

## We are committed to ensuring the no woman or child should die from preventable causes : Dr. Harsh Vardhan

**Special 'Health & Wellness Screening Camp' for Women organised at Nirman Bhawan to mark Int'l Women's Day**

**New Delhi:** "We remain resolved and committed to ensuring that no woman or child should die from preventable causes. We are guided by the vision of our Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji to achieve a New India all by 2022". This was stated by Dr. Harsh Vardhan, Union Minister of Health & Family Welfare while inaugurating the "Women for Health and Wellness" special screening and nutrition counselling camp as a part of International Women's Day Celebrations at Nirman Bhawan, New Delhi today. Smt. Smriti Zubin Irani, Union Minister of Women & Child Development, and Textiles and Sh. Ashwini Kumar Choubey, Minister of State for Health & Family Welfare also graced the inaugural ceremony. Addressing the gathering, which largely comprised of women officers, staff members and women relatives of those working in Nirman Bhawan, Dr.

Harsh Vardhan stated that instead of just one day dedicated to marking Int'l Women's Day, the Government, with a sharp focus on enhancing awareness about several women's issues and provisioning of services, is now celebrating it for a week starting from 1st March.

Dr. Harsh Vardhan also said that health and wellbeing of women remain key components of Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) which provides health coverage up to Rs. 5 lakh per family per year to around identified 10.74 crore poor and vulnerable families. Also, the Ayushman Bharat Health and Wellness Centres (AB-HWCs), in rural and urban areas have brought services closer to the communities and are expanding and strengthening Reproductive & Child Health (RCH) services and Communicable Diseases services by including services related to Non-Communicable Diseases, mental health, ENT, ophthalmology, oral health, geriatric and palliative health care and trauma care as well

as health promotion and wellness activities like Yoga. About 614 lakh women accessed healthcare services at Ayushman Bharat Health & Wellness Centres, accounting for 54% of the total footfalls.

Dr Harsh Vardhan stated that "Women are not only the beneficiaries of the healthcare programmes, but are in fact



an important part of the team delivering healthcare services to society. We must recognize the unrelenting and concerted efforts of lakhs of Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs), Auxiliary Nurse Midwives (ANMs), staff nurses

and women doctors, and also lakhs of anganwadi workers who form the foundation of our healthcare and wellness network."

Dr. Harsh Vardhan said that while globally the MMR fell by nearly 45%, India recorded an exemplary decline of 78% reduction in maternal deaths over the last two

decades. Institutional deliveries in India have risen sharply from 47% in 2007-08 to over 78.9% in 2015-16 (NFHS4) while safe delivery has simultaneously climbed from 52.7% to 81.4% in the same period. With these figures, I am

enthused that we shall be able to achieve the herculean target to eradicate Tuberculosis by 2025". Smt. Smriti Zubin Irani, Union Minister of Women & Child Development said that the vision of our Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi ji is to achieve both economic and social growth through women lead development. This is the first time in history of India all the Ministries/Departments are jointly working to achieve this vision as part of the Int'l Women's Day events. She also said the increasing footfall of women in Health & Wellness Centres is a sign that Ayushman Bharat is a successful model and providing access to the women for getting screened for cervical, breast or oral cancer, along with counselling for various health related matters. The Union Minister stated that with three foundational initiatives such as Medical Termination of Pregnancy (Amendment) Bill, 2020; Assisted Reproductive Technology (ART) Regulation Bill, 2020; and Surrogacy (Regulation) Bill, 2020, we

have emerged as global leaders in the arena of reproductive rights of women.

Sh. Ashwini Kumar Choubey highlighted the expanded basket of health services for women's health through schemes such as Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritva Abhiyan (PMSMA), LaQshya (Labour Room Quality Improvement Initiative), Weekly Iron & Folic Acid Scheme (WIFS) and the Saathiya (Peer Educators), Surakshit Matritva Aaswasan (SUMAN) etc. The Government is committed to the holistic health of women through the 'lifecycle' approach, providing a range of healthcare and wellness services. Smt. Preeti Sudan, Secretary (HFW), Dr. Dharmendra Singh Gangwar, AS&FA, Dr. Manohar Agnani, JS (RCH), Shri Vikas Sheel, JS (Policy), MoHFW along with other officials of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and Ministry of Women and Child Development, along with representatives of development partners, were also present during the event.

## Allen Bhilwara's 8 Is Students Selected in NTSE Stage-1

**Bhilwara:** The results of the NTSE First Stage were declared by the Board of Secondary Education Rajasthan Ajmer on Tuesday. In these results of the National Talent Search Examination (NTSE) Phase I, the students of Allen Career Institute have once again recorded a record. Director Naveen Maheshwari said that eight students of Allen Bhilwara had been selected for the second phase of NTSE. These students are from the regular classroom program of Soumya bhada-



dra, Abhijeet Malani, Suhani Soni, Harshita Pratihara, Madhav Maheshwari, Ishika Nankani, Ansh tank and Mehul Darq.

Maheshwari said that a total of 513 students were declared eligible for the second phase by the board. Out of this, 212 students are from Allen Free- and Career Foundation (NCF) Division. Allen has more than 41 percent of the total results. There are 200 students associated with Allen from the classroom program, three workshops, and 9 DLP programs. Apart from this, 12 students have been included in the top 10 ranks, out of which ten students are from Allen. In this, Ananya Solanki and Ayush Joshi rank 1, Cherish Jain and Daksha Jain rank 4, Swaraj Nandi, Vibhu Kalyan Sahu, Medhansh Sharma, Sanyam Jain, Suryadev Jalan, and Yash Nadia are all at the seventh rank. It proves Allen's superiority. Almost every other student is from Allen Career Institute. In the results released by the board, PNC in-charge Amit Gupta said that the cut-off marks of general category 180, SC cut off 142, ST 149 OBC 162, EWS category 128 and Physically Handicapped PH category cut off 74 marks. The second phase examination will be conducted by the Union Ministry of Human Resource Development through NCERT. After this, the talent scholarship in the 11th and 12th class is given to the selected students at the national level. At graduation and PG level, they will get ₹ 2000 per month i.e., 24000 scholarships annually.

## STATE BUDGET GETS MIXED REACTION

The budget for 2020-2021 presented by Chief Minister Ashok Gahlot has tried to appease a different section of the society out of 14,533 crore for health, one hundred crores are to go to Nirogi Rajasthan Prabandh Kosh, all the district would get one crore. There is to be a digital health survey of every citizen. For raising the underground water level, 150 crore is to be spent on water collection units. Ninety-one crores are being given for the drip sprinkler system. 5000 crore has been set aside for six new medical colleges. Nehru Bal Kosh is to get 100 crores for young man, Board of investment is to be constituted.

For helping SME'S, we will be set up Udhogaya Mitra Portal. The measures to be taken for education include computer teacher cadre, PTM, and cultural programs and no bag day on Saturdays in schools. There is provision for 30 drinking water projects in 16 districts and a supply of water in homes at the cost of 160 crores. Artificial Intelligence labs are also to be set up. Other important measures include training of 10,000 students in RSLDC and skill University and 44 new Kisan Mandis, the award of 1 crore for gold, Sixty lac for silver, and Thirty lac for bronze medal winners in Asian and commonwealth games are to be given. The completion of the Barmer Refinery is to be speeded up. DLC is being reduced by 10%. There is a relief of 130 crores in different taxes. Recruitment on 53,181 on Post is to be done rapidly.

In the opinion of former Central Minister, Girija Vyas, the focus of the budget is on balanced developments that include health, education, youth, women, farmers, drinking water, and irrigation. There is no new tax. The central government has reduced the budget for the state while the state government has given a lot to the citizens; Vallabhnagar MLA Gajendra Singh shaktawat feels happy about the provision of funds for Ayad and sisarma rivers. Gulabchand Katariya, leader of the

opposition, says that the budget has no direction and no scheme for income generation. It is based on the funds to be given by the Central Government. The dire need to funds for Devas 3 and 4 has been ignored the interests of the tribal population have been wholly overlooked according to rural MLA Phool Singh Meena.
