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Youth should get skill training as per the needs in the villages- Chief Minister

Jaipur, Chief Minister Shri Ashok Gehlot has said that in the years to come demand for plumbers, electricians and fitters will increase in rural areas. In view of this, Rajasthan Skill and Livelihood Development Corporation (RSLDC) should provide skills training to more and more rural youth in the courses like plumber, electrician or fitter etc. If required, additional training centres should be opened to impart training to youth.

Shri Gehlot was addressing the review meeting of RSLDC through video conference from his residence on 5th June. He said that targets should be fixed to provide employment opportunities to more and more youth and for this, better coordination should be established between various departments. Besides, he directed for time-bound implementation and adequate monitoring of the budget announcements.

The CM said that RSLDC should select the training partner firms after thorough investigation of available infrastructure and facilities needed for skill development. It should be ensured that the training partner provide placements to the trained youth as per the numbers prescribed in the conditions of MoU, he added.

Shri Gehlot praised the scheme initiated for eradication of begging by linking beggars to employment through various skill trainings. He said that in order to make the cities free from begging practices, this scheme should be scaled-up to all dis-



tricts of the state. This could be a game changer for eradicating this ill practice. The CM said that maximum publicity should be given to such schemes, so that other people involved in begging could be encouraged to gain suitable skills and employment.

The CM said that those persons who were previously engaged in begging and later get employment after skill training, should work as master trainers to bring in other beggars to the mainstream by imparting training to them. He directed the RSLDC and the Social Justice & Empowerment departments should work in coordination for training and rehabilitation beggars.

Chairman of RSLDC Shri Neeraj K. Pawan gave a detailed presentation on the schemes for skill development of youth and status of implementation of various budget announcements. He informed that 100 beggars have been trained and linked to employment of which 40 have been employed with Akshay Patra Sansthan. He said that 39,193 youth have been trained for four-month short duration courses of Plumbing, fitting and electrician under the Jal Jeevan Mission. RSLDC was preparing a list of different industries, industry associations, universities and sector skill councils to provide training to youth, he said.

Shri Pawan further said that several state-funded schemes had been reorganised and re-launched. Thousands of youth have been imparted skill development training under Raj Quick, Saksham and Samarth schemes.

Minister of State for Skill Development Shri Ashok Chandana, Chief Secretary Shri Niranjan Arya, RSLDC MD Shri Pradeep K. Gawande and other senior officers were present in the meeting.

Bhagwat's speech emphasizing national integrity

The rising of national unity brought into light the neo-liberalism of Rashtriya Swayam Sevak Sangh and Sangh chief Mohan Bhagwat. Releasing Dr. Khwaja Iftikhar Ahmed's book "Vaicharik Samanvay - Ek Pahal", Bhagwat removed the prejudices associated with the Sangh and said that the Sangh may be an organization of Hindus, but it does not hate the people of other religions. The objection and disagreement by various political parties regarding the statement that all Indians have one DNA is a major obstacle to national unity. There is diversity and unity and this is the ideal of Indian heritage and culture.

There are many religions, castes, tribes, provinces, political parties in our country and national unity cannot be disintegrated in the name sake of diversity. The speech of Mohan Bhagwat given in Mewar University will become a medium to emphasize the unity of the country; will give a new turn to the cultural and national environment of the country. This has been made like a compass which is always providing the right way in the right direction.

The people of different caste, religion, language and class are living together and this is the beauty of Indian democracy; damaging this beauty due to political selfishness ruins national unity. It is impossible to omit the differences and unite them all. In such unity the doors of development are also blocked. But diversity is also precious, which does not pose any kind of threat to our fundamental and national unity. Like many branches of a tree, a nation may have many provinces, people of many castes and religions can live in it, but their development lies in staying connected with the root of nationality. When we will give a practical approach to differentiation; on that day there will be a right culmination of national unity and on the same day India will become united.

Mohan Bhagwat said that if a Hindu says that no Muslim should live here, then that person is not a Hindu. Cow is a sacred animal but those who are killing others are going against Hinduism. The law should act against them without any bias. The word Hindu-Muslim unity itself is misleading. Hindu-Muslim are not only separate, they are always one. When people consider the two to be different, only then the crisis arises. Our faith is the same both in shape and formless. We love the motherland because it has nurtured every single person who lives here. There is a danger in the future in terms of population; it will have to be corrected.

If India has to be made a 'Vishwaguru', then it will not have to involve itself into the battle of words of minority-majority. It has been inculcated in the minds of minorities that Hindus will vanish them. Now the time has come for the Muslim society to remove the blindfold and embrace everyone. The Muslim society has to be leaving bigotry and adopt

the path of mutual brotherhood. This is the establishment of an ideal situation and the Sangh is working towards this.

Sangh works only for nationalism. Politics is not the work of volunteers. Sangh works to unite, while politics becomes a weapon to break. Hindu-Muslim could not be united only because of politics.

It is very sad that when

head of the world's largest non-political organization, is emphasizing on Hindu-Muslim unity, then some leaders are making extra efforts to ensure that our society does not pay attention to such things of solidarity-goodwill. From this effort it was revealed that some people are interested in the distance between Hindu-Muslim should not end. In this context, the Sangh chief rightly said that the talk of Hindu-Muslim unity is misleading in the sense that they are already united and it is not correct to see them as separate.

Welcoming this lawfully, such an effort should be made at our level that the Indian society is united and whatever animosity, whatever distances there are between them, it should end. Undoubtedly some people do not want this to happen and that is why some have mentioned the difference in the words and deeds of the Sangh and some have mentioned the violence of the mob.

It is ironic that cheap politics is being done in our country even on such simple and ideal discussion; an example of this is the objection and dissenting reaction to this inspiring and revolutionary speech of Bhagwat. From Mayawati and Asaduddin Owaisi to Digvijay Singh, the way they reacted showed the mentality of opposition to protest. None of them tried to understand that Mohan Bhagwat was trying to inculcate the feeling of unity, communal harmony and brotherhood among all the countrymen through this statement and underline that the people of India

had caste, religion, No matter how different the rituals are, they should remember that they are all children of this country and the ancestors of all are one.

There is nothing objectionable in the statement of Bhagwat. Despite this, objections were raised on one pretext or the other and an attempt was made to divert the discussion in a particular direction. Its purpose seems to be nothing more than to mislead people and to try to garner their vote bank. It seems that the politics and thinking of certain political parties are distorted, their behavior is false, they have put more masks on their faces, and they have dashed all the ideals and values. Millions of people of the country are worried about the future of the country. The time has come that in order to preserve the country's common culture, glorious heritage and the top leaders like Bhagwat will have to make efforts, a new standard will have to be set in front of directionless leadership.

Today there is no one who can show the greatness of religion. No one can live and tell a religion without sectarianism, no one can give solutions to the problem, no one can give alternatives. Who can become Kabir, Rahim, Tulsi, Meera, Raidas. This is the big question.

An auspicious beginning is also going to happen with this vision when under the leadership of Dr. Indresh Kumar, the top person of Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh and the guide of Muslim National Forum, from 15 August 2021 to 15 August 2022, to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the country's independence and during this time; there are plans to organize 500 events in association with organizations. Through this, efforts will be made to fulfill the goal of "Akhand Bharat". It will be explained to the people of Muslim society that our worship method may be different, but we are all one. This is the vision of a united India.

In the frenzy of communal and political selfishness, the maniac loses the sense of action and non-action. Bhagwat has a relative contemplation in this context. Individuals believe in the worship of their respective religions, there is no harm in it, but where people of one sect spread hatred against another sect, the soil of the country is tarnished, the nation is powerless and the mind of the individual becomes impure. The biggest threat to national unity is from those selfish nation leaders who think only of their own interests. They fill their homes in the name of service to the country, and try to divide the people in the name of religion, sect, class etc.

India, which teaches "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" to the whole world, is today becoming humiliated by being cut off from its loved ones because of these petty politicians. The demon of political selfishness is shaking the whole country. Can't the Muslim people of this country stand and think on the role of harmony and brotherhood? Political parties, which play an active role in instigating party politics and communal problems, sometimes do things which are not in the interest of the nation to establish the power of their respective parties. Competition to grab power is not uncommon, but in an environment of competition, how can it be justified to ignore national unity in the race for majority and power?

Rajasthan Does not get sufficient place in Modi's reshuffle



Prime Minister Narendra Modi did the first cabinet reshuffle in July 2021 after his winning election in 2019. The number of Ministers was increased and many new ministers were sworn in. The entire exercise was done to facilitate BJP's victory in the forthcoming elections. Ironically Rajasthan which has given 24 out of 25 Lok Sabha members to BJP and 01 member to RLP which is an ally of BJP, does not find sufficient place in the cabinet reshuffle. Seven out of ten Rajya Sabha members are from BJP but there is no important portfolio which an M.P. from Rajasthan has been given.

Three MPs from Rajasthan, including Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, were sworn in as ministers in the second Narendra Modi government on Thursday. Shekhawat, who defeated Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot's son from Jodhpur, was sworn in as a cabinet minister while Kailash Chaudhary and Arjun Ram Meghwal took oath as the ministers of state. A Rajyasabha member Bhupendra Yadav has been given the Ministry of Environment. But none of these portfolios are powerful enough to give an edge to the state of Rajasthan. The situation was similar in the first term of Modi government. It seems that Narendra Modi government takes the support from Rajasthan for granted.

It seems that they are confident that the people of Rajasthan will vote for BJP whether they get the requisite representation in the union government. Rajasthan is the largest state according to the area and has international border with Pakistan. This should have given the Modi government reason to allocate at least a state level portfolio in Defense or Home Ministry to the MPs from Rajasthan. The MPs from Bihar and Uttar Pradesh have been given powerful portfolios. Giriraj Singh, MP from Begusarai, has been given the Rural Development Minister's portfolio which is a very important department attracts a huge budget outlay. Nisith Pramanik, who has been appointed as Minister of State for Home Affairs has been reported as having eleven criminal cases against him.

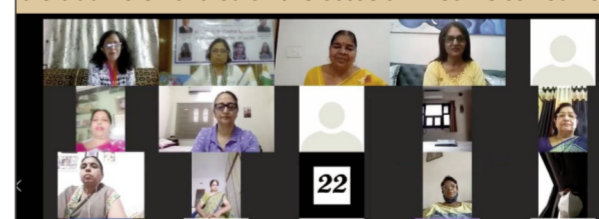
There are many tribal districts in Rajasthan. About 12% population of the state belongs to the scheduled tribes. But no MP from these tribal areas which have an influence on at least half a dozen parliamentary constituencies has been given a chance to join team Modi at the central level. The most disappointing fact is that the BJP state unit has no such leader other than Vasundhara Raje Scindia who can go and strike a deal with the Prime Minister. They are too timid and cannot assert and plead for the state of Rajasthan. Vasundhara Raje is in political quarantine for last two-three years and the state BJP leadership perhaps does not relish her participation any more.

This situation has cost the state of Rajasthan since many of the old projects like Udaipur - Ahmedabad Railway line, Udaipur - Jodhpur Railway line, beginning international flights from Udaipur etc. are pending and no progress is seen due to the lack of funds and proper advocacy.
