Tough fight for BJP on three out of five Lok Sabha seats in Mewar

## BJP may not repeat 2014 performance

Lok Sabha polls are half way through. Rajasthan went to polls on 29th April when 13 constituencies saw polling and on 6th May when 12 constituencies went to polls. Mewar has five Loksabha constituencies which were won by Bhartiya Janata Party in2014. They are Udaipur, Chittorgarh, Banswara, Bhilwara and Rajsamand. In 2019 of these five constituencies three

are engaged in tough fight. Bhilwara and Chittorgarh are comparatively comfortable seats for BJP while Udaipur and Rajsamand will face tough close fight between BJP and Congress. Udaipur Lok Sabha constituency consists of eight

assembly segments. Udaipur is reserved for scheduled tribes. BJP has fielded its sitting MPArjun Lal Meena while Congress is once again hoping that Raghuvir Singh will be able to add to its seats tally, who was defeated in 2014 by BJP candidate by a margin of more than 2 lakh votes. In 2009 Raghuveer Singh won defeating Mahaveer Bhagora. In Udaipur there is no wave, voters have silently pressed

the button to make the desired change. Udaipur constituency has a history of not electing a candidate consecutively or twice, so will 2019 be any exception, one has to wait till May 23.

Banswara has been an interesting constituency where almost a decade back socialists had an effective presence because of the impact of Mama Baleshwar Dayal on the tribal population. But it seems to have waned now. A new phenomenon in the form of Bhartiya Tribal Party has emerged in the last decade. This party won two assembly constituencies in 2018 elections and was second in two other assembly constituencies.BJP has fielded former MP Kanak Mal Katara while Congress has fielded senior leader Tarachand Bhagora. Kanti Lal Roat of BTP has the guts to make it a triangular contest and may even win since the votes will be divided almost equally between these three major contesters. He is young and educated and holds a good image among local populace. BSP and one inde-

pendent are not in a position to make of BSP, Chandra Prakash Tanwar of any dent in the vote share.

Rajsamand constituency is witnessing a contest between Diva Kumari. a descendent of erstwhile Jaipur royal family. She is banking on the Rajput votes which are in good number. But she is facing opposition from local Rajputs who see her as an outsider. Former MP from BJP Hariom Singh Rathore is not keeping well and will not be a big help. Kiran Maheshwari, the local MLA from BJP is also ambitious and since the party could not form government in Rajasthan, she could also be interested in contesting for Lok Sabha. In comparision to Diya Kumari Devaki Nandan Gurjar holds better

He is President of District Congress and has been in the local politics for decades. A close confidante of Dr. C.P. Joshi, he has an edge over Diya Kumari since Gurjar votes are also in good number and Brahmins also will be wooed eas-

Ambedkarite Party of India, Mishri Kathat of Indian People's Green Party and five independents will not make any impat as they do not have ant presence in the region individually or as a party.

Chittorgarh constituency is also witnessing a close fight. C.P. Joshi, sitting MP of BJP has been active in the last tenure and is young and energetic. He is facing Gopal Singh Shekhawat of Indian National Congress. Shekhawat is banking on Rajput votes which form a big part of the voters. Other candidates from BSP, BTP, CPI, Ambedkarite Party of India, Satya Bahumat Party and two independents will also harm the prospects of Congress as they would cut into the votes of tribal population which traditionally has been with Congress. In 2014 BJP candidate C.P.Joshi bagged 7,03,236 votes and defeated Dr. Girija Vyas of INC who got 3,86, 379 votes. Interestingly Radha Devi of Communist Party of India got 21,593 votes in 2014 and was at the

third place. If INC could have some alliance with left front in Rajasthan, it would have benefited in Assembly as well as Lok Sabha elections.

In Bhilwara Lok Sabha constituency BJP has fielded sitting MP Subhash Chandra Baheria who is facing Rampal Sharma of Indian National Congress. In 2014 Subhash Chandra Baheria got 6,30317 votes while Ashok Chandna of INC got 3,84,053 votes. That was the time of Modi wave

Things have changed since then. INC won the by-election with a thumping majority in Mandal, and later in 2018 Assembly polls also INC won in Mandal and Hindoli seats. Although Bhilwara assembly seat has been a stronghold of BJP, the 2019 Lok Sabha polls may sur-

It is interesting that in almost all these Lok Sabha constituencies NOTA has a figure of nearly 20,000 votes. This phenomenon should alarm the major political parties.

## Imperative to invest in Artificial Intelligence - Prof. Sharma

Udaipur: In the rapidly changing world scenario today, India must invest heavily in the fields of Artificial Intelligence(A.I.), Big Data Analytics etc in order to catch up with the world, otherwise we will be left behind in this utmost important fast developing areas of modern technology. These words were said by Prof. B.P. Sharma, vicechancellor-Gautam Buddh University, Greater Noida in his address in the inaugural session of the 10th International Conference on "Transformation of Business, Economy and Society in Digital Era" organized by the Faculty of Management of the Pacific University on 26th & 27th April, 2019 in the university auditorium.

Speaking as the keynote speaker in the inaugural session, Prof. Sharma reminded that China has shown vision and invested 27 billion dollars in the field of A.I. research and development. Looking at the future, India too, should invest time, energy and money in this area. Citing various examples like solar panels, electric cars etc, he demonstrated that it is our habit to import latest finished objects instead of investing in R&d and developing latest technology ourselves.

In the beginning, in her opening address, the Conference Director Prof. Mahima Birla, Dean-Faculty of Management, spoke in detail about the important aspects of today's digital world like A.I., 3-D Printing, Big Data Analytics, Internet of Things etc. She said that Pacific University has always lived up to its responsibility towards organizing seminars and conferences on emerging topics and hence this conference has been organized to provide a vibrant platform to the research scholars and faculty teachers to deliberate upon the effects of digitalization in all aspects of human activities today.

The Chief Guest of the session Dr. N.S. Rathore, deputy director of Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi, emphasized that though it has become imperative to incorporate A.I. , Machine Learning, I.O.T. etc in all our activities, care should be taken that they are adopted according to the needs and situations prevalent in our country. We shall not follow the western models of technologies blindly. He however accepted the importance and benefits of using A.I., Cloud Computing, Remote sensing etc even in the field of agri-

culture as well as other fields. Guest of honour Dr. Parmendra Dashora, former vice-chancellor of Kota University, in his address said that India is a unique country where we make good use of a range of technologies from bullock-cart technology to space technology in various human activities. He expressed confidence that, as in space technology and the field of software. Indians will soon become lead-



ers in the modern areas of A.I. and total digitalization. He congratulated Pacific University and especially its Faculty of Management for organizing a conference on a relevant subject and hoped that the deliberations during the conference will pave a way forward to faster research in these areas

Organizing Secretary Dr Pallavi Mehta explained the topic of the conference. A souvenir was also released on the occasion. The Chief Co-ordinator of the conference, Dr Dipin Mathur gave the information that the Faculty of Management, PAHER University organized this two-day International Conference on 26th and 27th April 2019. The conference had Seven Technical Tracks spread over two days with expert's key note addresses and interactive discussions. In these two days 16 parallel technical sessions were conducted.
