New Delhi: With a mission to spread awareness about Clean & Green Delhi under

Swachh Bharat Mission and to provide a robust waste management solution in the capi-

tal, Art of Living & NDMC have joined hands to process 1 Ton wet waste per day. They have

launched first of its kind, "Swachh Composting Plant" that will produce 100 percent organic compost. The plant has been established by New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) in collaboration with Sri Sri Rural Development Programme Trust.

Residents are responsible for segregation of waste at home: Shri Anil Bajjal

Swachh Composting Plant has been set up in NDMC Nursery Raja Bazaar, Sector-4, Gole Market New Delhi and inaugurated by Global Spiritual Leader and Founder Art of Living, Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, Lt. Governor, Delhi Shri Anil Bajjal & Chairperson-NDMC, Shri Dharmendra. The plant will dispose of 1000 kg waste

every day and produce 300 kg of organic compost without using any chemical treatment.

On the launch of Swachh Composting Plant, Global Spiritual Leader and Founder Art of Living, Sri Sri Ravi Shankar said that "It is time to turn waste into Gold where in

Addressing the gathering Shri Anil Bajjal, Lt. Governor, Delhi said "Green initiatives of the NDMC towards eco-friendly solution for organic waste management is an effort to make wealth from the waste. But it is in practice of segregation of waste put in place a support by every citizen starting from their homes. For the purpose, every citizen is responsible for the segregation of waste, so as to reduce dumping of the waste at landfill site". While appreciating the efforts of NDMC and Sri Sri Rural Development Programme Trust, Shri Anil

Bajjal, Lt. Governor, Delhi added that "we need to change thinking of the society to reduce the waste generation and segregation in the re-usable manner, so that we create the wealth from the waste. He further said that this initiative may be replicated by the other civic agencies of Delhi to make the entire capital city green and clean." In his welcome address, the Chairperson-NDMC, Shri Dharmendra said that under the Swachh Bharat Mission NDMC has taken an initiative to manage its kitchen waste in situ thereby it has saved on manual labour as well as transportation cost. He further said that this shall help to improving the carbon footprint for NDMC and also reduce the air pollution of Capital City which

is the need of hour.

The Chairman NDMC informed that NDMC also plans to install similar organic waste converter at some more residential colonies like Bharti Nagar and Sanghli Mess. He further informed that an organic waste converter plant set up at the Madhu Limay Marg Nursery in collaboration with Art of Living is already processing organic waste on the average of 1000 kg daily.

Secretary, NDMC Dr. Rashmi Singh while presenting the vote of thanks applauded the role of all the members of Art of Living actively associated with the project and other from Residents Welfare Associations, Market Traders Associations etc who participated on the occasion.

HIGHLIGHTS

1. Seed Biodiversity Festival – Seed is the basic input and lifeline of agriculture. Local farming communities have preserved, shared and reused their diverse indigenous seed varieties over generations. The festival will bring together seed savers, organic farmers and farmer breeders from all over the country with the motto of promoting our Desi (indigenous) varieties for nutritious and productive crops. More than 200 Seed savers from all over India will participate with more than 4000 across grains, pulses, rice, vegetables, fruits, tubers, etc.

2. Go-Dhan model – A Model cow project displaying uses of cows in organic agriculture. Workshops and dis-

plays on the production of value-added products using cow dung and cow urine like bricks, Vedic plaster etc. The event will also show biodiversity among cows and other livestock from all over India.

3. Demonstration of a model organic farm – Special plots will be prepared with the practical help of farmers and scientists, showing how crops can be grown using organic techniques. An exhibition from various groups from across states will showcase their techniques & activities related to organic farming. Genuine and certified input providers for organic farming will display their farmer-friendly products. A demo space for medicinal plants and their uses will also be prepared.

4. Kissan Haat – This space will allow consumers to

know and procure authentic organic produce directly from producers as well as interact with them. It opens up marketing opportunities for all the organic producers selling farm produce and value-added products.

5. Innovation arena – Innovations of equipment, implements and organic technologies will be open for display and discussion. Each project will contribute to our food and clothing value chain and also provide a platform for the innovators to reach a larger audience. Also a rare opportunity to discuss with awarded organic farmers from all over the country.

6. Agri-preneur start-up camp – A program for guiding and motivating young entrepreneurs. Amplifying their ideas into successful models through

inputs and training.

7. Cultural Programs – Every evening of the convention will be unique and celebratory, with special kinds of cultural programs related to organic farming & food.

8. Various workshops, exhibitions and live demonstrations – Workshops and demonstrations on the topic like urban gardening, natural dyeing, soil health, to enable an exchange of knowledge and provide interactive learning for all.

9. Gaba – Alternate Fashion – Gaba – Alternate fashion is a unique show featuring desi cotton clothing dyed using natural materials. Organic Farming Association of India (OFAI) is collaborating with designers, to create clothing which is easily accessible and wearable in everyday life.

Udaipur: The freely successful operation of jaw disease was conducted in Pacific Medical College and Hospital, an operation that lasted for 5 hours, carried out by the team of maxillofacial surgeons Dr. BD Roy, Dr. Nilesh Bhanawat, Dr. Himanshu Gupta, Dr. Prakash Auidhya, Dr. Arun Mathur, Brijesh Bhardwaj, Deepak and Suryakant. For the last two years, the 16-year-old Gotti Rana, a resident of Kotwadi Rana village of Banswara, started swelling in the last two years, which continued to grow and he had swollen like a big coconut. The family of Gotti Rana took him to many places, but due to such a large knot and lack of a max-



illofacial surgeon, the patient could not be treated. The family brought him to Pacific Dental College and Research Center, where he showed him to Dr. Nilesh Bhanawat, after examining, Gotti Rana came to know of the disease named Ossifying fibroma, which was possible to cure by the operation. This patient's operation was risky because the patient had a hepatitis problem. Due to which there is a risk of infection. This operation was done free of cost under Bhamashah Yojana.

Chief Guest Historian Prof. KS Gupta said that the name of Sutradhar Mandan is important among the contacts of Indian architecture. In medieval India, when Islamic influence was pushing back the traditional Indian statue of art and architect-

ture, Mandan kept alive not only the north but also the South Indian architecture and craft traditions. The contribution of Mandan in the tradition of Indian craftsmanship is unique, in texts like Roop Mandan and the God and goddess case, their idolized signs have been readily accepted not only in India but wherever the devotees with respect to the idol have settled.

Presiding over the ceremony Vice-Chancellor Prof. S.S. Sarangadevot said that the history of Indian sculpture is thousands of years old, there is such a treasure of the artistic history of Indian culture, in which the folk art and traditional techniques of this place are seen. It is a specialty of the Indian sculpture a tradition that it has a very deep connection with painting, music, dance and theater.

He said that Indian sculpture has taken a real look from the beginning, in which human figures often depict thin waist, elastic limbs and young and sensitive forms and trees and plants, animals and deities.
