

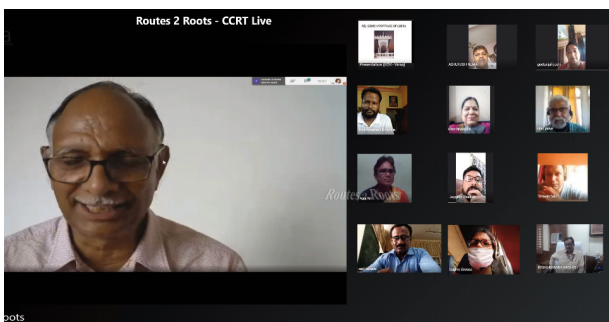
CCRT Workshop on “Introducing Cultural Inputs in Curriculum Teaching” clubbed with “Sankalp Parv”

The Udaipur Regional Centre, under the guidance of CCRT, New Delhi, successfully conducted an online workshop on “Introducing Cultural Inputs in Curriculum Teaching” from 6 to 10 July 2020.

Mrinal was educated and independent so she never accepted his anger. Ravi blamed her that she had no patience and understanding nature.

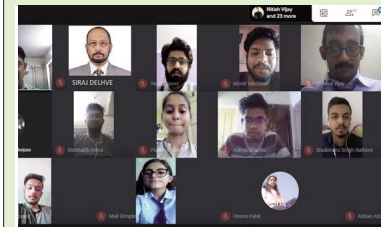
Mrinal did not believe him otherwise she would have committed suicide.

Mr Bhatt has recently shifted from the post of Bhilwara Collector. On this occasion, OP Jain, Additional Commissioner of Devasthan Department was present.

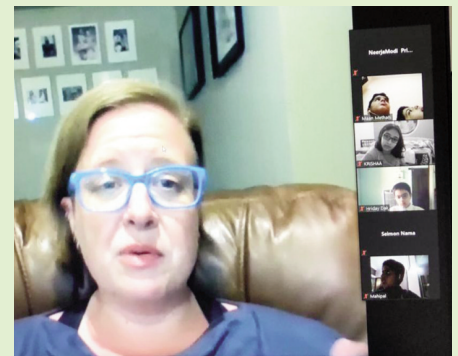


Lessons from Abroad:
