Rare Sita Ashoka bloomed in Udaipur

Udaipur: The tree of Ashok Vatika, located in Ravana's Lanka, sitting under its shade, and the smell of its flowers had taken away the sorrow of Goddess Sita. With rare and medicinal properties, this tree has blossomed in some places in Udaipur city with its full beauty and is attracting people. These days have also started spreading its attractive aura in the Udaipur district. This rare Sita Ashoka tree and flowers have been clicked by Dr. Kamlesh Sharma, Joint Director of the Public Relations Department.

Retired Deputy Conservator of Forests VS Rana is engaged in the work of breeding this rare tree by planting saplings from the seeds of this rare tree.

This rare tree named Sita-Ashoka (Saraca indica) has flowered at Rana's Hiran Magri Sector 6 residence and at some other places. The aura of orange-red colored flowers blooming on this tree, planted about 12 years ago, is being made on sight. Apart from this, two trees in RCA and one in Swaroopsagar are blossoming these days and spreading their charming aura. In the past years, Rana collected seeds from the tree at his residence, prepared more than a dozen plants, and distributed them to different people in the city.

According to experts on environmental subjects, this is the real Ashoka tree. There are only a few such trees in the district. Many medicines use flowers, leaves, bark, and fruits. Ashoka's flower, bark, and root are useful in making different types of medicines. The medicinal properties of Ashoka are universally accepted, especially for various diseases related to women. Ashokasava and Ashokarishta medicines are made from Ashoka only.

Sita Ashoka is different from the tall Ashoka used as a show plant. It is a shady tree-like mango tree. Its leaves are 8-9 inches long and two-and-a-half inches wide. Its leaves are initially of copper color, which is why it is also called 'Tamparpallav'. Its orange-colored flowers appear in spring and later turn red. It is also called 'Hempushpa' due to having golden-red colored flowers.
