Railway transports 92 lakh tonne commodities during two months of lockdown through its Annapurna, Amba & Antodaya goods trains

s the lockdown came into effect in India due to the corona virus pandemic, all passenger train operations were stalled from midnight of 22nd March 20. Focus now shifted to the Goods trains to maintain a steady supply of commodities which primarily included food grains to feed 80 crore PDS beneficiaries in the country, sugar, fertilizers, cement, petroleum products, small and large containers and medical supplies.

Sh. Rajiv Chaudhry, General Manager Northern & North Central Railways shared the information that the Northern Railway has been running 5000 Tonne Jumbo trains from its various freight loading terminals spread across the states of Punjab and Haryana. This is to maintain a steady supply chain to feed 80 crore NFSA beneficiaries through continuous evacuation of mainly food grains and sugar from the northern states to different regions of the country.

A total of 188 long haul 5000 Tonne Jumbo "Annapurna" trains have been dispatched to 13 states from 1st April to 8th June 2020, with highest number to Karnataka-45.5, Bihar-38.5 and Maharashtra-34. "Antodaya" Trains are Time tabled goods trains for carrying food grain. 17 such trains were run by Northern Railway during the 70 day period. Also a new closed circuit



"Amba". 11 such close circuit jumbo, covered wagon rake formations were dispatched to different destinations during the period. Closed circuits ensure timely availability of rakes for

loading and the periodic repair/overhauling schedules of the wagons is easily maintained.

The heavy haulage capacity Jumbo trains, Annapurna and Antodaya are formed by combining two full traditional rakes of the goods trains. These trains are normally hauled by Electric Locomotives, one each for both formations.

The advantage of these serpentine trains is that a large quantity of goods can be moved at the same time, haulage

charges due to the use of electric locomotives are much cheaper and less harmful to the environment. The deployment of crew is also less in this case.

In spite of the stiff challenges faced by the loading depots due to the lockdown in terms of availability of wagons, timely dispatch of food grain rakes, railway staff on duty and labour for loading and unloading, NR could load a record number of rakes on several days.

During the period 51 rakes were loaded on 9th April, 53 on 17th April and 54 on 22nd April 2020. The total loading of commodities over NR during the 70 day period is 94 lakh tonnes. The total earning from freight during the time period has been 1418.5 Crore. This is an improvement of almost 14 percent as compared to the same period of last year

The General Manager also added that Indian Railways, the largest passenger transportation in the country has been an active participant in the country's fight against the coronavirus. Special long distance goods and time tabled Parcel Cargo express trains will continue to run from different regions of the North India to maintain the supply of food grains, items of daily use, essential medicines and equipment all across India reaching out to the most remote places.

India need to be the hub with **Developed Future Technology** and Innovations

He stated that there is huge scope in Indian domestic market and current pandemic situation and environment is compelling us to opt 'Vocal for Local'. Dr. Data appreciated the initiatives of Indian government to support local industries and shared an example of where the Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeitY) launched innovation challenges for developing video conferencing platform.

Mr. Kunal Singhal, Co-Chairman, Electronics &ICT Committee, PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry mentioned that Indian companies are doing R&D and production for global companies who are selling back the same products to Indian markets so an enabling ecosystem is required to manufacture products in India. He appreciated initiative and coordination of government of India, where they have invited Indian industries and completing their fast track registration. He urged PHDCCI to participate in R&D of newly registered companies and to share their valuable inputs and suggestions.

Mr. Saurabh Sanyal, Secretary General, PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry gave concluding remarks said that manufacturing of semiconductors, chips, PCBs etc need a boost. He mentioned that the government is very active and handholding Indian industries for their growth and development. Recovery rate is 60.81%, More than 95 lakh samples tested

The number of the recovered COVID-19 cases continues to increase steadily. As a result of the coordinated action taken by Government of India along with States/UTs for prevention, containment and management of COVID-19, there are 1,58,793 recovered cases more than the active COVID-19 cases, as on date. As a result of this, the recovery rate has further increased to 60.81%.

During the last 24 hours, a total of 14,335 COVID-19 patients have been cured, taking the cumulative figure to 3,94,226.

Presently, there are 2,35,433 active cases and all are under medical supervision. The efforts to expand the testing labs network in the country have led to their numbers

increasing very day. There are as many as 1087 labs in the country, including 780 labs in the government sector and 307 private labs. These include:

- Real-Time RT PCR based testing labs: 584 (Govt: 366 + Private: 218)
- TrueNat based testing labs: 412 (Govt: 381 + Private: 31)
- CBNAAT based testing labs: 91 (Govt: 33 + Private: 58)

Several people-centered measures taken as part of the "Test, Trace, Treat" strategy have removed the impediments for COVID-19 testing. Facilitation of widespread testing by States/UTs has spurred the number of samples tested every day. During the last 24 hours 2,42,383 samples have been tested, pushing the cumulative number of tests to 95,40,132.

Government of India removes Impediments in COVID-19 Testing

New Delhi: With the aim to remove all impediments in testing, Ms. Preeti Sudan, Health Secretary and Dr Balram Bhargava, DG (ICMR) today urged the States/UTs to take immediate steps to facilitate and ramp up testing. They have reiterated that 'test-track-treat' is the key strategy for early detection and containment of the pandemic.

Pointing out that in some States/ UTs, the capacity utilization of the testing labs, particularly the ones in private sector, is grossly sub-optimal, States/UTs have been strongly advised to take all possible steps to ensure full capacity utilization of all COVID-19 testing laboratories in the State/UT. States/UTs have been advised to facilitate testing at the earliest by enabling all qualified medical practitioners, including private practitioners, to prescribe COVID test to any individual fulfilling the criteria for testing as per ICMR guidelines.

ICMR has strongly recommended that laboratories should be free to test any individual in accordance to the ICMR Guidelines and State authorities must not restrict an individual from getting tested, as early testing will help in containing the virus and saving lives. While RT-PCR is the gold standard for diagnosis of COVID-19, ICMR has recently approved the use of a point-of-care Rapid Antigen Test for early detection of COVID-19. The test is quick, simple, safe and can be used as a point-of-care test in containment zones as well as hospitals, as per criteria specified by ICMR for testing. More such kits are being validated by ICMR to increase the available options to the citizens. ICMR has so far approved a total of 1,056 laboratories for COVID-19 testing. Of this, 764 labs are in public sector and 292 are in the private sector. In order to facilitate testing, States/UTs have also been advised to make efforts in 'campaign mode' by setting up camps/ using mobiles vans in high incidence areas to collect samples of all symptomatic individuals as well as their contacts, and get those samples tested by using rapid antigen tests. The positive individuals should be treated according to the treatment protocol and the negative ones should be tested for RT-PCR. Also, the rate for RT-PCR test by private labs should be finalized by the States/UTs. They have been further advised to make it mandatory for all labs to upload the testing data on the ICMR database as well as report to State/ District/ City authorities for surveillance and contact tracing.

In addition to ramping up and facilitating testing, States/UTs have also been urged to pay attention to 'contact tracing' as it holds the key to containing the virus. States have also been asked to maintain strict vigil and continue to make all possible efforts for effective manage-

Feed Hundreds of Stray Dogs in Delhi

New Delhi: International animal welfare organisation, World Animal Protection and Veterinary Services Department, North Delhi Municipal Corporation (NDMC) have launched a special initiative to feed stray dogs during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

Till now 425 dogs have been fed in Timarpur, GTB Nagar, North Campus, Burari, Jharoda and containment zone of Adarsh Nagar. Stray dogs are facing hunger and thirst. Even though India is slowly lifting its lockdown rules, we are far from living our normal lives. The COVID-19 crisis has also affected animals, but they cannot voice their plight. Stray dogs belong to no one, but to everyone. It is our responsibility to provide sustenance in order to help them survive this crisis. Since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic and the nationwide lockdown that followed, World Animal Protection has been working to ensure that stray animals are not forgotten. Gajender K Sharma, Country Director, World Animal Protection, India said, "It is now over three months since the lockdown was announced by the Government of India.

Now the country is slowly opening up, but the effects of the lockdown can evident every day. That means, it is now over three months of irregular or no food for stray dogs in our cities and localities, as they dependant on people stepping outside and feeding them.
