

Rajasthan tops in Universal Health Coverage – Chief Minister

Bhilwara: On Tuesday, Chief Minister Shri Ashok Gehlot laid the foundation stone of 19 Government Nursing Colleges at the state-level program in Pali. Along with this, the foundation stone of various development works was also inaugurated.

Addressing the function, Mr. Gehlot said that the state government is working with commitment to the overall development of the state. The state government is establishing new dimensions of development in various sectors including road, water, electricity, education, agriculture, medicine, and social security. In this sequence, the foundation stone of 19 Government Nursing Colleges has been laid today. After their construction, the nursing students passing out from the colleges will provide



better services in the state.

During this, Chief Minister Shri Ashok Gehlot visited Bhilwara, Barmer, Banswara, Kumher (Bharatpur), Lalsot (Dausa), Dhaulpur, Dungarpur, Hanumangarh, Jalore, Jhunjhunu, Karauli, Nagaur, Nathdwara (Rajsamand), Pratapgarh, Sikar, Sirohi, and Tonk Nursing. The foundation

stones of 19 nursing colleges were laid by worshipping the ground of virtual colleges in Pali and Chittorgarh.

The foundation stone of Government Nursing College, Bhilwara, was laid in the presence of District In-charge Minister Dr. Mahesh Joshi in a program organized through a virtual medium at Rajmata

Vijayaraje Scindia Medical College.

Addressing the public meeting of the program, in-charge minister Dr. Mahesh Joshi said that under the leadership of Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot, the state government is making continuous efforts to strengthen health services. He said that Chief Minister Mr. Ashok Gehlot announced during the Corona period that "no one should sleep hungry" and no one should remain without treatment.

Through the Chief Minister Chiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme, the state government has provided free treatment and accessible check-up facilities to all. After introducing the Chiranjeevi Yojana, the sex ratio has also improved. He said he is happy that the district in which he is the min-

ister in charge has been considered a health model worldwide regarding health facilities in Corona. Sahada MLA Mrs. Gayatri Devi Trivedi said that Chief Minister Mr. Ashok Gehlot had announced the opening of Government Nursing Colleges in all the districts in the state budget year 2021-22. With the gift of a nursing college, medical facilities will also be expanded in various remote areas. District Collector Mr. Ashish Modi said that even in rural areas, the common people have become aware of the Chiranjeevi scheme. He said that under the Chief Minister Chiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme, the common man is getting free treatment up to 10 lakhs, and accident insurance up to 5 lakhs is also being given by the state government. He said that the medical institu-

tions of the district have also been strengthened through the Chiranjeevi scheme.

District Convener of Gandhi Darshan Samiti Mr. Akshay Tripathi said that as per the budget announcement foundation stone of the Nursing College is being laid in Bhilwara, which is a matter of pride for the district. Former MLA Mr. Vivek Dhakad said that the Chiranjeevi Yojana aims to keep people of all ages healthy.

State Government has allotted 2,0234-hectare land in Village Paldi, Tehsil Mandal, free of cost for the construction of a building and hostel for boys and girls for Government Nursing College, Bhilwara. The Nursing College will be affiliated with the Rajasthan Nursing Council and the Rajasthan University of Health Sciences. The state govern-

ment has created 16 teaching and 28 non-teaching faculty posts to successfully conduct academic activities in the college. During this, former Zila Pramukh, Mrs. Sushila Salvi, former UIT President Mr. Kailash Vyas, Mr. Anil Dangi, and other public representatives also expressed their views. Udaipur: Heart diseases are also related to diabetes. Patients with diabetes are more prone to heart disease, but if sugar is controlled, prevention of heart disease is possible. The two-day National Conference of Cardiologists concluded in Udaipur with an emphasis on adopting new measures to bring awareness to manage diabetes and cholesterol to prevent heart diseases.

In a conference organized on the theme of making innovations in cardiology public for a healthy heart, doctors said that mental health

is also essential along with physical health.

The Heart and Rhythm Society, the fifth Cardiac Summit, was completed under the leadership of Dr. Amit Khandelwal.

Organizing chairman Dr. Amit Khandelwal said that on the second day, experts mainly discussed heart attack and heart failure. In other countries, the chances of a second attack are double after one heart attack. At the same time, in India, it is 3 to 6 times because patients stop taking medicines after angioplasty or other treatments.

In the case of a heart attack, Dr. Sandeep Mishra of AIIMS New Delhi, while emphasizing bringing the patient to the hospital immediately and starting the treatment, said that blood thinner should be given if needed, besides primary angioplasty is the best option.

He said that success can be achieved by adopting new techniques like IVUS and calcium rotablation in angioplasty. Dr. Mohit Gupta of New Delhi, while giving his views on lifestyle changes and mental health, said that one should remain stress-free for a healthy



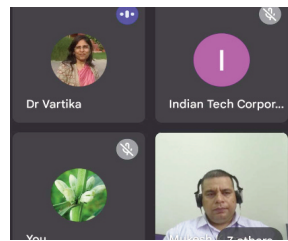
body and mind.

He presented scientific case studies of achieving mental wellness through meditation. To remain physically healthy, it is necessary to control your weight according to B.M.I. Dr. Praveen Kahale of

therapy in the condition of heart failure. Presented views on Dr. Sanjeev Sidana and Deepesh Agarwal of Jaipur said in the conference's conclusion that obesity, diabetes, and heart digit are increasing due to lifestyle. Therefore, the use of new medicines should be increased for their treatment. Experts said that obesity can be prevented through medications. Some of its drugs, along with diabetes, can get rid of heart and brain diseases. Treatment is possible if doctors appropriately counsel patients in the primary stage of heart disease.

Dr. Vartika received Best Paper Presenter Award

Udaipur: Recently, Dr. Vartika Jain who is working as an Assistant Professor, Dept. of Botany, Govt. Meera Girls College, Udaipur received Best Paper Presentation Award in the International Conference on Recent Advances in Research and Innovations in Life Sciences organized by Mata Guji Mahila Mahavidyalaya (Autonomous), Jabalpur in collaboration with Bhopal Chapter, The National Academy of Sciences, India (NASI) & The Society of Life Sciences (SLS) in association with IQAC, Rani Durgavati Vishwavidyalaya, Jabalpur from 17-11-22 to 19-11-22.



Dr. Vartika presented her research paper in the conference through online mode on the In vitro thrombolytic activity of Momordica dioica fruit which is locally known as Kikora. Her research suggested that dietary intake of this fruit could be helpful for natural enhancement of thrombolysis and may help in prevention of athero-thrombotic cardiovascular diseases and recommended that more research is required to isolate the bioactive anti-thrombotic molecule from the plant for establishment of its thrombolytic activity. Dr. Vartika has also received the Young Scientist Award earlier along with many others for her extensive work on Biodiversity conservation. She has published 76 papers in National and International Journals, five books and 20 book chapters. She was the only one from Udaipur who received this award.

MoU signed between Western Sydney University and MPUAT

Udaipur: Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, Rajasthan, and University of Western Sydney, a memorandum of Understanding was signed on Tuesday evening in a workshop organized at the five-star Hotel Sagarika La in New Delhi. On this occasion,

Karnataka, describing this agreement as unprecedented, said that the deserving students of our university could get admission to the best educational institution in Australia. From Prof. Basant Maheshwari and Vice-Chancellor of MPUAT, Dr. Ajit Kumar

said that the duration of this agreement would be five years, which will be further extended, and this agreement will come into force from this academic year itself.

CTAE Dean Dr. P.K. Singh said he told Prof. Basant Maheshwari in constant correspondence and drafted a letter of Understanding. Under this agreement, Western Sydney University (WSU) will provide a scholarship of 30,000 Australian dollars per year during its stay in Australia to MPUAT students pursuing a Ph.D. in engineering. Fees, scholarships, project funding, or travel support will be provided to the student by MPUAT for that period. Project funds will also be provided to the same candidates. A minimum amount of INR 6,000 per year will be provided for high-cost

projects and \$6,000 for low-cost projects for contingencies.

Dr. Singh informed that MPUAT would provide fees, scholarships, project funding, or travel

assistance to the student to study in Australia based on competition for five seats under a dual degree program in Master of Science. Similarly, per the MoU between WSU and MPUAT, no WSU scholarship stipend will be awarded for a thesis year on five seats for a Master of Science degree in various disciplines of science. Tuition fee will be specified before admission with a 25% discount. WSU will provide the candidates with a maximum of \$3000 in project funding. Additionally, a maximum of \$6000 scholarship will also be provided by WSU to such students every year.

Successful surgery of a five-month-old girl in PIMS

Udaipur: Doctors at the Pacific Institute of Medical College and Hospital (PIMS) Umrda have successfully performed a complicated surgery on a five-month-old baby girl.

Pediatric surgeon Dr. Atul Mishra said that the girl, a resident of Kotra, had a big lump near the spine and anus since birth, called Sacrococcygeal teratoma. The disease is a rare lump (tumor) occurring in one in 35,000 babies. If the operation is not done on time, it can become cancer and fatal. Dr. Mishra said that in this operation, which lasted for about three and a half hours, a lump weighing about 450 grams stuck to the lower bone, and the fecal tract was taken out without harming any organ.

The baby girl is completely healthy now. PIMS Chairman Ashish Agarwal said the girl was treated utterly free of cost under the Bhamashah scheme. Dr. Vivek Parashar of the Pediatric Department, Dr. Pinu of the Anesthesia Department, Dr. Amit, Staff Arun, Uday, Kuldeep, Ashok, Dheeraj, etc., played an essential role in the operation. Mr. Agarwal informed that Pacific Hospital, Umrda, is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities, and benefits of all schemes are given.
