### ASHAs in Rajasthan: Selfless commitment to people in the long fight against COVID-19

In Rajasthan, the COVID-19 pandemic coincided with the harvest season, MostASHAs. are also expected by their families in supporting harvesting activities. This year though, the intensive involvement of the ASHAs in the pandemic prevented most of them from doing so, leading to considerable resentment and resistance from their families. This was no different for Gogi Devi. but she continued with tenacity to serve as an ASHA and fulfil her role as social mobilizer, community level care provider and link worker for the

health facility.

Her efforts were rewarded when the Pradhan of the Gram Panchayat publicly applauded her role in COVID related measures for prevention and containment. This changed her family's perspective towards her work, who started appreciating her commitment towards her work. For Gogi Devi, her community's acknowledgment and recognition of her work are strong motivation to sustain her to carry on tirelessly.

The work of ASHAs as integral pillars of COVID-19



response started immediately after the first case was diagnosed in early March this year

On March 8, all 9876 Gram Panchayats of Rajasthan organised a special Gram

Sabha, in which ASHAs took the lead in explaining COVID-19 modes of transmission. precautions and control measures. since they had all been trained in preparation for this

public activity. This strategic initial effort was the key in securing the support of the Gram Panchayat representatives in ensuring prevention and control measures in their jurisdiction and also in supporting ASHAs and other frontline workers to undertake their tasks without any hin-

The contribution of the ASHAs, in collaboration with the state's Auxiliary Nurse Midwives (ANMs), enabled reaching out to nearly 39 cr people in eight crore households for active surveillance and information dissemination. In the midst of all this and while being vigilant about anyone with symptoms, ASHAs also continued to provide care for pregnant women, newborns and children. They also

mobilized transport to health facilities in cases when ambulances were not available

Various ASHAs like Gogi Devi have played a critical role in spreading awareness about the symptoms and precautions against COVID-19. This has helped immensely in containment of the disease.

They used the community trust and knowledge of the local social factors to build confidence among the people to support government efforts in containment and management of COVID-19.

#### **Endure Pitha (rice cake in** turmeric leaves)

For the outer cover

Skinless split black gram: 200 g (Soaked overnight) Rice (raw): 200 g (Soaked overnight)

- For the inner stuffing
- 1 cup grated coconut
- Chena or Cottage cheese :1/2 cup

Turmeric leaves to be used as mould.

Procedure:

**Pre-Cooking Preparation** Make smooth paste of soaked black gram and rice separately. Add salt to the black gram batter and beat it through

hand. Now mix the rice and black gram batter. Make the bat-



Put a heavy bottomed pan in the gas and add jaggery to it. When the jaggery starts frothing, add grated coconut and chenna into it. Lower the flame and mix it thoroughly with a spatula. Switch off the flame &let it cool. Add 1 tsp of cardamom pow-

replace jaggery with sugar. Take the turmeric leaves and rinse them in water. Cut the base stalk of the leaves. Now from the middle, slice the leaf into two parts without breaking it. Press the middle vein while doing so.

Preparing the pithas

Now, put a scoop of batter in the leaf and evenly spread it. Put some stuffing in the middle of the leaf. Now gently fold the leaf horizontally and press the edges to seal it. It was a very cumbersome and tedious to do. With invention of modern day steamers, the steaming technique has become very simple. Arrange the rolled leaves in the steamer in such a way that they don't overlap. Cover the lid in a way that the vapors don't escape. It will take approximately 15-20 mins to get the steamed pithas.

**Chef Satish Comments** Don't overcook. It makes the pitha hard and dry.

#### Jaggery :100g Cardamom powder: 1 tsp salt to taste



#### Child and mother's life saved by emergency delivery in 6 months' pregnancy

Udaipur: Doctors in the have saved the life of the infant and the mother by high-risk birth in Paras JK hospital of the city. 6 months pregnant, Mrs. Munira, a resident of Salumbar, suddenly received a labor pain in the night. Female and obstetrician Dr. Sheetal Kaushik was shown at the hospital where she decided to have her delivered immediately after the deci-

Dr. Kaushik told me that the woman was brought to the hospital at 2 pm. The woman was getting too much pain. This led to an emergency cesarean delivery, anticipating further risks. The delivery was only six months. Due to this, the child's weight was only 800 grams, which was much less than a healthy child.

For this reason, the child was placed in the hospital nursery under Dr. Rajkumar Vishnoi. Dr. Rajkumar Neonatologist told that due to the less weight of the child, it was shifted in ICU. The child's lungs were not fully developed due to delivery at six months. He was having trouble breathing. At this time, he could not even drink the mother's milk. Her bowels were so weak, and she could not also digest mother's milk.

For this reason, he was given an artificial diet TPN by tube. After 3 to 4 days, he was sometimes given breast milk by the tube. After getting success in all these works, slowly, he started getting it done directly. Also, the mother got ICU. & also gave Kangaro care therapy to do all these tasks. The child was kept on a ventilator for about 15 days. During this time, the weight of the child increased, and he started to feed himself. During the two months of hospitalization, her weight became 2 kg. The mother and child were then discharged. The child is perfectly healthy.
