Anuvrat : Rising Sun of New India

Taking a difficult effort to build national character, this mission touched every problem of the nation and reached various forums of international level. An honourable recognition was given to the Anuvrat movement. Everyone from the common man to the top accepted its need. The promoter of Anuvrat, Acharya Shri Tulsi and later his disciple Acharya Shri Mahapragya and the present Acharya Shri Mahashraman made many padyatras of the entire nation and neighbouring countries and undertook meaningful and effective ventures to become human beings from footwear to the highest forums of the nation. Some believe in walking slowly and with strong steps, some believe in walking very fast so that you can see the end of progress in your life. But no one accepts the stay.

Stagnation or delay in development is indirect death. Whoever stopped, whoever left awareness, whoever left the truth, was marginalized. Today's development, whether it belongs to one person, whether it belongs to a society, whether it belongs to a nation, is also connected to others in such a way that if a wrong decision is taken by the first party then the crisis is without any fault. Therefore today's development gives the message that everyone should develop. From the first to the last. This is what Gandhi and Vinoba called 'Sarvodaya', Mahavir called it 'Sarvopagraho Jeevanam' and this is what Acharya Tulsi called 'rule over discipline again'.

In the terrible expansion of corruption, the establishment of morality is more important. The Anuvrat movement has always been a medium for raising this voice and establishing moral values. This movement has become a strong advocate of morality. Many times the stagnation came, many times the pace came, but it did not stop. This movement has been dynamic in many forms. Now Anuvrat Vishwa Bharati and its president Mr. Sankesh Jain have inherited a legacy which is a lamp itself and which they are ready to fill with more oil by burning it. This is the joy of life, it is the process of life, and otherwise life is not life. But there is a tradition of destiny that they do not accept it forever. But it does not allow it to become permanent. Begins to break down and become. New ideas grow. New systems are born and new styles, new expectations are born. Moral efforts are to be kept lit in the midst of these troubles. We will keep those little lamps in dark paths so that people do not forget "light".

"Time Bank" A New Concept, Despite Money, Time Will Deposit

Kota: Time Bank is a new concept in which, despite the money, time Deposit for the service of more senior age people as and when they required. The time of service one give will deposit in his account at the time when needed him. This marvelous concept is followed by "Time Bank of India Trust." As a chief member of Trust, P. C. Jain said it was felt that TimeBank needs society and is the right time to start before India is called the country of the more aged population. Traditionally, Indian culture has believed in a joint family system, which offers so many advantages like safety, security, care, belongingness, etc. to the family members. However, there is a significant shift from joint family to the nuclear family system in the era of present globalization. He told me the Younger generation is moving away to earn their livelihood leaving behind the elderly members of the family alone without any support. It is also observed that in the joint family, elders feel lonely as the young generations are too busy with their day-to-day activities and cannot spend some time with seniors.

Pandemic Covid-19 taught us many lessons. One of them is fear and depression while living alone. During the initial period of Covid-19, patients were kept in complete isolation at hospitals. Even many healthy persons stuck up in isolation away from family during the complete lockdown. Many of them were under deep depression despite the availability of connectivity with family through mobiles. Some even committed suicide. He told On search from the net; we could not find any organized TimeBank in our country though little effort is seen in unorganized sector where some small groups of people found helping each other.

We then attended meetings of senior citizens and retired persons, explained the TimeBank concept and sought their view, and discussed probable bottlenecks, security aspects, etc. The idea was well-received, which motivated us to start it.

Ultimately, as a first step, we have registered the domain name for the website and created our Email id on 7 July 2018. The next six months spent in its modalities, website designing, finding like-minded people, making a Trust and other formalities, etc. Finally, on 27 December 2018, the TimeBank, in the name of TimeBank of India Trust, was born with a trust deed's notarization. Immediately an application moved for its registration under Trust Act. The trust was also got registered on 25 April 2019.

Trust thankfully acknowledge the motivation of Mrs. Bhavna Jagwani, convener of the Mohan Foundation Jaipur Citizen Forum, and Mr. Thakurdas Bhaishahab for his timely help. About 450 members are under this roof.

Changed both knees to straight-en woman's crooked legs

Udaipur: A 71-year-old woman underwent a knee replacement operation at GBH General Hospital. Thus, the woman could not even walk for the last four years, and her legs got crooked. Group Director Dr. Anand Jha said that the family members of Gopibai (71) brought her to the GBH General Hospital, where orthopedic and joint replacement surgeon Dr. Suryakant found that Both the legs of the woman were twisted. She could barely walk eight-ten steps for the last four years. She had severe pain in his legs.

Being older was quite a risk, but X-rays and investigations showed that the knee of both the woman's legs was damaged entirely, due to which both her legs were crooked. Dr. Suryakant Purohit, Dr. Saurabh Agarwal, and Dr. Piyush Garg of the anesthesia department, after performing all the investigations, decided to change the knee. Dr. According to Suryakant Purohit, both the knees of the woman were replaced at once, and the next day she was driven with full weight with the help of a walker. Immediately after the operation, the crooked legs also straightened and began to gain weight.
