## IIM Udaipur Awards MBA Degrees to 398 students At Its 11th Annual Convocation

**Mr. Chandra Shekhar Ghosh, MD & CEO of Bandhan Bank, graced the ceremony as the Chief Guest Udaipur:** The Indian Institute of Management Udaipur hosted its 11th Annual Convocation for its flagship Two-Year MBA (Batch of 2021-23), One-Year full-time MBAs in Global Supply Chain Management and Digital Enterprise Management (Batches of 2022-23) and PhD, on Sunday, March 26, 2023, at its pristine 300-acre campus at Balicha, Udaipur. ## Will Rahul Gandhi not be able to contest the 2024 and 2029 Lok Sabha elections?

**New Delhi.** Congress leader Rahul Gandhi is no longer a Member of Parliament. According to the notification of the Lok Sabha Secretariat issued on Friday, Rahul has been disqualified from the House. This action was taken after a Gujarat court sentenced him to two years in a 2019 defamation case. In such a situation, whether Rahul cannot contest the 2024 Lok Sabha elections arises. Rahul Gandhi's Parliament membership has been canceled under Article 102 (1) (e) of the Constitution and the Representation of the People Act. He was a Member of Parliament from the Wayanad Lok Sabha seat in Kerala. From here, he won a significant victory in 2019 by securing 65 percent votes.

According to Section 8 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, if the MP or MLAs are punished for two years or more in any case, then their membership in Parliament will be canceled. Not only this, they will not be able to contest elections for six years after the completion of the sentence. In such a situation, if Rahul Gandhi is punished, he will not

be able to contest the 2024 and 2029 Lok Sabha elections.

Rahul Gandhi was sentenced to two years imprisonment by a Gujarat court in a criminal defamation case, after which his Lok Sabha membership was threatened. Although the court suspended his sentence only after sentencing and granting him bail, it has also given him 30 days

All the ways to save Rahul Gandhi's parliament membership are not closed yet. They have the option of going to the



for appeal, which does not seem to provide him with much relief. Rahul has to prove himself innocent by proving the whole case wrong in his request to save his parliament membership or compromise with the complainant.

Rahul Gandhi addressed an election rally in Kolar, Karnataka, on 13 April during the 2019 Lok Sabha elections. During this, he said, "Why is

High Court. If the High Court stays the decision of the Surat Sessions Court, then their membership can be saved. On the other hand, if there is no relief from the High Court, then Rahul can go to the Supreme Court. If the apex court stays the decision, then his membership will be saved. If he does not get relief, he will not be able to contest elections for eight years.
