Udaipur: An older adult underwent a knee transplant at the Joint Transplant Department of GBH American Hospital. The special thing in this was that neither the muscles were cut nor the PCL ligament was cut during the operation, and after a successful knee transplant, the woman was discharged while driving.

Group Director Dr. Anand Jha said that Shobhadevi (61), a resident of Chandpole, complained of a lot of pain in the knees for the last year. He was also having trouble walking. On this, she was also given injections of steroids, but there was no relief. In the investigation, it was found that her knees have worn out, which is called Arthritis. The family members gave them joint transplant specialist Dr. Prashant Maheshwari, in which it was decided to undergo knee transplant surgery. Usually, this type of surgery is done by cutting the muscles and PCL ligament, but Dr. Prashant Maheshwari performed a knee transplant without cutting it. The benefit of this was that the elderly woman did not suffer much post-surgery pain, and due to the strength of the muscles, she walked on the walker the next day and was discharged in the evening of the same day.
