

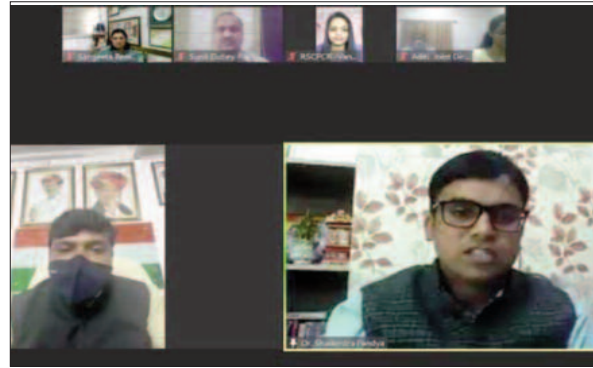


# Government and N.G.O'S will have to make efforts together - Julie

**Udaipur:** The Government is making Rajasthan's every effort to ensure child labor, trafficking, and child abuse free Rajasthan. Vandana Vyas, member of Rajasthan Children's Commission in e-Bal Sabha, while giving information about the garden of nutrition, appealed to voluntary organizations to come forward for a malnutrition-free society. As a subject specialist in the program, Professor Dr. Mahavir Jain, Viren Lobo, IIFL Foundation Director Madhu Jain, also spoke on the idea. Giving information, Aditi Upadhyay, Joint Director, Gayatri Seva Sansthan said that "Children's Rights Week" is celebrated by the institute every year from November 14 (Children's Day) to November 20 (International Child Rights Day). ## Maharana Mewar Special Library celebrated 'National Library Week'

**Udaipur:** National Library Week was celebrated by Maharana Mewar Charitable Foundation, Udaipur, from November 14 to 20, 2020, under National Library Week. This week was announced by the Indian Library Association in 1949. The Foundation organized various seven-day programs on occasion. On the occasion of National Library Week, Chief Administrative Officer of Maharana Mewar Charitable Foundation, Bhupendra Singh Auva, said that Maharajas of Mewar used to have private libraries princely period. The Chairman and Managing Trustee of the Foundation, Shriji Arvind Singh Mewar, of the Foundation for the collection of books on the same historical, cultural, religious, art, etc., established the Maharana Mewar Special Library on April 7, 2000, and made arrangements for researchers, students and the curious, etc. Presently, more than thirty-five thousand valuable books are placed in the Maharana Mewar Special Library. Maharana Kumbha of Mewar (AD 1433-68) had established a library called 'Vani Vilas' in Kumbhalgarh, which housed books, manuscripts, etc., on subjects like music, architecture, religion, etc. Maharana Kumbha, Maharana Raj Singh (AD 1652-1680), and Maharana Sajjan Singh (AD 1874-84) were also great collectors of book manuscripts. Maharana Raj Singh Ji got Ramayana, Mahabharata, Purana, etc., translated. Maharana Sajjan Singh established an institutional library named 'Sajjan Vani Vilas' at the City Palace on February 11, 1875 AD. Books for hundreds of Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu, Arabic, Persian, and English languages were made available to Maharana's library. Maharana Fateh Singh (AD 1885-1930) established the Saraswati Bhandar Library at Sajjan Niwas Garden (Gulab Bagh), Udaipur. In which there were 6210 rare books on history and other subjects. Maharana Bhupal Singh established a private library of his own at the Khush Mahal of the City Palace. Maharana Bhagwat Singh Mewar also had a personal collection of books. Later he established the Shri Mewar Shiv Shakti Peeth Library for the general public in 1949, which had 4,664 books. The chairman and management trustee of the Foundation, Arvind Singh Mewar, established this Maharana Mewar Special Library, keeping his forefathers' tradition and cherished this ocean of knowledge. More than thirty-five thousand four hundred books are currently stored, in which the history of country and world, geography, and history of Mewar dynasty and art and architecture books are stored. All these books are listed in the library software, and their digital catalog is available on the website of Eternal Mewar.

## Spine surgery provided relief to the patient

**Udaipur:** A Patient troubled by back pain and sciatica problem for the last several months, gets relieved the pain by performing successful spine surgery by Paras JK Hospital Udaipur doctors.
