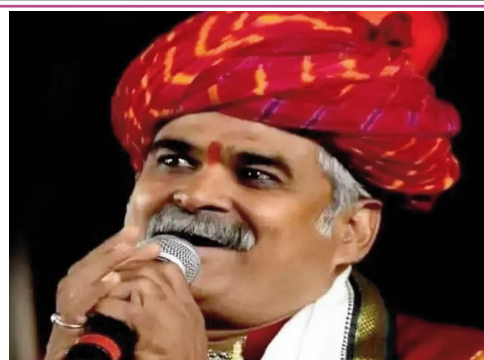

Vilas Janve, 68, has been associated with Pantomime for five decades.

**Achievements of Vilas Janve**

Vilas Janve received Senior Fellowship in the field of Pantomime from the Ministry of Culture in 2001. Janve has participated in National Pantomime Festivals since 1998 (Delhi, Kolkata, Shanti Niketan, Dimapur, Guwahati, Imphal, Jalpaiguri, Prayagraj, Thiruvananthapuram, Mumbai, Jodhpur, Has performed in Jaipur, Udaipur, and Mumbai with wife Kiran Janve. He has directed pantomime workshops for art academies and educational institutions in



Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa, Chandigarh, Delhi, and Rajasthan. Vilas Janve, who assisted Goswami in pantomime workshops, has composed twenty pantomimes on historical and social subjects and has given performances on Doordarshan and many forums in the country.

Vilas Janve has trained hundreds of teachers of the country in Pantomime through the workshops

of CCRT. Janve, a program officer for 28 years at the Western Zone Cultural Center in Udaipur, has trained pantomime artists in Rajasthan besides Divyang (deaf children) and the Central Jail, Udaipur. Janve has innovated by creating pantomimes on the poems of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore's Nobel Prize composition Gitanjali.

## ABP News-CVoter final opinion poll predicts a landslide victory for BJP in Gujarat

**New Delhi,** ABP News-CVoter's (Centre for Voting Opinion & Trends in Election Research) final opinion poll findings predicts a comfortable victory for the incumbent BJP Government with a tally of 134 - 142 seats in the forthcoming Gujarat assembly elections.

ABP News-CVoter final opinion poll findings on Gujarat elections predict a distant second position for Congress (INC) with a tally of 28-36 seats and AAP is likely to secure a tally of only 7-15 seats. According to opinion poll findings BJP is likely to garner 45.9% vote share,

followed by INC with 26.9% and AAP with ABP News-CVoter also conducted a snap poll in Gujarat and one of the questions posed to the voters was who do they think is the most preferred candidate to be next Chief Minister of Gujarat? In response to the question, 52.1% respondents said they were in support of BJP leaders, 23.6% respondents voted in favour of AAP leaders, 19% respondents voted for INC leaders, and 5.3% respondents were in support of other party leaders. Another question posed to the respondents was, what according to them is the most important issue at the moment. Unemployment was identified as the biggest challenge by 37.5% respondents, 18.2% respondents considered Electricity/Water/Roads, 4.2% respondents considered Government's performance

during the pandemic to be the most important issue, 13% respondents considered farmers' issue, 2.6% respondents identified law and order, 4.5% people said corruption in government works was the key issue, 2.3% people considered national issues, 4.3% people considered inflation while 13.4% respondents identified other issues as the biggest challenge.

**Methodology:** This poll is based on surveys conducted between Sept to the fourth week of November 2022 and C Voter has made sure that the analysis is properly represented by statistically balancing the data to make it reflective of the local population according to the most recent census results. This survey is based on CATI interviews with respondents who are adults (18+) and represent all segments.

Institute President Prashant Agarwal said that Haryana vs. Karnataka took place in the first innings at Narayan Divyang Sports Academy. Haryana won the toss and scored 192 runs batting first. In response, the Karnataka team achieved the winning target by losing three wickets in 17.1 overs. Sagar Gowda of Karnataka scored 51 runs in 33 balls with the help of 9 fours, took two crucial wickets in 4 overs, and was the Man of the match. At the same time, the game was played between Gujarat vs. host Rajasthan at Ranapratap Nagar Railway Ground. Gujarat could score only 110 runs in 18 overs while playing first. Chasing the target, the Rajasthan team got all out for 108 runs in 15 overs and was defeated. The Man of the match was Gujarat captain Bhima Kunti. They bowled deadly and took five wickets for 20 runs in 4 overs. In the first innings, the first match at RCA Ground was played between Andhra Pradesh vs. Uttarakhand, in which Uttarakhand won the toss and chose to field first. Playing first, Andhra Pradesh could only manage 105 runs for nine wickets in 20 overs. Coming out with solid intentions, the Uttarakhand team achieved the target in 13.4 overs at the loss of 3 wickets. They took three wickets for 24 runs while throwing four overs. Anuj Kumar of Uttarakhand, who performed tremendously in this match, was adjudged Man of the Match.

While presenting the Man of the Match trophy, Dr. Kamlesh Sharma, Joint Director of the Information and Public Relations Department, praised the players' spirits.

The match was played between Madhya Pradesh vs. Baroda. Madhya Pradesh batting first gave a record target of 274 runs for four

125 runs in 53 balls with the help of 23 fours and four sixes.

Madhya Pradesh broke Mumbai's record of 266 by scoring 274 runs.

In the second innings match between Himachal Pradesh and Orissa at the railway ground, Odisha won and chose to field. The Himachal team scored 196 runs for four wickets in the first over. Chasing the target, Orissa was bundled out for 63 runs in 13.3. The Himachal team won the match by 133 runs. Man of the match, Ravi sent seven batsmen to the pavilion giving three runs in 2.3 overs.

And the match was held between UP and Tamil Nadu at Narayan Divyang Sports Academy. UP, batting first, scored a massive 237 runs without losing a wicket. Chasing Tamil Nadu collapsed for 40 runs in 13.1 overs. UP won this match by an enormous margin of 197 runs, and Shailesh Yadav and Anmol scored brilliant centuries. The Man of the match was priceless.
