A patient suffering from hydatid disease, a severe condition caused by parasitic cvsts. found a new lease on life at Paras Health, Udaipur. ly remove all traces of the parasitic infection. Post-operation, Dr. Abhishek Vyas conducted thorough investigations, identifying the culprit as Echinococcus granulosus, commonly known as a tapeworm. This parasite, transmitted through the feces of infected animals like sheep and dogs, poses a significant risk to individuals, especially those in agricultural settings. Expressing profound gratitude, the patient credited Paras Health, Udaipur, along with Dr. Abhishek Vyas and Dr. Abhay Jain, for their timely intervention and expertise. The successful treatment not only saved a life but also shed light on the dangers of hydatid disease and the importance of prompt medical attention.

## Workshop on 'Bioseramic and

A One-Day Workshop on Colposcopy Organized Udaipur: A one-day workshop on colposcopy, which is instrumental in the treatment of

cervical cancer, was organized by the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Pacific Medical College and Hospital.

The inauguration of the workshop was done by PMC's Chairman, Rahul Agrawal, CEO Sharad Kothari, Vice-Chancellor of PMU Dr. M.M. Mangal, Advisor to Chairman Dr. A.P. Gupta, PMC's Medical Superintendent Brigadier Dr. R.K. Singh, Ahmedabad-based gynecologist and cancer surgeon Dr. Anjana Chauhan, gynecological oncologist Dr. Ronak Bhansali, and Head of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Senior Gynecologist Dr. Rajrani Sharma, who lit the ceremonial lamp.

Secretary of the workshop, Dr. Rajrani Sharma, explained that cervical cancer is the fourth most common cancer related to women in the world and the second in India. She emphasized the significant role of colposcopy in the early detection and diagnosis of cervical cancer due to its capability to detect abnormalities in the cervical epithelium.

During the workshop, gynecologist and cancer surgeon Dr. Aniana Chauhan from Ahmedabad discussed new dimensions of colposcopy and HPV testing, while gynecological oncologist Dr. Ronak Bhansali elaborated extensively on colposcopy, describing it as a type of cervical cancer screening used to identify abnormal cells

in the cervix.
