

This is Mangarh mas-

Mangarh massacre is the incident of 1913. It is also called the 'Jallianwala Bagh' massacre of Rajasthan. In this 1500 innocent Gurubhakts were killed.

There would hardly be any Indian who would not have known about the incident of Jallianwala Bagh massacre that happened on April 13, 1919. This incident has been a huge chapter in the book of India's freedom struggle. Many common people were affected by this incident and decid-



ed to get into the freedom strug-

ale According to the British government, 379 people were killed and more than 1200 were injured in this massacre. But according to the then newspapers, there was no fake news, according to the death toll was around 1000. A similar painful and gruesome massacre happened in southern Rajasthan as well.it Which hid under other events in the pages of history. This massacre was bigger than the incident in Jallianwala Bagh.

We are talking about the 'Mangarh Dham massacre' that happened 6 years before the Jallianwala Bagh massacre. The date was November 17, 1913. Mangarh is the name of a hill where this incident took

Govind Guru was the

Govind Guru, was a social worker and used to work to awaken the light among the tribals. He started a movement in 1890. The purpose of which was to make the tribal-Bhil community aware of vegetarianism and to remove the addiction spread among these tribals. This movement was named as Bhagat Movement.

On November 17, 1913. Major Hamilton, along with his three officers and princes and their armies, surrounded

Mangarh hill from all sides. What happened after that shows how harmful the existence of power is to the senses? Guns were mounted on the mules, they were made to go round the hill so that more and more people died. In this incident more than 1500 people were killed and many were injured. Govind Guru was again imprisoned, however released from Hyderabad jail due to his popularity and good behavior in jail. His colleague Poonja Dheeji got the punishment of black-water. Apart from these. 900 other people were also

arrested.

"In this work. I have depicted the horrific massacre, how the British Army fired nonstop, and the bodies of those innocent tribals were piled up. Whose number was more than 1500. The pile of the dead bodies of the tribals has been given the effect of the hill of Mangarh and in the same way I have made a portrait of Govind Guru looking at it with soulful eyes, as well as a monument built there in tribute to these tribals. Through this work, I am making the viewer feel the horrific situation of that time. how mercilessly the British power came to dominate humanity".\_ Nirmal Yadev

#### **Nation Suffers With Current Unemployment Burden Needing Strategic Recovery Mechanisms**

While making way to recover from the shattering multidimensional damage as faced during two year long Covid-19 crisis, another pressurizing record is added in the current crisis portfolio of India. The country's unemployment rate gone up to 7.83 per cent in April this year from the the stage of 7.60 per cent noted in last month.

On ordering the count state-wise, Haryana tops the chart with 34.5 per cent unemployment rate and then. Raiasthan bearing 28.8 per cent of unemployment mass. Among the southern states, Telengana bears the highest portion of 9.9 per cent, Kerala with 5.8 per cent and then, Andhra Pradesh having 5.3 per cent, Tamil Nadu 3.2 per cent and lastly, Karnataka 2.7 per cent. Overall, Himachal Pradesh shows least portion of jobless mass of 0.2 per cent. Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE) has published these readings in their latest

Both urban and rural areas have come under the burden of this current fall-down of employment. The rate of urban side oblessness increased from 8.28 per cent (March'22 record) to 9.22 per cent in April. Rural joblessness rate has rose to 7.29 per cent from 7.18 per cent. Earlier, in Lockdown times, the joblessness figure rose due to the nationwide movement restrictions. This time, as the report of CMIE explains the challenge arrives out of drop in domestic market demand.

Based on the decline of labour participation statistics of 2017 - 2022, CMIE has marked that the lowering from 46 per cent to 40 per cent is an outcome of loss of job seeking interests, particularly located among the young workforce. Mostly, as the report observes, the latest poor rate of employment is happening from the long spanning frustration and fatigue among the eligible mass, including females. In the current job market, only 9 per cent of capable females have obtained fresh

Now, on the existing number of about 2 crore people without their jobs during the pandemic time, a fall of at least 12 per cent of GDP in two consecutive Covid waves if the current figures are added, that makes the Government's promised iob creation efforts and assistances to be too feeble to improve the situation. It is really urgent to develop alternate livelihood scope, diversification of employment segments and provisions of support options to be open for the suffering mass.

A 56 year old patient resident of Bhilwara came to Geetanjali lospital, Udaipur due to cough, mucus, chest pain, shortness of breath for about 10 days. Dr. SK Luhadia, HOD of TB and Respiratory Diseases Department, and his team found that there could be a possibility of bronchogenic cyst due to which the patient's chest scan done which confirmed the congenital disease bronchogenic cyst. In the team that successfully diagnosed this complex disease, comprises of the Dr.SK. Luhadia, Dr. Atul Luhadia, Dr. Monica Bansal, Dr. Divaksha Ojha, Cardiothoracic Surgeon Dr. Sanjay Gandhi, Gastroenterologist Dr. Manish Dodmani. Bronchogenic cyst is a very rare disease, its treatment is possible only by surgery, this case was referred to cardiothoracic surgeon Dr. Sanjay Gandhi, who successfully removed this bronchogenic cyst by operation. Now the patient is completely healthy and can discharge his daily rou-

Dr. S.K. Luhadia explained that bronchogenic cyst is a rare congenital disease in which a lump is formed in the middle of the two lungs (mediastinum) or in the hilum of the lung and later infection in it, this lump starts growing, causing cough and shortness of breath due to pressure on the windpipe. It start getting hurt If it is not operated on time, then this knot can burst due to which the life of the patient can be in danger.
