Swift Resolution of Power Load-Shedding Issue in Kotda - Lakshmi Narayan Pandya

Jaipur: Lakshminarayan Pandya, a member of the Rajasthan Scheduled Tribes Advisory Council (TSC), representing the Rajasthan government, conducted a comprehensive tour of various villages in the Kotda region. During his visit, he assessed various schemes and promptly addressed concerns raised by the local community

Pandya was apprised of significant issues related to electricity and drinking water by the Block Congress Committee officials and local representatives. Promptly taking action, Pandya initiated discussions with senior officials of the Electricity Department.

Currently, Kotda receives its power supply from the 132 KV Swaroopganj Grid Substation. Due to an overloaded power transformer, Kotda has been facing recurrent power load-shedding issues. To alleviate this problem, an additional power transformer with an estimated cost of approximately 3 crore INR has been sanctioned and will be transported from of the contracted firm to complete the work on time,

Jodhpur to Kotda. Installation is expected to be completed within 20 days, effectively doubling the capac-



ity of the Swaroopganj Grid Substation and resolv-

ing the issue of frequent power tripping in Kotda. Pandya also highlighted that due to the failure the contract for the 132 KV work in Kotda was terminated, and new tenders have been issued. As soon as the tender process is completed, the pro-

In addition to addressing power-related issues, Pandya also instructed officials from the Public Health Engineering Department to rectify damaged pipeline networks within ten days to ensure regular water supply to the residents of Kotda.
