11th Akshay Kumar International Invite Kudo Championship



Rajasthan became champion in Kudo with 23 gold medals

Udaipur: Team Kudo dominated the international kudo world by winning 23 gold, 15 silver and 22 bronze medals in Rajasthan in the 11th Akshay Kumar International Invitation Kudo Championships 2019 held in Mumbai.

Renshi Rajkumar Menaria, International Kudo Instructor and Chairman of Team Rajasthan told that Ritika Sharma, Priyadarshani Kamble, Yuvaditya Nagda, & Nidanyu Bhardwaj Jodhpur and Laxita Pawar from Kudo

Udaipur, of Sensee Raj Academy in Mixed Martial Arts, and 5 boys of Combat Fitness, received the award from Bollywood star Akshay Kumar and brighten the name of Mewar the world.

In this international championship held under the leadership of Indian Kudo Federation President Soshihan Mehul Vora and Chairman Akshay Kumar, Team Udaipur performed brilliantly by winning 12 gold, 10 silver, and 15 bronze medals out of 60 medals in Rajasthan, 3 gold in other districts. With a total of 10 medals, including 2 silver and 5 bronze medals, Jodhpur made second place in the state. Bikaner captured a total of 6 medals, including 3 gold, 2 silver, and 1 bronze, Alwar-Bhiwandi captured 3 gold,

2 silver, and 5 bronze, Jalore with 2 gold and 1 silver and Dholpur captured 1 medal.

Menaria said that more than 5 thousand players from across the country participated in this tournament and showed their power. A team of over 100 referees and adjudicators, including international trainer and national A grade referee Renshi Rajkumar Menaria and Sensay Vipash Menaria led more than 4 thousand kudo matches under the leadership of technical director of Championship, Hanshi Parsi Bahmani.

Menaria said that Kudo Team India officially has broken 2 Guinness Book of Records. 4 Guinness Book World record holder Renshi Vispi Kharadi led by Team India's Sanshi Mehul Vora broke his nail bed record to set a new record at 9 layers. In the personal record, a minute was made by turning 21 iron rods at 90 degrees in one minute.

Challenge of technology, when converted into opportunity, transformed 'Dakiya' into 'Bank Babu': PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi today unveiled the book "Bridgital Nation" and presented its first copy to Ratan Tata in an event organized at 7, Lok Kalyan Marg, New Delhi today. The book has been written by N Chandrasekaran and Roopa Purushottam.

Technology: The bridge to achieve 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas'

Addressing the gathering, PM lauded the authors for bringing out a visionary book that is replete with positivity and optimism and delves in depth about the importance of technology. He added that the book is coming out at a time when technology is positively transforming the lives of millions of Indians.

Prime Minister stressed on the need to understand that technology is a bridge and not a divider. He added that technology builds bridge between aspirations and achievement, demand and delivery, government and governance in order to achieve 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas'. He said that positivity, creativity and constructive mindset is essential for fast growing aspirational India. He also emphasized on the need to build bridge between artificial intelligence and human intentions.

Governance through technology: The journey of last five years

Prime Minister narrated how technology has been a key component of government schemes in order to reform, transform and perform. He mentioned about the use of data intelligence, digital mapping and real time monitoring in Ujjwala Yojana which has transformed the lives of millions of women. He also talked about how technology has helped in empowering people through schemes like Jan Dhan Yojana and Ayushman Bharat.

Prime Minister also outlined that his government has used technology to remove silos amongst government departments and build a bridge between supply systems and



demand, through innovative ideas like Government e-market Place (GeM). He explained how technology was used to create a robust Start-Up system in the country, especially in tier-2 and tier 3 cities - which has helped in the development of an entirely new ecosystem of startups.

Talking about the need to convert challenges posed by technology into opportunities, PM cited the example of the creation of India Post Payment Bank. He added that the disruption caused by technology to the entire postal organization was converted into a technology intensive banking system, benefiting millions through postal bank which transformed 'dakiya' into a 'Bank Babu'. "Gandhi Vichar Manch" submits a memorandum to UP CM

Mumbai: A sizable number of North Indians reside in the commercial capital of India-Mumbai, who are engaged in various trades like selling vegetables, milk, driving taxis, auto rickshaws, handling security, building construction work and media etc. They toil day and night and earn money, the major share of which is spent towards weddings, celebration of festivals and family programmes in their native place, giving economic stability to Uttar Pradesh. However no attention is paid towards their problems. As such a memorandum highlighting woes of UPites, was given to UP Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, by the President of the social organisation-"Gandhi Vichar Manch" Manmohan Gupta, during Yogi Adityanath's visit to Mumbai on 19 October 2019. UPites find it difficult to get rail tickets while going to UP, despite working for the years together, the hawkers in Mumbai are being driven away and no alternate employment is provided to them by the Government.
