of economics. He is also the recipient of the inaugural Infosys Prize in the category of social sciences

In 2012, he shared the Gerald Loeb Award Honorable Mention for Business Book with co-author Esther Duflo for their book Poor Economics

In 2013, he was named by United Nations Secretary General Ban Ki-Moon to a panel of experts tasked with updating the Millennium Development Goals after 2015
