

PHDCCI Session with Top industry stalwarts share business survival strategies

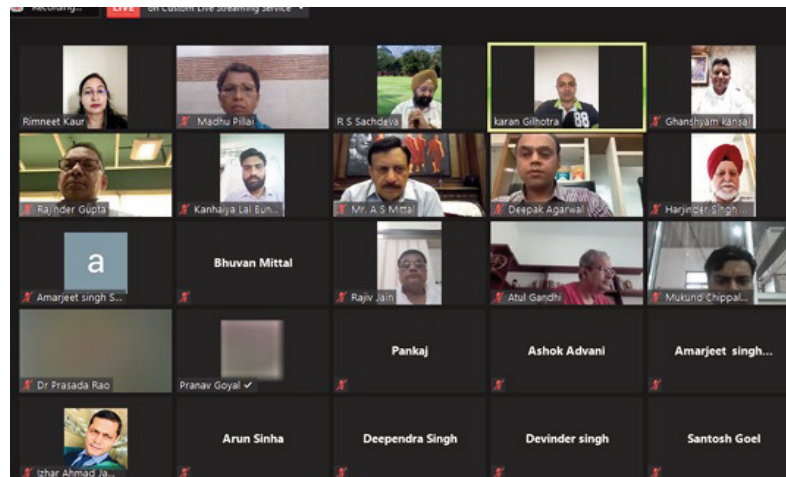
New Delhi: Covid-19 has disrupted normal life all over the world and as we emerge from lockdown, it is clear that the challenges brought by the pandemic are here to stay.

46.3% of people are unable to sleep in Covid-19

Udaipur: Research on the subject 'Impact on the mentality of employees/teachers at the time of lockdown due to COVID-19' done by Dr. Chandresh Kumar Chhatlani, Assistant prof. Of JRNUT under the direction of Sarangdevot VC

As per findings, 81.9% of the people feel that lockdown was the right step of the government. As per research findings, 54.6% believe that lockdown and work at home should be increased further. 46.3% of people are unable

to sleep due to COVID-19. The next time, it may increase insomnia. Research work also revealed that while 22.9% of individuals had increased anger, 14.3% had an increase in fear. Family relationships of 36.8% of the individuals were significantly strengthened. Personal creativity increased to no small extent by 21.2%, but there was also a decrease in the performance of their office for 22.7%.

The main objective of this research was to find out how the mindset and work capaci-

ty of the employees and teachers of various institutions of the country changed during the lockdown, how much the fear of Corona was affected and what are their views after the lockdown? Most individuals worked for 1-3 hours during the lockdown, considering physical distancing as the most important factor in preventing Corona, and did not have much difficulty working at home. During this time, most of the people spent the most money on purchasing fruits, vegetables, ration, and materi-

als for sanitation. After the lockdown opened, most people showed the most interest in purchasing items such as sanitizers and masks and online education and yoga in services. 52.5% are in favor of keeping their food vegetarian.

Now the family will be imprisoned

Udaipur: The detained women detainees in the jail will nurture the family by macerating and packing incense sticks in the prison. Female prisoners will get a share of daily wages and benefits in prison.

A new initiative of District Legal Services Authority Udaipur started incense making and packing work in women's jail. The detained women in prison will take care of the family from jail.

Mr. P. Soni. Under the direction of President, District Legal Services Authority, Udaipur, making incense sticks and packing will be started by women prisoners in the Women's Prison of Udaipur, Central Jail. Necessary preparations have been made for this.

Smt. Riddhima Sharma, Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, Udaipur, informed that during the jail inspection, the women prisoners had requested

to remove their family financial constraints. Due to their demise, his family became unemployed and appealed for help.

It was decided by the District Legal Services Authority to start the work of incense sticking and pecking in the women's jail after talking to the proprietors of M. Squire Foundation, Mukesh Madhwani, and Archana Agarbatti to employ the detained women, prisoners. In the coming week, packing incense sticks will be started in the women's prison. Women inmates will also be given a share in the benefits of daily survival in addition to making incense sticks and packing, which will provide financial support to their families. And with the employment of women in jail, the detained women will be able to take care of their families from prison. Products made by women prisoners will be sold with the brand name of Jail incense sticks.

CMHO informed that this vehicle would be publicized from June 23 to July 22 for public awareness about Corona in urban areas and all the district blocks.

During this time, people will be shown awareness films on LED screens, and the public will be made aware of the Corona through pamphlets and other IEC materials. Additional Chief Medical and Health Dr. Ragini Aggarwal, DPM Dr. GS Rao, etc. were present on occasion.

3600 tests a one day of COVID-19

Facility to start soon on geenal sonography and clinical lab, the report will be available in 27 minutes

Udaipur: Confusion of being positive and negative about the COVID-19 epidemic will now be able to get rid of ordinary people. In just 27 minutes, you will know whether you have been infected with this virus in the last 1 to 3 weeks. Actually, the biggest question in the coronavirus is that even after taking samples of common people, it takes time to report them, due to which they have to face a lot of problems, but now established in Geenal Sonography and Clinical Lab of Udaipur In just 27 minutes, through the iFlash-1800 machine imported from Japan, you will be reported to be Corona positive or negative.

Dr. Jitendra Singh, Director, Geenal, said that this machine tests the covid-19 IGG antibody, which tests 3600 in 24 hours and 180 in 1 hour.

This machine is ICMR approved, and its activity is 98%. The special thing is that this machine is used for screening and survey by serum, which indicates whether a person has undergone infection between 1 to 3 weeks in the past. Such individuals will be easily identified when the disease is detected so that the infected person can be kept away from other people by RTPCR method to determine the final diagnostic.

Realizing an investigation will be a plant mission - Dr. Singh informed that with every test of COVID-19, a plant would also be planted.

For which Geenal has taken three garden pits in the city. The objective behind this mission is that the common people should also be aware of the environment, and a clean environment can protect us even in other diseases like COVID-19.

Dr. Singh informed that a letter has also been sent to the Director of Public Health through the Chief Medical and Health Officer Dinesh Kharadi for screening and ends survey of the CLIA method of COVID-19 from this machine. This test facility will also be available to the elderly, Divyang, under CSR by Geenal at concessional rates.
