Bhilwara: The Agricultural Technology Management Agency (ATMA) organized a two-day farmer training on the Integrated Farming System at Krishi Vigyan Kendra.

Dr. C. M. Yadav, Senior Scientist and President of the Centre, said that Integrated Farming System is a modern farming technique in which agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, poultry farming, fish farming, goat farming, etc. are included. An integrated farming system is a better option to get more income.

Dr. Suchitra Dadhich, a horticulturist at Agriculture College, discussed the importance of an integrated farming system and gave technical information about off-season vegetable production, fruit production, storage, and marketing. Horticulture scientist Dr. Rajesh gave technical information about the drawing of the garden, soil, fertility, budding and grafting, planting time, harvesting and maintenance of fruits, grading and packing, poly house, low tunnel greenhouse, and shed. Explained the utility of net house and plastic mulching.

Dr. O. P. Pareek, Professor of Agricultural Engineering, gave information about the availability of the latest agricultural machines and their use to save time and labor in agriculture.
