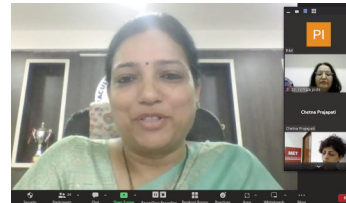
Employees of Rajasthan Sahitya Akademi pleaded for a pension
