

'Amrit Mahotsav of Independence' to be celebrated for 75 weeks



Udaipur: 'Amrit Mahotsav of Independence' will be celebrated from March 12 2021 to August 15, 2023, to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of the Father of the

Nation and 75th Independence Day as directed by the State Government. A meeting was held in the District Collectorate Auditorium on Tuesday under District Collector Chetan

Deora's chairmanship to decide its necessary preparation and design.

In the meeting, Pankaj Sharma, District Convenor of Mahatma Gandhi Jeevan Darshan Samiti nominated by the state government, proposed taking out the Dandi March in the city on March 12 given the Corona Protocol. Seventy-eight pilgrims will participate in this event dedicated to the historic Dandi Yatra of Mahatma Gandhi. On March 12, 1930, Gandhiji took out the Dandi March from the Sabarmati Ashram along with

78 persons protesting against the Namak ka kanoon.

Dandi March will come out of Gulababagh.

On March 12, the Dandi March from Gulababagh to the Municipal Corporation Office, it will begin with the Amrit Mahotsav of Independence's commencement in the district. Awreath and Ramdhan will be held at Gandhiji's statue at Gulababagh at 7 am. Collector Deora has instructed us to follow the Corona Protocol during the program.

District Collector Chetan Deora said that special programs will be organized from March 12, 2021, to August 15, 2023, to make the youth aware of Mahatma Gandhi's ideals and the struggle for independence.
