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India's Decade of Transformation - Poised for a Global Leap

In a compelling address at the News 9 Global Summit, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi outlined India's remarkable journey over the past decade, echoing the summit's theme - 'India: Poised for the Big Leap.' Recognizing the pivotal role of media, he commended TV 9's diverse reporting team for representing the essence of India's vibrant democracy.

The Prime Minister emphasized the transformative decade, attributing the success to a shift in mindset, self-con-

fidence, and effective governance. He highlighted India's ascent to the top 5 economies globally, showcasing a substantial increase in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI), a thriving digital revolution, and growing trust in India's COVID-19 vaccine.

Crucially, the address shed light on the government's commitment to infrastructure development. The Prime Minister cited numerous completed projects, from crucial canal initiatives to long-pending bridges and tunnels, showcasing a

renewed government focus on project completion and efficiency. A major highlight was the Prime Minister's emphasis on governance culture evolution, turning government offices into allies rather than obstacles. He attributed the turnaround to a change in the government's work culture.

The Prime Minister underscored the government's achievements, including a surge in mutual fund investments, rapid project completions, and a substantial increase in the number of tax-



payers, reflecting citizens' trust in the government. He detailed

the impact of regular project monitoring through PRAGATI,

emphasizing that over 17 lakh crore worth of projects were reviewed in the past decade.

Highlighting the pace of development, the Prime Minister pointed out a week of monumental achievements, from inaugurating educational institutes to dedicating medical facilities and infrastructure projects, symbolizing India's push towards progress.

The address also delved into economic indicators, with the Prime Minister citing figures on new educational institutions, patents, startup growth,

and daily transactions, showcasing India's economic strength and resilience.

Shifting to social indicators, the Prime Minister celebrated the reduction of poverty to single digits, increased consumption, and the empowerment of rural India through improved connectivity and employment opportunities.

Addressing governance principles, the Prime Minister stressed a departure from vote bank politics, advocating a governance of saturation over the politics of scarcity. He high-

lighted critical decisions, such as the abrogation of Article 370, construction of the Ram Mandir, and gender equality initiatives.

The speech concluded with a vision for India in the 21st century, where the nation has emerged as a global leader in various sectors, from space exploration to clean energy. The Prime Minister expressed optimism for the future, declaring India as a forward-looking nation and urging a focus on the next five years to propel India to greater heights.

SPSU organised a one day Leadership Development Workshop


