

## Good Going

Vice-Chancellor of MPUAT Udaipur Professor Narendra Singh Rathore addressed the faculty and staff of the University online in which 100 persons participated. Pro. Rathore said that during Corona Lockdown, all the students were connected through various WhatsApp groups through deans in all the faculty, in which information about

taking classes through various digital online mediums is disseminated daily by each professor and through different digital mediums In the last April

month, 5535 classes have been taken by the University in 519 subjects, Presents an example in itself. He told that during this period, three books were written by university teachers, 47 e-learning compendiums, and e-manuals were also prepared on various subjects from which students can study at home. During this period, two extension education booklets, 152 advisories were also released, and the weekly agricultural bulletin was given to more than 1 lakh farmers of 6 districts under the Rural Farmers Weather Service and 2544 farmers have also connected with Arogya Setu and 483 farmers with Rath app. The Community Science and Fisheries College has also released illustrated advisory for farmers to protect them from cavity epidemics. The Vice-Chancellor said that during this time 216 research trials of Rabi season had been completed under various projects in which wheat, barley, gram, mustard, algebraic spices, medicinal plants, horticultural crops, and mushrooms are the main ones and presently summer peanuts, mungs, maize Research is going on on vegetables, fruits. During this time, work is also being done to produce quality seeds of various crops in 245 hectares. During the last month lockdown, the university faculty also participated in more than seven online workshops, and webinars and a 5-day faculty workshop were also organized. 452 advisory has also been issued for the protection of Corona and agricultural works through Krishi Vigyan Kendras. During this time, the Vice-Chancellor and scientists gave many radio and Doordarshan talks and also solved the problem of hundreds of farmers through telephone. During this period, Krishi Vigyan Kendras also collected revenue of 4 lakhs from the sale of fruit and vegetable plants and vermicompost, etc.

The Vice-Chancellor advised all the faculty to adopt adaptability in the broadest form of the English language character AEIOU, to increase its efficiency, to be inclusive and timely, and to adopt universality in Today's time. He expected all staff members to adopt integrated and right thinking and practice in Today's time.

## Paras J. K. hospital performed Rare heart operation of a 2-year-old child in Udaipur

**Udaipur:** Paras J. K. hospital, During the corona period, performed a rare heart operation of a 2-year-old child.

Heart Surgery Specialist Dr. G. Chandra Shekhar told that Lal Singh had trouble drinking mother's milk since birth, and



his body was complaining of blue, due to which his parents had taken him to many hospitals in Delhi and Jodhpur in the past. Doctors told the family about the tetralogy of spread

disease. This is a rare congenital heart disease in which the aorta does not occur in its place along with VSD, pulmonary valve stenosis, and the right ventricle wall is also very thick. That is, there are three pathologies in the heart simultaneously.

At the behest of one of his relatives, gave an address of the Paras J. K. Hospital's pediatrician Dr. Manoj Agarwal, later showed him where the doctor explained to him in detail about the disease and its treatment that such a rare disease occurs in any one of the millions of children. This disease arises from the time of the birth of children. Many children die due to a lack of medical care, and some do not survive even after getting medical treatment. By modern technology of the present age, the child will be fully healthy.

Talking about treatment, heart surgery disease specialist Dr. G. Chandra Shekhar told that treatment of such type of patients is possible only through surgery. For this, the patient's level of oxygen is corrected, after which procedure is done. In this, the treatment of all four heart diseases is done simultaneously. Due to which the rarity and risk of its treatment also increase.

In treatment, the hole of the right and left pumping chamber is closed, and the pulmonary valve is brought to its normal state. The aorta is also brought to the right place by an operation. Also, the thickness of the right valve is also corrected. These four diseases are corrected by a simultaneous operation.

Explaining the reasons for this, heart surgery disease specialist Dr. G. Chandrasekhar said that Vasai is not a solid cause in most of its cases. But it mostly occurs during the development of the bruise. When the child's heart is developing, this is also due to the mother not getting enough nutrition during pregnancy, having some kind of fever, and partial reasons.

Dr. Nitin Kaushik Cardiac Anesthesia Specialist said that Lal Singh's surgery we had done in the last days is now fully healthy. We have all together celebrated his second birthday in the hospital by following Sociological Distancing, and he has been discharged from the hospital. In the treatment team, heart surgery disease specialist Dr. G. Chandra Shekhar, Dr. Nitin Kaushik, Cardiac Anesthesia Specialist Dr. Manoj Agarwal, is a sage specialist. Hospital's facility director Vishwajeet said that he congratulated the team of doctors for completing this rare surgery during the corona, during which the hospital is entirely safe and ready for 24 hours of all types of treatment.

# Community-Women in the Forefront of A Battle Against Covid 19

During this time of an unprecedented lockdown to defeat the coronavirus, the collective strength of over 2000 women's self-help group has come to the fore

In these extraordinary times, when many are united in our fight against COVID 19, the SAKHI SHG women from rural villages of Rajasthan & Uttarakhand are playing a critical role and emerging as community leaders

These women are working at different levels, from the production of cloth face mask to giving away food grains and making provision for cooked food for the vulnerable & daily wage earners and are supporting Hindustan Zinc in every possible way in these testing times. Project SAKHI that was started in partnership with Manjari foundation a few years ago has proved to be a valuable resource in these difficult times, and it is because of the collective power of these women that the communities are strengthened at such a challenging time

## Meeting the shortfall in PPEs

More than ever, these women are living up to their vision of self-help & solidarity.

Collectively have produced nearly 1.25 lakh mask till now. Since production is decentralized, these masks have reached a widely spread population without the need for complex logistics and transportation. The masks are being distributed to community people, vulnerable citizens & frontline workers such as health workers, police, Anganwadi & Asha workers, and janitors.

Running Grain Banks and Community Kitchen to ensure no-one sleeps hungry.

These Self-help groups are from within the communities & have become the most significant enabler in providing essential resources for their community people. With a considerable number of daily wage earners losing their livelihoods and food supply getting disrupted in some areas, over 2000 SHGs have collectively set up grain banks with the active participation of about 75 Sakhi village organizations.

These women have been putting in food grains (wheat, rice, and pulses) through the collection from their fields and stocks to distribute the dry ration further to feed the stranded



ed workers & those vulnerable of Rajasthan state. The grain bank has collected over 10,000 Kg grains as of now.

In partnership with Azim Premji Foundation, these SHGs have also started community kitchen 'Apni Rasoi' that aims at providing cooked food to the daily wage earners & those not having enough.

## Awareness

Our Samuh Sakhi & other community cadres are playing a pivotal role in creating awareness & disseminating COVID related messages at the village level. The women are systematically using their network of WhatsApp group to ward off confusion.

## Livelihood generation

The SHG women are stitching mask to ensure that mask – an essential means of protection from infection reach everyone in the community.

The move has not only helped in protecting others but has also given livelihood opportunities to about 150+ women of HZL's operational areas, especially during the period of lockdown when most of them from the unorganized sectors have lost their source of income. As of now, Rs 10 lakhs livelihood have been generated

**Jamna –**  
Jamna Khatik, a resident

of Putholi village in Chittorgarh district of Rajasthan, is one of those women whose contribution amidst this crisis surely qualifies for appreciation. Jamna has been associated with Sanwariya SHG & involved in stitching, through Hindustan Zinc's 'SAKHI' initiative. She is associated with Sakhi Utpadan Samiti. When the entire country is in lockdown phase, and the citizens are anxious, Jamna's zeal to contribute something for the country and society is noteworthy. She took an initiative to ensure and promote safety against COVID-19 by honing her skills which resulted in the creation of a shield against COVID-19.

Sakhi Utpadan Samiti derived the task of creating 40,000 masks. Jamna worked day and night and created 3115 masks in 14 days. Her contribution in terms of creating a mask made her eligible for an income of INR 16,450. Owing to lockdown, her entire family was incurring liquidity issues, and the amount which she earned was great support for the entire family. She says, "Sakhi initiative has always

addressed issues about the social sector. This initiative has again given us a chance to contribute something for a cause bigger than anything. It has again empowered women to support their families amidst this harsh time".

## Anisha –

The testing times bring the best version of true warriors, and Anisha emerged as one. She expressed her willingness to stitch cloth masks to the SAKHI federation. A 15-member team was formed that received a one-day training by Manjari Foundation. The team started creating the mask. The actions were motivated by a feeling amongst all women, the feelings of patriotism, and service to society. Anisha worked for 12 to 14 hours on a daily basis. Her continuous involvement and hard work resulted in the creation of 1500 masks in 12 days. She was involved in cloth cutting and finishing activities of 8855 masks. The endeavors resulted in a cash inflow of INR 20378 for Anisha.

# Video Conferencing From Major Agencies and Voluntary Organizations of the State

**Udaipur:** Rajasthan State Child Rights Protection Commission, is making efforts through video conferencing, social media and other means to prevent every child-related matter in the state

To ensure its accessibility, voluntary organizations and organizations working in the state can also join the Commission by giving information about any incident of violation of child rights related to their area. Various facilities for children in rural areas under lockdown by the state government Providing nutritional distribution at Anganwadis, free sanitary napkins to adolescent girls, those who roam from other states Assistance to laborers, etc. Voluntary organizations came forward to monitor the situation in all of these rural areas and also necessary cooperation. Sangeeta Beniwal, Chairman of Rajasthan State Child Rights Protection Commission, Government of Rajasthan, said, through video conferencing

In the video conferencing, Girl, not Bride, Rajasthan Secretary Arvind Ojha said that the orders had been issued by the state government. Still, it has come out in the survey of various organizations that in many places in the state, there is no nutritional distribution at Anganwadis. It is not there as per the rules due to a lack of complete ration material. The



Commission should take cognizance in this direction and take necessary action.

Child protection expert of UNICEF Rajasthan Sanjay Kumar Nirala suggested creating NGO network at district and block level in the state, in which the nodal NGO at district level should contact everyone and send information or any issue at state level.

Vijay Goyal of Jaipur, a joint platform for voluntary organizations, said that Today, this

video conferencing involved representatives of a total of 46 NGOs including UNICEF, Save the Children, Child Line Foundation, World Vision, Plan India, Cry, Many institutions including Action Aid, Urmul Trust, Gayatri Seva Sansthan, Jan Chetna participated.

At the end of the video conferencing, Dr. Vijendra Singh Siddu, Member of Rajasthan Children Commission, Government of Rajasthan, threw light on the work being done by the Commission on all the suggestions received and said that the next video conferencing will be held on May 18. At 1 o'clock, progress will be reviewed by connecting various departmental officers together.

## 25 thousand masks, sanitizer to 9 thousand families, ration distribution to 2500
