

Door-to-door waste collection from commercial establishments will start soon

Private agency will pick up the garbage, the corporation has signed an agreement on Thursday

Udaipur: The Municipal Corporation has tied up with a private agency for door-to-door waste collection from all commercial establishments. In the contract made on Thursday, the agency will start its work in the next 30 working days.

Health Committee President Paras Singhvi said that the Municipal Corporation had signed an agreement with the Thursday Treasonomi Private Limited private agency of New Delhi. This agency will collect waste from all Udaipur Municipal Corporation area commercial establishments like hotels, restaurants, shops, coaching, hostels, private schools, and all commercial

the corporation, in which the said agency accepted to work according to the conditions of the municipal corporation. On Thursday, on the recommendation of Mayor Govind Singh Tank, Municipal Commissioner Himmat Singh Barahath has issued orders to start the work within the next 30 days after signing an agreement with the agency. Now garbage will not be found on the road at night.

Drawing the attention of Municipal Commissioner Himmat Singh Barahath and Deputy Mayor and Health Committee President Paras Singhvi revealed that several members present in the health committee meeting held on March 19, said that there are many restaurants, hotels operating in Udaipur city, including many commercial establishments. All the garbage is thrown on the road by which the residents of the area are facing problems. Throughout the night, stray swans and animals tear these garbage bags and scatter the entire garbage on the road. Many times the oper-

ators of commercial establishments have also been banned for this, but the information of the garbage dumper is also not available at midnight so that no concrete action can be taken. For solving problem, it was unanimously decided in the committee meeting that all the commercial establishments operating in the municipal area such as hotels, restaurants, shops, coaching, handcart operators should take the help of private firms to collect the waste. Go. Taking action in compliance with the decision, Municipal Corporation Commissioner Barahath has issued an order to start the work within 30 working days by entering into an agreement with the firm of Delhi on Thursday.

Work to be started in 30 working days.

All resources will have to be deployed by the agency.

The Municipal Corporation has signed a contract with a private firm to collect garbage from commercial establishments on Thursday. In the con-

tract, the private firm will have to start its work by arranging all the resources within 30 working days. Municipal Corporation Deputy Mayor Singhvi has spoken to the company's key officers to start the job soon. On which the officials of the company have assured to start this work soon.

The municipal corporation will get a royalty of Rs 1 lakh from waste. Municipal Corporation Deputy Mayor and Health Committee President Paras Singhvi informed that Rs 1 lakh per month would be given as royalty to the Municipal Corporation by the door-to-door garbage collection agency from all commercial establishments, which will also increase the income of the corporation. Municipal Corporation Mayor and Health Committee President Paras Singhvi said that the executive agency, which collects door-to-door garbage from commercial establishments, will recover the amount according to the amount fixed by the state government in the user charges.

The agency will not take any amount from any commercial establishments other than the rates set by the state government. Also, out of the amount recovered, the agency will give 50% of the amount to the Municipal Corporation. If any irregularity is found in recovering the amount, the Municipal Corporation can take action against the agency and terminate the agreement.

Agency will have to do all the work.

In the order given to the garbage collection agency from commercial establishments, all the work has been asked to be done by the agency itself. The agency will do the waste collection, segregation, and disposal of waste. The agency will also have to do the work of segregation from the collected waste. The agency will have to provide 20 tons of wet waste from restaurants and hotels every day to the biogas-making machine in Balicha. Along with this, the remaining waste will have to be disposed of properly.



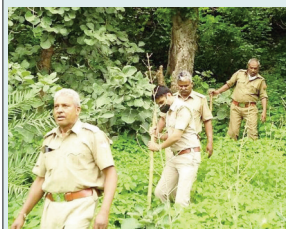

Success in ongoing panther operation in Jawar area

Udaipur: After the life being affected by the panther movements in the Jawar area of the district for the past few days, success was achieved on Thursday under the panther operation run by the Forest Department.



Deputy Conservator of Forests Mukesh Saini said that on Wednesday night, this Panther was caught in a cage put up by the Forest Department in the Mamada area, where a panther attacked and killed a woman on June 2. This male Panther is about 8 to 10 years

old. The canine (hunter's tooth) on the top left is broken. The broken canine of the Panther makes it challenging to hunt, increasing the chances of attacking humans. He said that the caught Panther had been kept under the supervision of a veterinary doctor at Sajjargarh Bio Park, and further action will be taken as per the instructions of higher officials.

Operation Panther went like this: DFO Saini said that to rescue the Panther, five tranquilize teams were constituted by the department, which included teams from Udaipur Wildlife, Chittorgarh Wildlife, Rajsamand, and Jaipur. Apart from this, three patrol teams and separate teams were also formed to monitor trap cameras and cages. Forty-five Range Sarada, Parsad, and Salumbar, including Forest Department officers Sushil Kumar Saini, Kanhaiya Lal Sharma, Surendra Singh Shekhawat, were involved. To make the villagers aware about sleeping with the door closed at home, not going into the forest alone, not sending children to the forest, etc., Hindustan Zinc Limited supported by providing vehicles. Senior Veterinarian Dr. Arvind Mathur of Jaipur, was called to catch the Panther. Two drones were flown in the areas by the Police Department Udaipur to ascertain the location of the Panther. Under this, ten cages and 12 trap cameras were also installed in different areas. On June 2, a panther attacked Mrs. Kesari Devi's wife Halia Meena near the railway track of Naka Bazar, Mamada in the forest block Jawar Singhatwada-B, due to which she died. Similarly, on June 25, Smt. Amri Devi, the wife of Pannaphala, Singhatwada, Mangla Meena, was attacked and killed while sleeping at home. At the same time, a woman resident of Talabphala and a girl resident of Newatli were also shot and injured by Panther, who is undergoing treatment.

First Tribal Boys Hockey Academy to be established in Udaipur

Udaipur: Tribal Regional Development Minister Arjun Singh Barnia will gift the state's first Tribal Boys Hockey Academy at Udaipur. The academy is proposed to be inaugurated by the Chief Minister on the occasion of World Tribal Day.

TAD Commissioner Pragya Kewalramani said that as per the instructions of TAD Principal Secretary Shikhar Agarwal, necessary facilities had been arranged in the academy. She

said that 40 boys players would be selected for the academy. The final selection competition started on Thursday in Arjun Awardee Olympian Ashok Dhyanchand, appointed by the department at the Hockey AstroTurf Sports Ground in Maharana Pratap Khelgaon. The players of Banswara and Pratapgarh Sports Hostel participated in the selection competition. The competition will continue till July 10. Inspection of seeding and mapping work of Jan Aadhar and Ration Card

Udaipur: As per the directions of the Chief Secretary and Government Secretary Planning, besides making the ration distribution system strong and smooth in the district, the seeding and mapping work of Jan Aadhaar and Ration Card is being inspected.

In the same sequence, Chief Planning Officer, Puneet Sharma, in the last two days, in the Panchayat Samiti Rishabhdev, Bichhiwada, Gamala Kotra, and Panchayat Samiti in Gogunda, the ration dealers of Padwali, Madra, Ambawa, and Nal have been responsible for the seeding and mapping of Jan Aadhaar and ration cards. This work is being done in three Panchayat Samitis of Udaipur, namely Gogunda, Lasadiya, and Rishabhdev, and one Municipality in Salumbar.



He informed that mapping ration cards of 33 thousand 957 families of these four blocks with Jan Aadhaar card would be done through ration dealer, block statistics officer, and e-Mitra until July 31.

In this, those members of the families who do not have Jan Aadhaar enrollment are motivated to enroll Jan Aadhaar card through e-Mitra and the members of the family. They have been transferred due to death, marriage, or migration their information. Are also being collected.

The Chief Planning Officer instructed the ration dealer to get a copy of the Aadhaar of each family member, contact the Aadhaar seeding, and map the Jan Aadhaar and ration card data. Also, inquire about the progress of seeding and mapping work of Jan Aadhaar and Ration Card. Resolved the problems faced by the ration dealers and e-Mitra in doing this work and explained how to do the job efficiently.

Block statistics officers Megharaj Patel and Vikram Malviya informed about the benefits of seeding and mapping to the villagers. He said that the NFSA families who have not got the data of all the members of the ration card mapped with the Jan Aadhaar card would not be able to benefit from the public ration distribution scheme. Therefore, all the ration card families must get the data of all the members, Jan Aadhaar card mapping is done. Ramesh Taylor, Anil Meena, Basuram Meena, and Pushkarlal Paliwal were present on this occasion.

Only boats with Euro-6 engines will be allowed - RTO Rathore

Udaipur: In compliance with the Rajasthan Boating Act 1956 and to prevent accidents of boats in water bodies and safety of passengers, a meeting was held on Wednesday under the chairmanship of Regional Transport Officer Prakash Singh Rathore. In the forum, instructions were given to comply with the departmental instructions issued regarding license, the fitness of boats, and the safety of passengers. The RTO said that only for the promotion of eco-friendly tourism and for lake conservation, the fitness of boats with Euro-6 engines and the low-noise engine would be issued.

Regional Transport Officer Rathore said that complete safety standards would be implemented regarding rescue boats and rescue equipment. He directed that under no circumstances should pre-wedding photography be done on boats. He said that the time of operation of boats is fixed before sunset and after sunrise. Therefore, boat operations should not be allowed at night except in special circumstances. Not more than one boat will be allowed at the same time, and separate permission will have to be obtained for each boat. The application should also provide a list of the security personnel appointed in relation to the boat and the necessary safety equipment. Even then, it can be rejected in case of bad weather due to exceptional circumstances or threats to the safety of passengers. Only such places where there is no means of additional commuting by boat can be allowed for seven days. The undertaking will be required to be given by the operator to have rescue equipment and necessary arrangements for rescue work for boat operation at night. He directed to strengthen the safety standards given the upcoming rainy season.

For the safety of passengers and safe boat operation in lakes, boat operation in reservoirs and "Mock Drill" with the departmental officer will also be conducted. An expert committee will be constituted to ensure safe boat operation and the safety of passengers in the lakes. In which Naval experts/officers of the Transport Department and boat operator members will be included. District Transport Officer, Departmental Transport Inspector, and various boats license operators of Lake Pichola were present.

State-of-the-art medical equipment presented to RNT Medical College

Udaipur: Under the direction of the State Government, in the ongoing war against Corona in the district, the cooperation of various departments, industrial and social organizations, and government and non-government organizations are also being continuously received. On Saturday, under one such spontaneous collaboration, the association and Air Foundation have expressed their commitment to defeat Corona by presenting state-of-the-art medical equipment to RNT Medical College. Abha Sharma, director of 'Juda' organization working in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh, presented ten multipara cardiac monitors and 50 high flow masks to Dr. Lakhna Poswal, Principal of RNT Rabindranath Tagore Medical College, in the presence of Additional District Collector (Administration) OP Bunkar ADM OP Bunkar and Dr. Lakhna Poswal appreciated the efforts of Judav and Air Foundation and said that these devices would go a long way in providing quick medical care to the patients of Emergency and Corona ICU.

Dr. Poswal said that the use of multipara cardiac monitor in monitoring the blood pressure, heart rate, oxygen level, ECG of the admitted patients and to transfer the patients from ICU, OT and emergency ward to other ward or from here to ICU and OT. During this, Abha Sharma of the organization said that her institute worked in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh. So far, 20 thousand N-95 masks, oxygen concentrators, and more than 300 needy families have been given ration in the war against Corona. Medical equipment is also proposed to be given in Jodhpur in the coming week. She said that CMHO Dr. Dinesh Kharadi, Dr. Vikram Bedi, and Dr. Devendra Verma of RNT have been instrumental in coordinating the need and supply of this medical equipment.
