

## GMCH: PATIENT UNDERWENT COMPLEX G.I. SURGERY

**Udaipur:** In GMCH Udaipur, even during the corona epidemic. Surgeon Dr. Kamal Kishore Bishnoi from Gastro Surgery Department, Dr. Pankaj Gupta and Dr. Dhawal Vyas Gastrologist along with Dr. Ankit Agarwal from Cancer Medical Department & Anesthetist Dr. Karuna Sharma, in an association of Incharge Hemant Garg and ICU Incharge Dr. Sanjay Paliwal untiring a 28-year-old patient of Rajsamand, was given a new life by getting rid of the tumor.

### What was the issue?

28-year-old Rajsamand resident, Kripa Singh (name changed) said that for the last ten months, there were many stomach problems, the stomach was not clear, and there were complaints of constipation, there was a lot of difficulty in working. In December 2019, due to blockage and swelling in the intestines, he came at Geetanjali Hospital. CT of the patient

on coming here Scanned, it confirmed a stage-4 tumor in the rectum.

The tumor had reached the liver through the rectum. Dr. Kamal told that when the patient is treated with such a stage 4 tumor, it is necessary first to have a colostomy of the patient so that he can eat normally and pass the stool in the bag made by the colostomy. After this, the patient's chemotherapy is started.

After the patient underwent colonoscopy, the tumor was biopsied, in which a very complex tumor was detected. Generally, chemotherapy is given to such patients to reduce the size of cancer and reduce the liver's lump.

However, an examination of a pat CT scan of this patient found that the tumor size did not decrease because the tumor Did not see a response. Surgery was the only option when the patient was not affected by chemothera-

py. Now the first challenge was to remove the tumor, which was in the rectum (anus) of the patient by operation and also remove the tumor present in the liver. In such a situation, the doctors made a plan to remove both tumors by surgery simultaneously. Still, the patient's medicine was when started, during the operation, it was found that the patient's small intestine was also sticking with the tumor, due to which the patient had to cut the peak intestine. The patient's rectum, liver, and small intestine all three had to be cut off due to the tumor, and the biggest fear was the liver's failure after the operation of the patient.

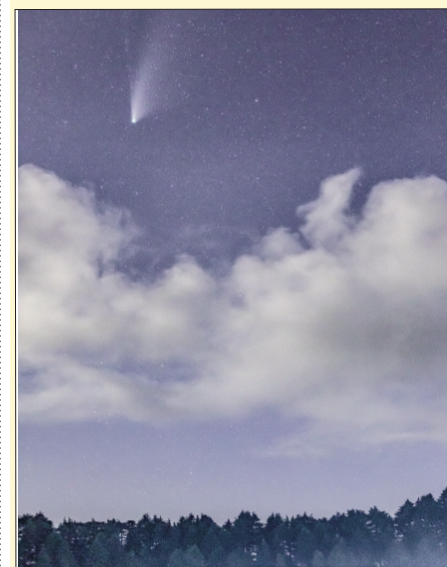
The size of the tumor in the patient's pat and CT scan was found to be quite large during the service, which was very surprising. The cancer was very carefully removed from the patient's rectum, liver, and small intestine, and the patient was made tumor-free. The second

cycle of chemotherapy of the patient was also completed due to the possibility that the patient's tumors were unlikely to recur. The patient is now healthy, discharged from the Hospital. Dr. Kamal said that usually stage-4 cancer surgery is not done, but if there is liver metastasis, there is a possibility of treatment by an operation. Then, whether stage-4 tumors are in the liver or lungs, those patients can also be saved.

Significantly, the patient is the beneficiary of the Ayushman Bharat-Mahatma Gandhi Rajasthan Health Insurance Scheme.

## Comet NEOWISE, Officially C/2020 F3 Comes in Focus from India



Dr. Amit Vakil, an accoladed adventure photo storyteller of India, succeeded to capture this once in a lifetime sight of Comet NEO-WISE in his home town Chamba, Himachal Pradesh, India in the month of July, 2020, as it came nearest to our planet visible in night

sky from parts of Northern Hemisphere. Probably, no one on Earth can see it once again since this comet takes 6800 years to complete one round of its huge elliptical trajectory traversing Solar System. Even for this habitually pursuing photographer, it was not a single night's attempt and Amit had to wait in the hills of Khajjiar to finally see it appear up in the horizon over woods. Fortunately, that was clear night and he froze this spectacular moment in his camera at 8:24 pm. He was able to see the comet by eyes without any accessories for viewing celestial objects. In March 27, 2020, NASA's Near-Earth Object Wide-Field Infrared Survey Explorer (NEOWISE) probe first found existence of this 5 km wide comet, brightest as recorded in 20 years.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has directed universities and colleges across the country to create awareness about the new National Education Policy (NEP) amongst teachers, students, officials and other stakeholders in the higher education system.

The universities and colleges have been asked to share the activities in this regard on the university activity monitoring portal maintained by UGC. "There is need to create awareness about NEP amongst teachers, students, officials and other stakeholders in the higher education system. In this regard, you are requested to conduct webinars and related online activities to discuss various policy highlights and implications of the policy with various stakeholders," UGC Secretary Rajnish Jain said in a letter to Vice Chancellors.

The NEP approved by the Union Cabinet at a meeting presided by Prime Minister Narendra Modi replaces the 34-year-old National Policy on Education framed in 1986 and is aimed at paving the way for transformational reforms in school and higher education systems to make India a global knowledge superpower. Choice between 3 or 4 year undergraduate courses, multiple entry and exit options in degree courses, adding 3.5 crore seats in higher education institutions which will now have a single regulator, discontinuation of MPhil programmes and fixation of fees are among the higher education reforms outlined in the new NEP. The policy has proposed setting up of a 'single overarching umbrella body for the entire higher education'. The Higher Education Commission of India (HECI) will have distinct and independent bodies which will each assume separate functions of accreditation, funding, and academic standard setting. These bodies will replace autonomous bodies like University Grants Commission (UGC), All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) and National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC).
