Udaipur: For the purpose of promoting girl child education, the college of Arts, Science and Commerce is also being started in Rajasthan Mahila Vidyalya Sansthan, established in 1916.

Sansthan President Devendra Singh Shaktawat said that due to the efforts of social worker Late Bhairul Gelda, girls education was started in the form of primary school at a time when girls were often not even allowed to leave the house. Establishing a school for the education of the girl child in a conservative society at the beginning of the twenty-first century was a challenging and courageous step. Since then till the present the journey of 106 years has been covered by the institute from pre-primary school to academic and teacher training college in higher education with all its efficiency. An English



medium school is also being run by the institution from nursery to higher secondary level, in which there is a provision of co-education.

RMV Girls College - Rajasthan Mahila Vidyalya Sanstha deeply felt the need for higher education of girls in urban areas. An academic commerce college in the urban area was established in the

year 2010 in the form of RMV Girls College by the institution in order to advance the education of girls in higher direction after school education.
