Seminar on the challenges of parliamentary democracy

Lack of political education is the biggest shortcoming of democracy - Dr. Joshi Compulsory voting will strengthen parliamentary democracy - Kataria

Udaipur (Dr. Munesh Arora): Rajasthan Assembly Speaker Dr. CP Joshi and Leader of Opposition Gulab Chand Kataria inaugurated two newly constructed buildings. On Saturday, they laid the foundation stone of two buildings on the Mohanlal Sukhadia University campus. On this occasion, a seminar on 'Challenges of Parliamentary Democracy' was also organized in the newly constructed auditorium of the Faculty of Management Studies,

Assembly Speaker Dr. CP Joshi said that the biggest challenge of parliamentary democracy is that we have not worked on political education. Without this, the strength that should have come from democracy could not have come.

He said that no party has worked in this direction. Hence solid public representatives are absent. He noted that political education makes democracy strong. If the elected governments do this work correctly, there will never be any movement. Movements happen every day, which means that we are far away from political empowerment. Making voters aware and educating people is the first need of the day. He said that not only did we make the legislature accountable, nor did the governments work in this direction. Expressing concern, he said that in today's era, governance is being run through executive dictatorship, a matter of great concern.

He said that if there are strong and cultured people representatives, the governments will also work properly. He said that Ward Panch is the smallest unit of democracy and also the strongest, but they do not know their rights. Gram sabhas are not made aware, nor do they know about their rights. There is a lot of lack of watchdogs in democratic systems because, due to a lack of political education, we cannot understand democracy properly or work with it.

He said that artificial intelligence would decide the future, but we are not even discussing it. Underlining water scarcity, he said that the traditional storage-saving water method was not appropriately used, but we have moved towards urbanization, and today we are facing water scarcity. Gulab Chand Kataria, Leader of the Opposition in the Legislative Assembly, said that the Constitution of India is binding. Still, the lack of awareness among the people is visible even today. Kataria said that the bitterness of life is that we worry about our children, family, and neighbors. The day democracy will improve when we start worrying about the country. The day people will come to know the value of their vote and its measurement, that day the shops of political parties will be closed.

Advocating for compulsory voting, he said that even after so many years of independence, we could not explain the importance of voting to the people. Compulsory voting should be implemented, and those who do not vote should be denied government facilities. Expressing concern over the election method, he said that today MLAs who understand the intricacies and practices of law are not found by searching because political parties need winning candidates.

No one needs an intelligent candidate. The bitter truth is that if there is a candidate with less intelligence, there will be convenience in running the government. Kataria said that all political parties must get democracy out of the poison of casteism. Even if we appoint a sarpanch, we do so based on caste and money, and this caste-based politics is destroying democracy. Kataria said cash is respected in democracy, but qualities are not appreciated. This is also the culmination of decline. Expressing concern, Kataria said that bureaucracy dominates everywhere. The public chooses us, but someone else rules. Kataria said that the voter has to recognize the power of his vote because the energy of the voter is not with any party or leader.

On this occasion, Congress CWC member Raghuveer Meena said that the foundation of democracy should not be tampered with; otherwise, the democratic system may be harmed. We can save democratic traditions only by giving the right and proper guidance to the coming generation. Greeting, everyone, Director of the Faculty of Management Studies, Prof. Hanuman Prasad, gave information about the newly constructed auditorium. Welcoming all the guests, Vice Chancellor Professor IV Trivedi highlighted the importance of the subject. Prof. Neeraj Sharma conducted the program. Registrar Chhogaram Devasi gave thanks.
