New Delhi: Those who understand the politics of Narendra Modi closely are well aware that Modi's thinking begins where thinking of a common politician ends. He is such a public leader that it is difficult for even seasoned politicians to gauge thinking of Modi. Once again Modi has started all by picking up a strange person Bhupendra Rajanikant Patel as Chief Minister of Gujarat, while big names of grand leaders of the state were in the discussion in the race to become new chief minister, like- Union Cabinet Minister for Health Mansukh Mandavia, Union Fisheries and Animal Husbandry Minister Purushottam Rupala, Deputy Chief minister of Gujarat Nitin Patel and the president of Gujarat Bhartiya Janta Party (BJP) CR Patil. Not even once

the name of Bhupendra Patel emerged in the race. Unaware of this, he was watering the plants at his home on Sunday. In the meeting of the legislature party in the last row like a normal legislature, he himself was surprised when his name was declared.

In the whole melee, a peculiar thing is that Bhupendra Patel became a legislature for the first time, but he was made chief minister ignoring many senior legislatures elected multiple times. With this, a new slogan is echoing in Gujarat, 'Indra in sky, Narendra in Delhi and Bhupendra in Gujarat...'

New chief minister of Gujarat is decided within twenty-four hours of Vijay Rupani's resignation. Name of Bhupendra Patel started all as his name for the post never came forth; rather his name

was announced immediately after the meeting of legislatures. Vijay Rupani proposed the name of Bhupendra Bhai Patel in the meeting of legislatures and Deputy Chief Minister Nitin Patel seconded it. On the occasion cabinet ministers Narendra Singh Tomar, Prahlad Joshi and Bhupendra Yadav and party organisation Secretary B. Santosh were also present as central observers.

It is said that Bhupendra Patel is a low profile leader, he has got a strong hold on the Patidar community. He has been associated with Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) for a long time. He is considered to be in the good books of Modi-Shah. Bhupendra Patel took oath for the post of chief minister on Monday. New CM of Gujarat is only 12th pass and is a diploma holder in civil

engineering. Along with being leader of Kadwa Patidar community, he has been taken as very close to Anandi Ben Patel, former chief minister of the state and currently governor of Uttar Pradesh. In the 2017 legislative assembly on Anandi Ben's refusal to contest the election, Patel had registered victory from her Ghatlodia seat of the Ahmedabad district with a record 1.17 votes.

Workers of his constituency call Bhupendra Patel with the nickname 'Dada'. Prior to getting fully active in politics, he was chairman of the Ahmedabad urban development authority (AUDA). Not only that when Narendra Modi was chief minister of Gujarat then during 1999-2001 Patel remained chairman of the standing committee of the Ahmedabad Municipal



Corporation, while during 2008-10 he remained vice chairman of the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation School Board. During 2010 to 2015 he remained councillor of the Thaltej ward of Ahmedabad only. Now Bhupendra is not short of challenges too. To accommodate senior leaders in the council of ministers and party organization and get BJP win the Gujarat assembly elections is not an easy task.

an unknown leader like Bhupendra Patel has become chief minister. Prior to this Modi has already experimented in many states, like-Haryana, Maharashtra, Goa, Karnataka, Uttarakhand, Assam, Himachal etc.

Paras JK Hospital performs single incision state-of-the-art surgery

Udaipur: Recently Dr. Abhishek Vyas of Paras JK Hospital, performed laparoscopic surgery with the help of a single incision and removed the gall sac of a patient. Laparoscopic surgery is usually done by making four or three incisions, but it is not very common to do it with the help of a single incision. Laparoscopic surgery is considered one of the very modern techniques in the field of surgery. Under this, instead of making four incisions for surgery, binoculars and instruments are inserted together at the operation site. With the help of binoculars, doctors can see the area clearly and surgery is done with the tools mounted on the ends of the rest of the equipment. The specialty of laparoscopic surgery is that it does not have deep scars and associated problems.

Dr. Abhishek Vyas, Consultant, Advanced Laparoscopic General & Bariatric Surgery, Paras JK Hospital, having 7 years of experience in the field of Laparoscopic surgery said, "Laparoscopic surgery is a very modern and effective technique but with a single incision technique where so far, it takes a lot of experience to do it. It takes time for a doctor to learn this process from four incisions to three, then gradually moving from one incision to laparoscopic surgery, which is also one of the reasons why it is not usually performed as much. We are delighted to see the patient back disease-free with this successful surgery."

SILS means single incision laparoscopic surgery is a rapidly growing field, it can also be called the future of laparoscopic surgery. Given minimal incision, no scarring, least bleeding risk, etc., it is state-of-the-art and is constantly evolving. Apart from this, the patient also gets early discharge from the hospital. Vishwajeet Kumar, Facility Director, Paras JK Hospital says, "People often move to metros in the hope of modern treatment, but due to the availability of experienced doctors and modern treatment at our hospital in Udaipur, many people do not have to move out."

Successful treatment of Angurdana disease in Pacific Hospital Bedla

Udaipur: Free treatment is given to the patient suffering from angurdana disease at Pacific Medical College and Hospital, Bedla in Bhils. The woman, unable to get treatment due to financial constraints, got free treatment on the initiative of Aman Aggarwal, Executive Director of Pacific Hospital.

In fact, due to weakness, a 45-year-old woman from Chaura village in the tribal area Malwa brought her family to PMCH is a very serious condition, where she was shown to Dr. Rajrani Sharma.

The woman's hemoglobin was also 4 grams and the uterus was as large as 32 weeks gestation, which required immediate treatment. Dr. Rajrani Sharma, Head of the Department of Gynecology and Obstetrics, said that hydatidiform mole is a rare mass or growth that forms inside the womb (uterus) at the beginning of pregnancy.

It is a type of gestational trophoblastic disease (JK). On ultrasound, this mass often resembles grapes, as it contains many small cysts. A hydatidiform mole develops when there is a living embryo. In such cases, the fetus usually dies, and often a miscarriage occurs.

Due to this, he used to get laxity in his leg while walking and many times there was a situation of falling of the patient. This problem was revealed to be due to the rupture of the ligament of his leg in the MRI. On this, Joint Replacement Surgeon Dr. Prashant Maheshwari and their team reconstructed the ligament by performing surgery on it. After the operation, the patient was made to walk with the help of a walker with lightweight. Now the patient will be made to sit down and kneel and sit on the knee will be practiced in physiotherapy.

Dr. Ranka told that DG stenting was done by laparoscopic deroofting and connection repair of the para pelvic renal cyst of the patient. This type of disease is found in one patient in thousands. The patient and his family thanked Chairman Rahul Agarwal. The patient is now completely healthy and has been discharged.
