PM dedicates New Parliament House to the nation

Releases Commemorative Coin & Stamp

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi dedicated the new Parliament House to the nation on 28th. Earlier in the day, the Prime Minister installed the Sengol with Nandi at the top facing East-West direction in the new Parliament House. He also lit up the Diya and offered flowers to the Sengol.

Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister remarked that there are few moments in every nation's history that are immortalized. Some dates become the immortal signature on the face of time, the Prime Minister said. The 28th of May, 2023 is one such day. "People of India have given themselves a gift for the Amrit Mahotsav", he said. The Prime Minister congratulated everyone on this glorious occasion.

The Prime Minister said that this is not merely a build-

ing but is a reflection of the aspirations and dreams of 140 crore Indians. "This is a temple of our democracy that gives a message of India's resolution to the world", he said. He continued, "This new Parliament building connects planning to reality, policy to realization, willpower to execution, and sankalp to siddhi". This will be a medium for realizing the dreams of the freedom fighters. It will witness the sunrise of Aatmnirbhar Bharat and will see the realization of a Viksit Bharat. The Prime Minister said that this new building is an example of the coexistence of ancient and modern.

"New models can be established only by treading new paths", the Prime Minister remarked as he highlighted that the new India is realizing new goals and paving new ways. "There is a new energy, new zeal, new enthusiasm, new thinking and a new journey. There are new visions, new

directions, new resolutions and a new trust", Shri Modi exclaimed. The Prime Minister said that the world is looking towards India's determination, its citizens' vigour and the life of human power in India with respect and hope. "When India moves forward, the world moves forward", he remarked. The Prime Minister underlined that the new Parliament House will invoke the development of the world from the development of India.

Referring to the establishment of sacred Sengol, the Prime Minister said that in the great Chola empire, Sengol was seen as a symbol of the path of service duty and nation. He said under the guidance of Rajaji and Adheenam, this Sengol became the sacred symbol of the transfer of power. The Prime Minister once again bowed to the Adheenam saints who came to bless the occasion this morning. "It is our good fortune that we could restore



the dignity of this sacred Sengol. This Sengol will keep on inspiring us during the proceedings of the House", he said.

"India is not only a democratic nation but also the mother of democracy", the Prime

Minister said as he noted that the nation is the principal foundation for global democracy. The Prime Minister said that after years of slavery, after losing so much, India resumed its journey and reached the Amrit Kaal. "Amrit Kaal is a peri-

od of forging new dimensions of development while preserving our heritage. This is Amrit Kaal of giving a new direction to the nation. This is Amrit Kaal of fulfilling innumerable aspirations", he said. Underscoring the need for new

lifeblood for democracy through a verse, the Prime Minister emphasized that the workplace of the democracy, i.e. Parliament should also be new and modern.

The Prime Minister recalled the golden period of India's prosperity and architecture. He said that centuries of slavery robbed us of this glory.

The Prime Minister said that India of the 21st century is filled with confidence. "Today's India is leaving behind the mentality of slavery and embracing that ancient glory of art. This new Parliament Building is a living example of this endeavour", the Prime Minister said. "This building has Virasat (heritage) as well as Vastu (Architecture), Kala (art) as well as kaushal (skill), sanskriti (culture) as well as notes of Samvidhan (Constitution). He pointed out that the interiors of Lok Sabha are themed on the national bird peacock and Rajya Sabha on the nation-

al flower lotus. The Parliament premises have the national tree Banyan. The new building incorporates the specialities of different parts of the country. He mentioned granite from Rajasthan, timber from Maharashtra and carpet by Bhadohi artisans. "We witness the spirit of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat in every particle of this building", he said.

Concluding the address, the Prime Minister expressed confidence that the new building of the Parliament will become the basis for the creation of a new, prosperous, strong and developed India. "This is an India that walks the path of policy, justice, truth, dignity and duty and becomes stronger", the Prime Minister concluded.

Speaker of Lok Sabha, Shri Om Birla, and Deputy Speaker of Rajya Sabha, Shri Harivansh Narayan Singh were present on the occasion among others.

Rajasthan should get the status of special heritage state

Swachh Bharat Mission NSSC member KK Gupta demands from Prime Minister and Home Minister

Former Swachhata Brand Ambassador of Rajasthan and former chairman of Dungarpur Municipal Council, KK Gupta, member of the National Scheme Sanctioning Committee (NSSC) of Swachh Bharat Mission Rural, Government of India, demanded that Rajasthan should be given the status of Special Heritage State in the nectar of independence. In an exclusive interview with a reputed TV channel in New Delhi, he demanded this to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah. Along with this, he said that a strict law should also be made to punish the civic officials responsible for cleanliness if they fail to discharge their responsibilities. Gupta said there should also be a strict punishment provision for the people who spread dirt and garbage.

KK Gupta said that he had been appointed as judicial amicus curiae for Municipal Council Jhunjhunu and Municipality Mandawa and Nawalgarh by the Honorable Permanent and Perpetual Lok Adalat District and Sessions Court Jhunjhunu. He is now handling cleanliness, environmental protection, water conservation, traffic relief, and stray animal prevention in these bodies of Shekhawati zone, including the responsibility of beautification and restoration of the world-famous old Havelis, which have an important place in this area from the point of view of tourism.

KK Gupta explains that these old havelis of the Shekhawati region have historical and cultural significance. These Havelis also introduce us to our ancient culture and connect us to our glorious civ-



ilization. Still, it is being seen that under a conspiracy to remove the tourists from here in a planned manner, these havelis are being demolished, and the so-called land is being built. The mafias are hatching a conspiracy to destroy these Havelis.

Gupta said that Rajasthan is known as an Open Art Gallery, and many places of heritage importance present in Rajasthan are famous in the country and the world. At present, Rajasthan is the largest state in the country in terms of area. Along with attracting domestic and foreign tourists, it also holds the top position in terms of tourism. More than half of the tourists who come to Rajasthan come to see the ancient havelis of the Shekhawati region. The tourism business plays an important role in the overall development of any region. Tourism is a big indus-

try in itself. Due to the arrival of domestic and foreign tourists, along with the increase in the country's and the state's revenue, thousands of people also get employment.

For the protection of huge heritage assets scattered all around Rajasthan, amicus curiae KK Gupta suggested that the Central Government should immediately give a special heritage state to Rajasthan. At present, we are celebrating 75 years of independence and this golden period is going on in the country, and in such a good period, if Rajasthan, the country's largest state, gets a special status and tourists will be attracted in more numbers due to more and more facilities. The state government should also set up a special fund for this and use this amount for tourism development.

KK Gupta says that the Shekhawati region of Rajasthan is where such talents have been born, who have later won their laurels in the industry and brought laurels to their motherland in the country and the world. Prominent industrialists from here include Lakshmi Niwas Mittal, known worldwide as Steel King, Aggarwal of Vedanta Group, Rahul Bajaj, Aditya Birla, Goenka, Piramal, Dalmia, Khaitan, Poddar, Morarka, Rungta, Singhanian, Bangar, Mittal, Bhartia etc. are the main names. Apart from these, many industrialists from Shekhawati are doing business in many cities of the country and abroad. They have a big contribution to the GDP growth of the country. Along with saving the cultural, historical and ancient identity of such prosperous areas, especially Jhunjhunu, Nawalgarh and Mandawa, from extinction, new dimensions of development should be established along with innovations in terms of cleanliness and tourism.

Women aged 12 to 65 enthusiastically learned this art under the guidance of renowned artist, lace-making, and cutwork expert Mrs Sophia Jaipuri. In this five-day workshop, each enthusiastic woman made two table mats in cut work by learning new techniques of lace making and cut work. I also made a cushion cover using new techniques in lace making. After tracing the design on a plain cloth, a lacework cushion cover was made on it through a 3D outliner. This innovation of lace work takes very little time to produce creations that have the feel of lace, even without thread. An exhibition of artefacts made by the participating women was also organized. Also, the participants shared their views about this workshop. Center's program officer Vilas Janve distributed certificates to the participating women on behalf of the cultural centre. Workshop in-charge Hemant Mehta proposed a vote of thanks. Add deprived families to Chiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme

Udaipur: (Dr. Munesh Arora) The monthly meeting of the District Health Committee was held on Thursday under the chairmanship of District Collector Tarachand Meena. The Collector gave instructions for speeding up the state government's flagship schemes and their practical implementation in rural areas.

He mainly directed to connect the deprived families with the Chiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme soon. He said that by conducting door-to-door surveys, it should be ensured that the scheme's benefit is given to the deprived families.

Expressing dissatisfaction over the district's ranking far behind in the free medicine scheme and free investigation scheme in departmental activities, the Collector gave instructions for immediate improvement. District Reproductive and Child Health Officer Dr Ashok Aditya said that children deprived of vaccination would be detected and vaccinated. On the other hand, instructions were given to issue notices to the institutions on which work was not being done.

Chief Medical and Health Officer Dr Bamnia. While giving information about various schemes and programs related to health, Bamnia instructed everyone to fulfil the set target. Dr Bamnia urged immediate action against quacks if they work elsewhere. Additional Chief Medical and Health Officer Dr Ragini Agarwal said that good works are being done in the Udaipur district in family welfare service. The targets fixed for sterilization will be achieved on time. Deputy Chief Medical Officer Dr Gajanan Gupta said that to prevent seasonal diseases, necessary activities will be done by conducting house-to-house surveys. Nodal Officer for Non-Communicable Diseases Dr Pranav Bhavsar said a 100-day fit health campaign would be run in the district, where the BP of all patients above 30 years will be taken. And NCD by getting a sugar-related investigation done. Uploading of data has been made mandatory, which is being implemented by all institutions.

Discussion on control and prevention of seasonal diseases - Here, for the control and prevention of seasonal diseases, the inter-departmental coordinator meeting was held under the chairmanship of Additional District Collector O.P. Bunkar. The ADM instructed that in the coming 3 months, according to the weather, work will be done to prevent diseases and instructed all departments to carry out anti-larval and adult activities to prevent mosquitoes from breeding for the prevention of diseases like dengue, malaria, chikungunya etc. For this, instructions were given to observe dry days every Sunday.
