Organized a webinar on "Contemporary issues related to Accounting, Taxation, Auditing"

Udaipur: A webinar on "Contemporary Issues relating to Accounting, Taxation, Auditing" was organized on 2 July 2021 under the aegis of the Department of Accounting and Occupational Statistics, Mohanlal Sukhadia University, which was presided over by Professor PK Singh, Dean of the College of Commerce. And the chief guest was the President and Director of JK Paper Limited, C.A.A.S. Mehta.



Webinar Director and Head of the Department Prof. Shoorveer Singh Bhanawat gave the welcome address. Prof. Bhanawat said that during covid, companies made good profits but used the profits to buy back of shares and distribute dividends. Still, investment in companies is not increasing, which is a matter of deep concern.

The chief guest of the inaugural session was JK Paper President CA.A.S. Mehta suggested a solid draft to be free from accounting embezzlement and bankruptcy should put forward. On this occasion, the keynote speaker of the inaugural session from Xavier Institute of Management Studies, Bhubaneswar, Prof. D.V. Ramana, told about the new IND AS-114, Regulatory Assets, that these assets should also be treated at market value in the accounting books. Prof. Ramana said that the corporate sector should prepare two books of accounts, one at market value and the other at book value. Dr. Shilpa Lodha conducted the function, and Dr. Shilpa Vardia proposed the vote of thanks. Two sessions were organized after the inaugural session. A total of 20 research papers were read in the first technical session. The keynote speaker of the first technical session, Prof. Paritosh Chandra Basu, Senior Professor, Narsee Monjee Institute of Management, Bombay, explained the various dimensions of BlockChain Accounting; he said that by adopting this accounting method, the credibility and relevance of financial reports could be increased. Prof. G Soral chaired the first technical session. He expressed his views about the changing role of auditors. A total of 21 research papers were read in the second technical session. The speaker in the second technical session was Prof. G Simon Theitil of Kerala University said that accounting is an area to consider qualitative aspects far beyond calculations, and the technical session was presided over by Prof. Jinendra Kumar Jain of Dr. Harisingh Gour University. Prof. Jain threw light on various areas of research.

In the concluding session of the program, as the keynote speaker, Rajasthan State Higher Education Council Vice-Chairman Prof. D.S. Chundawat delivered the speech. Professor Chundawat said that this type of webinar brings new knowledge to the students and proves to be effective in increasing the role of research scholars in the research field.

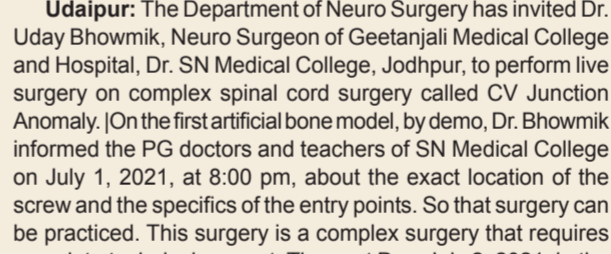
Badi Jheel should become the center of Mahaseer conservation

Udaipur: Badi Ka Talab is an essential environmental heritage. In this, it is necessary to stop fish contracts for the preservation and development of mahaseer fish. This demand was placed in the lake dialogue, held recently.

Dr. Anil Mehta, a lake expert, said that the ecosystem of Badi is similar to the Himalayan system. Scientists believe that if there is ever a crisis on the ecology of the Himalayas, then Badi Lake will prove to be a 'gene bank'. Mehta said that in such a situation, Badi would have to be declared as "Eco Sacred," an environmental holy lake, and all commercial activities will have to stop. It will have to be developed into a Mahaseer conservation unit.

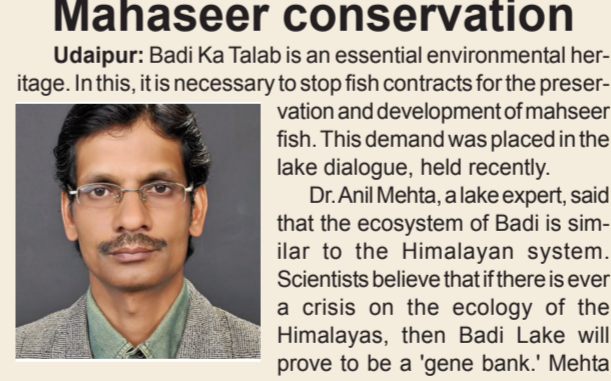
Tej Shankar Paliwal, the member of the Lake Development and Protection Committee, described the argument of the Department of Fisheries as ridiculous and impossible that the fish contractor would sort out the fish trapped in the net and release it again in the lake, first of all it cannot be monitored and often in the net. The fish die after being trapped. Paliwal said that the fisheries department would have to make mahaseer conservation a priority.

Nandkishore Sharma, director of Gandhi Manav Kalyan Samiti, said that the Rajasthan High Court had given directions for the conservation of Mahaseer in the Badi lake. Forest department officials are also making efforts to conserve Mahaseer in this. In such a situation, contracting fish for revenue of only a few lakh rupees will hurt all efforts of Mahaseer conservation.

'Chor ki dadhi': Congress leader Rahul Gandhi hits out at PM Modi over Rafale deal

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi took to social media on Sunday morning to hit out at Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the Rafale deal controversy. He posted an image with the caption 'Chor ki dadhi' (thief's beard).



The Rafale deal for 36 fighter jets worth 7.8 billion Euros was signed in 2016 between the Indian government and French aircraft manufacturer Dassault Aviation. On Saturday, the Congress party had demanded a joint parliamentary committee (JPC) probe into the deal after France initiated its judicial inquiry into the same in June.

The Congress has consistently accused the Modi government of signing the contract with France at a much higher price than negotiated during the UPA rule. The opposition party also alleged favouritism, claiming that Anil Ambani-owned Reliance Defence had been signed on as the offset partner by weapons manufacturer Dassault Aviation even though the company had no previous experience.

In response to Rahul Gandhi's social media post, BJP IT department in-charge Amit Malviya said on Twitter, "Rahul Gandhi, after having heaped choicest abuses in the run up to 2019, has now stooped down to this level. People across India have rejected him but he is most welcome to fight 2024 elections on this issue!"
