**Udaipur.** On Friday, the orientation workshop and training of Chief Minister Chiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme were organized under District Collector Tarachand Meena's chairmanship. The Collector directed to give wide publicity to this ambitious scheme of the Chief Minister and provide its benefits to every needy.

State Program Officer Dr. Buddhivardhan Azad, who came from the state level, gave training regarding Chief

Minister Chiranjeevi Health Scheme. In training, Zilla pramukh, Zilla Parishad members, public representatives, health department officials, and employees got detailed information about this scheme.

To take benefit under Chief Minister Chiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme, it is necessary to have Jan Aadhar Card, Jan Aadhar Registration Receipt, Aadhar Card, and Mobile Number. Under the scheme, eligible families of the Food Security Act and Socio-



Economic Census 2011, contractual personnel working in all departments, families receiving Covid ex-gratia, and

small and marginal farmers category families are being benefited. Families eligible for National Food Security Act

and Socio-Economic Census 2011 are not required to register. Under the Chief Minister Chiranjeevi Swasthya Bima Yojana, free treatment up to 10 lakh is being given to all the members of the registered families, in which treatment of kidney diseases, liver diseases as well as many other serious diseases is being offered free of cost in all government and private registered hospitals. Accident insurance of 5 lakhs is also being given to the registered family. Apart from the

free category, the rest of the families can register through e-Mitra by paying an annual premium of Rs 850. Huh.

CMHO Dr. Shankar Lal Baramania said that this scheme is an ambitious public welfare scheme of the government; if there is any problem in the scheme, District Program Coordinator Sharad Patidar can be contacted at the district level. ## Foundation stone laid down for three development Projects @ 89 crores

**Udaipur.** On Thursday, Chief Minister Shri Ashok Gehlot inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for construction works of 3063 km length of roads, ROBs, and bridges costing Rs 3324 crore through video conference from the Chief Minister's residence. While giving a gift to Udaipur, the Chief Minister laid the foundation stone of three development works costing 89 crores. The Chief Minister said that the development of roads is a basic necessity of civilian life. Where routes will be developed, citizens will get better facilities, and more and more industries will be established. The state government is committed to the overall development of the state.

### Gifts found in Udaipur.

Chief Minister Shri Gehlot also gifted various construction works to the Udaipur district. Under this program, the foundation stone of three development works of Udaipur to be done at the cost of Rs.89 crore was laid. CM laid the foundation stone for the widening and strengthening the position of Jhalara to Dhariyavad to Pratapgarh road at the expense of 18 crores, Rishabhdev-Sarada- Sandal-Jagat-Jhameshwar Udaipur road strengthening and renovation work at the cost of 54 crores and a cost of 17 crores. Laid the virtual foundation stone for the widening and supporting work of Jhadol Dewas Gogunda road. All these three works will be completed by 2023 May. During this virtual program, District Collector Tarachand Meena from Udaipur District Headquarters, Laxminarayan Pandya, a Rajasthan Scheduled Tribes



Consultative Council member, Public Works Department officials, and other V.C.s were present.

### There will be no compromise on quality.

The Chief Minister said that ensuring the quality of roads is the priority of the State Government. For this, the inspection system will be further strengthened and intensive inspection is also being confirmed by the officers of the Quality Control Branch. He said that the State Government was committed not to compromising on the quality and to constructing the roads as per proper standards.

Shri Gehlot said that the departmental officers should ensure necessary maintenance after road construction in coordination with the contractors. For this, all the conditions in the contract with the contractors must comply. Also, officials should ensure the quality of construction works by making regular and surprise visits.

### An excellent road network is essential for development and investment.

Shri Gehlot said that an excellent road network is the first condition for investment and development in any state.

The advanced roads are one of the main reasons behind the progress of all developed countries. Before the Invest Rajasthan Summit, which will be held in the state in October, MoUs worth about Rs 11 lakh crore has been signed by the state government with the investors.

Road infrastructure of the state is one of the main reasons behind the interest shown by the investors. The participation of all the state's regions in development is being ensured by constructing quality main district roads, other district roads, and rural roads along with national and state highways.

### Damaged roads should be repaired immediately.

Shri Gehlot said that all the state districts had received good rains this time, and flood-like situations have also arisen in many districts. There has also been extensive road damage due to excessive rains/floods during monsoon. The Chief Minister directed the departmental officers to fix all the damaged roads by running a particular drive by October 20. He said that necessary resources would be made available for the repair of roads in all the districts, and

there would be no shortage of resources. He said that by getting the contracts signed with the contractors to be followed, they should be punctuated for the speedy repair of any wear and tear in the roads during the defect rectification period. Shri Gehlot said that roads are being constructed and developed continuously in the state. In the last three and a half years, approvals for 10,546 development works at the cost of Rs.25,395 crore have been issued for the development of roads of 42,384 km in length in the state. He said that it is the result of the government's efforts that today the roads of the state are in better condition than the neighboring state of Gujarat in terms of quality.

### New technologies are being used to make roads sustainable.

It was informed in the meeting that the department is taking various innovations to ensure longer life and better maintenance of roads. In this sequence, quick and sustainable repair of damaged roads is done through 'cold mix technology'. The usable material from the damaged roads is being used for the new roads. Good quality cemented roads

are being built in rural areas using technology like SAIL Field. Along with this, waste plastic is also being used in road construction.

### The government is committed to reducing road accidents.

The Chief Minister said that the government is determined to minimize the yearly loss of lives due to road accidents in the state. Overloading, over-speeding and damaged roads are mainly responsible for these accidents. In this direction, the work of widening roads is being done by the state government. The damaged roads are being surveyed and repaired immediately.

With the construction of quality roads, there is a definite reduction in road accidents. Experts are identifying all the leading causes of road accidents, and work is being done to eliminate them. Advanced technologies like Integrated Traffic Management System (ITMS) will be used to prevent road accidents. Along with this, control of road accidents will also be ensured through strict monitoring mechanisms and effective implementation of rules.

### Rajasthan leader in the construction of national highways

Shri Gehlot said that Rajasthan has become a leading state in the country in the construction of National Highways and the State Government is cooperating with the Central Government in various ways for their construction. The construction work of the Delhi-Vadodara and Amritsar-Jamnagar National Highways is being completed rapidly due to the cooperation

of the State Government. The state government has provided free state land in the ongoing road construction works under the Bharatmala project. Apart from this, there has been full cooperation of the State Government in the acquisition of land, removal of encroachments and issuance of necessary clearances for the roads passing through the forest area. This is the reason why quality national highways are being constructed at a rapid pace in the state.

Public Works Minister Shri Bhajan Lal Jatav said that roads play an essential role in the development of the state. A vast network of roads is being laid by the state government. Having good roads facilitates traffic and also accelerates industrial development. Keeping this in mind, all the road constructions have been done quality.

Principal Secretary to Government, PWD Shri Naveen Mahajan told in detail about the new inauguration and foundation stone laying work through the presentation. He also informed me about the various development works to be done in the future.

## Now Ayurveda and Homeopathy will cure lumpy skin disease

**Udaipur.** After allopathy, the lumpy illness will be treated through Ayurveda and Homeopathy; for this, Udaipur District Collector Tarachand Meena has prepared a unique poster to spread the information about Ayurveda and Homeopathy treatment to the masses.

This special poster prepared by District Administration, Animal Husbandry Department, AYUSH Department, and Information and Public Relations Department was released by District Collector Tarachand Meena on Friday.

This poster will be distributed in village-village and Dhani-Dhani so that the livestock owners can get information about the measures to prevent this severe disease. By adopting these measures, they can keep their livestock disease free.

These medicines can be treated with the homeopathy method.

The poster included all the information on saving livestock from lumpy skin disease and effective treatment of infected animals. Under which the black iodine medicine made from iodide of potassium under a homeopathic system of medicine works in the initial symptoms of the lumpy virus. This medicine should be given when a lump has formed in the cattle; the infection has occurred immediately. In such a situation, a single dose of this medicine is sufficient. Similarly, uranium nitricum medicine is given when the cause of illness is a foul smell, foul smell of urine, or foul smell in an ulcer; in such a situation, one dose of this medicine is sufficient. When cattle have ulcers in their mouth and throat, one dose of nitric acid medicine once is adequate. When the cattle wound has a foul odor, and the feet are swollen, one dose of Ammonium Nitricum is sufficient once. When the cattle have difficulty breathing, and the condition of the cattle is serious, in such situation, one dose of Nitrogenum oxygenated drug is sufficient once. When saliva flows from the cattle's mouth and nose, there is a tremor in walking. In such conditions, Amyl Nitrosium, one dose of this medicine is sufficient once. When the cattle have a high fever, and swollen lymph glands, a lot of saliva comes from the mouth, burning water from the nose and eyes, there are large wounds on the body of the cattle from which pus is coming, then mercury Group medicine is given. Thuja medicine should be used when cattle have a high fever, large lumps on the skin, swollen glands, thick green water from the nose, and wounds. Veriolinum is beneficial when the cattle have large pus sores on the body, and it is a vital medicine to prevent virus infection. All these homeopathic medicines should be given only once, and only one type of medicine should be given. 5-10 drops of the drug are enough for the cattle.

### Prevention and treatment can also be done with the Ayurveda method.

To prevent the infection of lumpy disease, prepare a handful of basil leaves, 5-5 grams of lentils, sugar and dry ginger powder, ten pieces of black pepper, and jaggery, and feed it to animals in the morning and evening by making laddus. Is. Similarly, in the first three days of the lumpy disease, grind ten pieces of betel leaves, black pepper, and lumpy salt, mix it well with jaggery and prepare a dose. Prepare four such doses daily and feed it to the animal at an interval of every three hours. 1-1 handful of neem and basil leaves, garlic bud, clove, black pepper 10-10 nos., betel leaves five nos., small onion 2 nos., coriander leaves, and cumin 15 for 4 to 14 days after getting the lumpy disease. Grind 15 grams and 10 grams of turmeric powder, mix it with jaggery and prepare a dose. Preparing three doses of laddus daily in the morning, evening and night are beneficial. To prevent infection, burn cow dung, filter cow dung in the animal enclosure and put Gugal, camphor, dried leaves of neem, and frankincense in it and smoke it in the morning and evening so that the outbreak of fly-mosquito can be reduced. Similarly, it is beneficial to bathe the sick animals by mixing a handful of paste of neem strips and a maximum of 100 grams of alum in 25 liters of water. After 5 minutes of this solution, take a bath with plain water.

## Successful surgery of the esophagus

**Udaipur.** Physicians at Pacific Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS) Hospital Umrda have successfully performed surgery on the esophagus of a girl child.

Chairman Ashish Agarwal said that a seven-year-old girl resident of Barisadri had suffered severe damage to her esophagus two years ago due to accidentally drinking acid. There was a lot of narrowing in the upper part, which made it very difficult for her to eat and drink. Presently it had become impossible to swallow



anything. The girl's family members also got treatment in other hospitals, but there was no improvement.

Recently, the girl was brought to PIMS Hospital Umrda. The pediatric surgeon Dr. Atul Mishra examined the girl and decided to operate. Family members were made aware of the dangers of surgery. This complex operation,

which lasted about three and a half, was reconnected by removing the narrowness of the esophagus tube. After the procedure, the girl's food and drink are improving and she is healthy.

In this complex operation, Dr. Peenu Ranawat, Dr. Garvita, Dr. Abhyudaya of the Department of Anesthesia along with Dr. Mishra, Dr. Vivek Parashar, Dr. Rahul Khatri, and staff of the Department of Pediatrics, Arun, Uday, Kuldeep, Dheeraj, Zeeshan, Mehnaz, Mudasir, Muzaffar and team played an important role.

Dr. Mishra informed that PIMS Hospital, Umrda, is equipped with all state-of-the-art facilities, and treatment of various complex diseases of children is done free of cost under government schemes like Chiranjeevi, RGHS, etc. Dr. Mishra appealed to the parents to keep harmful substances like acid, phenyl, etc., out of the reach of the children so that other innocent children do not have to go through such trouble.

## Safety and security Everyone's cooperation is required for a firm dealing from lumpy - Pandya

**Udaipur.** Laxminarayan Pandya, a member of Rajasthan Scheduled Tribes Paramarshdatri Parishad, visited various villages of Sarada tehsil and discussed with the villagers regarding prevention and protection from lumpy disease.

He interacted with farmers in agriculture and animal husbandry in village Choupal in Paladar. Pandya informed the villagers about this disease. He said that in case of high fever, discharge from the nose, eyes, and mouth, and lumps on the skin, separate these animals from healthy animals and give fodder and water separately.



He said that to save the livestock from this disease, the officials, the local public representatives, social workers, youth, and village intellectuals would have to play an active part.

To control flies, mosquitoes, and mites in the animal enclosures, spray insecticide solution on the veterinarian's advice and bury the dead animals by not putting them in the open, digging a bottomless pit away from the village, and adding slaked lime and salt. To treat sick animals, contact the authorized personnel from the Animal Husbandry Department and provide immediate treatment. On this occasion, former Zilla Parishad members Mohanlal Audichya, Govind Ram Patel, Om Prakash Meena, Naresh Patel, and social worker Dinesh Kumar Audichya were present.
