

Udaipur will be made a child-labor-free district - Dr. Pandya

Udaipur: For a child-labor-free society, strict action against employers under the Juvenile Justice Act and better rehabilitation of child laborers should be the first priority. In the Udaipur district, now by carrying out such rescues from time to time, we will make Udaipur a child-labor-free district in the collective effort of all. Children have been given shelter with FIR on the spot immediately after the children were rescued. The above views were expressed by Dr. Shailendra Pandya, member

of the Rajasthan State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Government of Rajasthan, and in charge of the child labor cell, at the Anti-Human Trafficking Unit Office after a day-long union rescue operation in the urban area of Udaipur.

Dr. Pandya informed that the report was submitted by Kailash Satyarthi Children Foundation, ChildLine, and local voluntary organizations after identifying them as child laborers. In his immediate action, he came to Udaipur



today and took big action with the police administration. Giving information on this

occasion, Dhruv Kumar Kaviya, Chairman, Child Welfare Committee, Udaipur,

and member Suresh Sharma said that out of all the 30 rescued children, 28 children were sheltered at Shri Asra Vikas Sansthan at Titardi, and two girls were sheltered in Balika Grih.

During the rescue operation, the action was taken at Sukher Police Station, Surajpol Police Station, Bhupalpura, Pratapnagar, and Savina Police Station.

During which the Child Welfare Police Officer of the concerned police station and representatives of voluntary

organizations, including the team of the Anti-Human Trafficking Unit, remained with them.

Giving information, Udaipur District Coordinator of Access to Justice program run by Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation, New Delhi, Lalit Singh, said that today, rescue the identified child laborers from various hostels, restaurants, brick kilns, and shops of Udaipur, along with registering an FIR. Under which sections 75 and 89 of the Juvenile Justice Act, along with the

serious case of children received from other states, I.P. Cases were registered in 370.

Giving information, the Director of Shri Asra Development Institute, Bhojraj Singh Padampura, said that most of the rescued children belonged to tribal families from different districts of the division, as well as five children from Uttar Pradesh and two children from Bihar.

Childline coordinator Navinit Audichya, while supporting today's rescue, talked

about getting a child-friendly arrangement and shelter by giving a comfortable environment to the children through proper planning.

In today's day-long rescue operation, the commission member was accompanied by the Director of Police Administration, ChildLine Child Welfare Committee, Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation, Gayatri Seva Sansthan, Shree Asra Vikas Sansthan, and representatives of Child Protection Network

During this, Masih said that all NGOs, trusts, foundations, and all non-profit organizations-companies in Rajasthan will now need approval from the Voluntary Sector Development Center to get government grants or assistance. Masih said that his department would also encourage voluntary sector organizations as well as fix responsibility and accountability under good governance.

Addressing the workshop, a member of Tribal Paramarshdatri Samiti, Laxminarayan Pandya, said that the benefits of government schemes are not available due to a lack of education and awareness; through this type of dialogue, NGOs should be given the benefits of departmental schemes.
