"ECMO stands for extracorporeal membrane oxygenation. The ECMO machine is similar to the heartung by-pass machine used in open-heart surgery. It pumps and oxygenates a patient's blood outside the body, allowing the heart and lungs to rest. When connected to an **ECMO**, blood flows through tubing to an artificial lung in the machine that adds oxygen and takes out carbon dioxide; then

the blood is warmed to body temperature and pumped back into your body." Udaipur: Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital

detailed information Sanjay Gandhi said that 27year-old Shashiraj (name changed) from Dungarpur ate celphos for domestic reasons. As soon as the poison took effect in the body, the patient started to panic, and the family patient was immediately taken to the private hospital in Dungarpur. Their first aid was given to the patient, but the patient did not get any benefit. The patient's blood pressure was continuously decreasing, and he was

referred to Udaipur. The patient was admitted to another private hospital in Udaipur, but there was no benefit. The patient was referred to Geetanjali Hospital due to the ECMO machine facility. Because of ECMO, the life of a severe patient was saved in the Geetanjali hospital machine. This patient came to Geetanjali Hospital two weeks



ago and was immediately admitted to MICU.

The patient's condition was critical; he needed to be put on the ECMO machine. With the consent of the patient's family, he was put on. As soon as the patient was taken by the team of doctors on the ECMO machine and opened the artery, the patient's heart stopped. In such a situation, the shock was given immediately, and circulation was started by inserting ECMO cannula. Despite this, the patient's heartbeat continued to be low and

high, and the heart stopped. Since the patient was put on the ECMO machine, the heart and lungs were stable. The patient was shifted to ICU. There was also no improvement in the pumping of the heart for two days due to the ECMO machine; the patient's kidney, liver, brain, and heart continued to get blood supply and oxygen. On the second day, the patient's heart stopped again at midnight in the ICU,

Dr. Sanjay Gandhi, along with the team, gave a shock to the patient and gave medicine, and the patient's heart started again. The patient's pumping improved after two days. Three days later, the patient was removed from the ECMO machine.

The patient has shifted from the ECMO machine to the

ICU again. The poison in the body affects all the kidneys, liver, brain, and lungs. The patient was now put on the ventilator and seeing the improvement, and the patient was removed from the ventilator; again, due to lung problems, the patient was placed on the ventilator. Dialysis cycles were also completed due to reduced urine output from the kidneys.

A psychiatrist also counseled the patient. Dr. Gandhi said that the ECMO machine saved the patient's heart, the

heart pumping also improved, gradually urine started coming from the kidney, and the lungs also enhanced. The patient is now normal; all the organs are working well. The patient has been discharged from the hospital.Dr. Gandhi said that through this press conference, I want to give this message that never does such kind of work, no matter what the trouble, no matter what the mental state, no matter what the circumstances of the house and society are like this poison is not the solution to the problem, it makes the family

more worried. He also said that the chances of survival after ingesting a poison like cellphones are negligible. But the patient could get a healthy life due to the availability of all world-class facilities under one roof in ECMO Machine and Geetanjali Hospital

Ankit Agarwal, Executive Director, Geetanjali Group, said that when the ECMO

Many women die due to cervical cancer in our country. He said that this disease does not happen in a day. Its symptoms start appearing a long time, but people ignore them. Also, he said that getting vaccinated does not cause cervical cancer even after the disease is diagnosed. Treatment is possible. Regarding breast cancer, he said that if a lump is felt, one should immediately consult a doctor. Rare brain tumor removed

Udaipur: Awoman suffering from a brain tumor (Aesthesio neuro blastoma) that had reached the brain through the nose was operated on free of cost in the Neuro Sciences department of GBH General Hospital, Bedwas. This type of tumor is found in one in 2.5 million people.

Kanku Devi (63), a resident of Banswara, has been suffering from nose bleeding for the last three months. Gradually, his behavior changed, and he started harming anyone at any time. Her memory had also become weak. On this, his family took him to Himatnagar in Gujarat for treatment, where a brain tumor was reported. The high-risk, expensive operation was advised everywhere. On this, the family recently took her to the Neuro and Spine Surgeon Dr. Sumit Dave in the Department of Neuro Sciences, GBH General Hospital. The MRI conducted here found the tumor to have spread to the brain. The case study found that cancer had reached the brain through the nose and paranasal sinus and was pressing on the brain. Due to all these reasons, the woman was getting into all this trouble. It is called aesthesia neuroblastoma in medical science.

Here the team of neurosurgeon Dr. Sumit Dave, ENT surgeon Dr. Kanishk Mehta and Dr. Piyush Garg from the department of anesthesia were formed. The group eradicated the tumor by reaching the brain.

After the operation, as soon as the brain pressure was released, the woman became utterly healthy, and from the next day, there was a change in her behavior. Also, the lost memory came back. According to Dr. Sumit Dave, this was a rare type of tumor in which the patient's life was also in danger during the operation. If you look at the statistics of this rare tumor, then one in 2.5 million people occurs.
