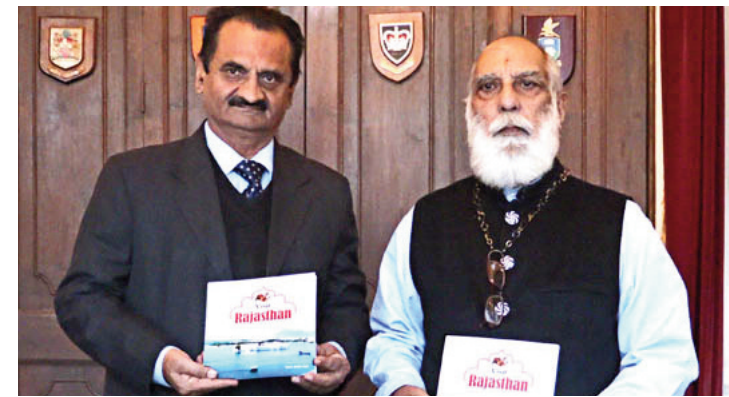
folk artists and they are also shown products made by village artisans and handicraftsmen. There is a great demand abroad for village made products. Foreign tourists like it very much and take these articles with them.

Making a Hindu Rashtra?

The second tenure of BJP in Delhi with full majority has a loud and clear message that the party is resolved fully

to unleash their age-old agenda of making India a Hindu Rashtra. The previous five years were used to create an environment of fear and apprehensions in the mind of all those who could create impediments in their path. The gruesome murders of rationalist thinkers like Prof. M.M. Kalburgi, Govind Pansare, Narendra Dabholkar and Gouri Lankesh arrests and imprisonment of Human Rights activists Sudha Bhardwaj, Varvara Rao and charges on dalit scholars like Dr. Telumbade are sufficient examples to show that the practice of independent thought and its expression is not welcome by the state. One after the other, the points on the agenda of Rashtriya Swyam sevak Sangh which is the backbone of BJP, are being translated into action.

The law against triple Talaque, removal of the special provisions for Jammu and Kashmir in article 370 of the Indian Constitution, division of the state of Kashmir into two Union Territories, undeclared emergency in Kashmir and suspension of all democratic rights, judgment on the Ayodhya Issue and finally the Citizenship Amendment Act are all steps that the majority party in power at the centre is not worried about the votes and voice of the biggest minority of the country. Besides this apparent and obvious change, the appointment in univer-

sities and colleges, national academic bodies like ICSSR, ICHR, ICPR etc. show very clearly the shift in the focus of the government. The syllabi of universities and schools are now new ideological battlegrounds where the histories are being rewritten to suit the agenda of the ruling party. The definitions of crime and criminals change with the individual's joining the ruling party. The latest example is that of Ajeet Pawar in Maharashtra who was given a clean chit in seventeen cases filed against him simply a day after he helped BJP form a minority government in Maharashtra. BJP leaders like Kuldeep Sengar who were charged of rape and murder are left to move scot free until a massive public opinion is built against them. Pragya Singh is not only given a ticket and is elected to Lok Sabha but is not even reprimanded even after she insults Mahatma Gandhi and eulogises Nath Ram Godse, the murderer of Mahatma Gandhi. Simply because you wear a saffron scarf you get absolved of all your sins. The majority of television channels are now owned by the supporters of BJP and RSS who are churning lies day and night to further the agenda of the ruling party. RSS cadre people are inducted as journalists and analysts in TV debates to shout down all rational voices and independent thoughts.

These are not good signs for Indian democracy which is based on the fundamental principles of federalism, secularism, socialism and justice. Today one is not sure whether even the judiciary will act free of the mounting pressure of a majoritarian rule. The people of India, who have dedicated the constitution unto themselves, have the onus to protect it also.

Tourist Boom In lake city

Udaipur tourism seems to continue its winning streak of getting coveted awards now it has bagged the prestigious 9th Conde Nast Traveler India Travel awards 2019 for the favourite leisure destination in India.

According to hotel association and tour and travel agency sources, due to increase in air travel facility, Udaipur would attract many more tourists during the next Christmas festival. The booking in hotels at present is about 70% and it would be 100% during Christmas season, from December 21st to 2nd January. As the number of hotels is increasing tourists would have no difficulty

in getting ample accommodation. In Udaipur there are 700 to 800 big and small hotels with about 10,000 rooms. In addition to this the city has about 100 paying guest houses, 25 to 30 'Dharmshalas' and about 40 resorts. Some hotels have reduced their tariff due to recession in the market.

The recent figures about tourists in the city are 61260 (Indian) and 3082 (Foreign) in June 2019 and 64955 (Indian) and 6945 (Foreign) visitors in July 2019. For July 2019 and August 2019 the figures are 76215 (Indian) and 11520 (Foreign) and 78815 (Indian) and 10375 (Foreign) respectively. In this season most foreign tourists are

from UK, France, Italy, Canada, USA, Germany and Australia. The figures for October 2019 are UK (2573), France (2432), Germany (2042), Australia (1555) and USA (1772). NRI's also visit Udaipur in the season.

Foreign tourists most of whom are French and German are enjoying themselves fully.

They watched eagerly rural women shopping in the Delhigate, Dhanmandi areas while groups from England bought guava from Santoshi Mata Mandir area.

Buses full of school children from Gujarat and Maharashtra are also being seen.

There are long queues of tourist waiting for a boat ride in Fatehsagar. The favourite haunts of foreign tourist are City Palace, Sahelion in Bari, Pichola, Sajjangarh, Fatehsagar, Gulababag and Doodhtalai. While some of them also visit neighboring places like Jaisamand, Rajsamand, Gourmghat and Kumbhalgarh.
